## REPORT FROM THE PRESIDENT

I'm very pleased to report that our new Office Secretary, Jaime Walden, joined us in June. The position of Office Secretary was approved by the Board about three years ago as a part of RIJHA's plan to professionalize the operation of our office, a plan that continues to be extraordinarily successful. Jaime, who holds a B.S. from East Carolina University in North Carolina, has over 20 years' experience in office operations, including at South County Baptist Church in North Kingstown and West Bay Christian Academy, also in North Kingstown. Jaime's experience in the use of many software applications such as Excel, QuickBooks and Microsoft Office will contribute greatly to the ongoing process of keeping the RIJHA efficient and up to date.

Among the RIJHA's major projects is the digitizing of our collection of Rhode Island Jewish newspapers, of which we have by far the most complete collection. That project is nearing completion under the excellent oversight of Director Kate-Lynne Laroche. We'll be moving forward to digitize other collections, including obituaries. We're also in the process of updating our website, which will allow easier access, worldwide, to our digitized collections.

Our major projects are being financed in part through grants, with many thanks to past President Ruth Breindel for taking initiative in applying for grants. As RIJHA expands its programming, we expect grants to become a significant way of supporting them. Hence the Board last November approved the creation of a permanent Grants Committee. I'm happy to note that three dedicated Board members agreed to serve on the committee—Ruth Breindel, George Goodwin, and Linda Levin. My thanks to all RIJHA members for your membership and support. It's what keeps us going! Enjoy the rest of the summer.

### REPORT FROM THE DIRECTOR

I hope you are enjoying this beautiful summer, and are ready to begin the "busy season" as we call it here in the Regensteiner Offices of the RIJHA.

In June we hired our new secretary, Jaime Walden, and she is wonderful! Jaime is enjoying learning about the RI Jewish community, and is certainly making my job as director easier. Please read her "about me" in this newsletter!

We are continuing to move along in our project with the Rhode Island Council for the Humanities. This is the "walking tour" app that allows you, the user, to view historical landmarks, and places of interested related to Jewish history in Rhode Island from your phone, tablet, or computer at home! We currently have two "write-ups" that are ready, with four more to complete this fall. Since there is no set deadline for finishing this project, we are not necessarily in a rush to complete it, but hope to launch our portion of Rhode Tours in Spring 2020.

In September of this year, G. Wayne Miller's sequel (and prequel) to *Toy Wars* titled *Kid Number One: A story of heart, soul and business, featuring Alan Hassenfeld and Hasbro* is being released. The RIJHA assisted Wayne in some of his research for the book, and as thanks, he and Alan will be attending an event (date TBA) later in the fall at the JCC. More information on this exciting event will follow later this summer!

As always, we have been busy with continuing to digitize portions of our impressive archive. Most recently, we digitized our obituary collection - over 12,000 obituaries! These obituaries will be added to the Digital Archive portion of the site and will be available to you, the public. This is a major resource for researchers using our materials, and having this source online makes it so much easier to use!

Our past president Ruth Breindel and longtime office manager Anne Sherman have been working tirelessly to reorganize the recently named *Anne Sherman Photography Collection* here in the Segal Family Archives. The goal of this project is to identify as much information about the photo as possible, record it in an online database, and file it accordingly so it is easily retrievable. Once the collection is completely reorganized, we plan to digitize it and make the images available on our website for all to see.

As always, research requests are coming in regularly. It seems the more resources we have available, the more researchers we have contacting us with requests. If you would like to have us conduct research on your family, a long lost relative, someone your family lore says you are related to but have never been able to prove, or just have unanswered questions about where your family came from, please don't hesitate to contact us; that's why we are here! As we have mentioned many times, we no longer have a standard charge for research, but simply ask that you consider making a donation to the Association in appreciation for the research done for you.
