## Agency Adopts Compromise Resolution

### League Recommends Palestine Division

#### Suggests Supervision of Arab and Jewish States

Geneva (WNS) — Approval in principle of the proposed partition of Palestine as a solution of the Arab-Jewish problem but opposition to the establishment of independent Arab and Jewish states at this time are voiced in the report of the League of Nations Mandates Commission to the Council of the League according to the official summary of its report.

The Mandates Commission objects to independent states because it holds neither Jews nor Arabs are ready for self-government and advocates a period of apprenticeship under a system of autonomy for each race with complete power to regulate immigration while Britain retains control of defense, foreign affairs and customs.

As an alternative the Commission suggests a separate British mandate for Arabs and Jews.

It approves of a separate British mandate for the holy places in Palestine and criticises the Palestine's administration's vacillating policy which it holds responsible for some of the trouble. On the other hand it agrees that the present mandate is unworkable.

#### Plan Patriotic Hall Of Fame at Fair

##### Survivors of Wars to Name Patriots

New York (WNS)—A photographic hall of fame of 150 of the greatest Jewish patriots of American history from 1789 to 1939 is being planned by the Jewish War Veterans of the United States as the highlight of its proposed exhibit at the 1939 New York World's Fair.

All Jewish survivors of the wars of the United States will be asked to serve as members of a jury to select the 150 patriots from a panel of several hundred names, according to an announcement by Martin Horowitz, Michael Weinstein and Louis Freeman, national co-chairman of the committee arranging for the organization's 41st annual convention to be held in Asbury Park, N. J., from September 23 to 26.

Resolutions will be adopted advocating an inquiry into the many Nazi camps that have mushroomed over the country.

#### Authorize Parley With Arab Leaders

##### Approve Demand For Negotiations

Zurich (WNS)—With the adoption of a compromise resolution designed to placate Zionists and non-Zionists by approving the Zionist demand for negotiations with Great Britain on the creation of a Jewish state in Palestine and also the non-Zionist demand for a round-table conference with the Arabs looking to a peaceful Arab-Jewish understanding in an undivided Palestine, the Council of the Jewish Agency for Palestine concluded its stormiest meeting since its creation in 1929.

Aimed at placating the American non-Zionists, who had vigorously opposed a Jewish state, and at satisfying the Zionists who had insisted on carrying out the Zionist Congress' mandate for entering negotiations for a Jewish state, the resolution in effect authorized negotiations for both ends.

With this difficulty eliminated, the Council also reached agreement on the other thorny issue dividing Zionists and non-Zionists—parity for the Non-Zionists in the Agency Executive.

### Jewish Education Month Enrollment Begins Sept. 16

New York (WNS)—The four weeks beginning September 16 and ending October 15, have been designated as national Jewish education enrollment month throughout the country as part of the annual program to further interest in Jewish education.

The national committee directing the program is headed by Dr. Mordecai M. Soltes, director of Jewish extension education of the Jewish Welfare Board, and includes Israel Chipkin of New York,

Dr. Jacob S. Golub of New York, Dr. Leo L. Honor of Chicago, Louis Hurwich of Boston, Ben Rosen of Philadelphia and Paul Verot of Buffalo.

National Jewish education enrollment month will be climaxed by Jewish education week, covering the period from October 8 to 15. During that week local and national agencies will sponsor an intensive program designed to focus attention on Jewish education.

#### Untermeyer Hints at Boycott of Poland

Antwerp (WNS)—A hint that the economic boycott may be invoked against Poland if the government of that country continued to tolerate pogroms was conveyed by Samuel Untermeyer, president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League.

Mr. Untermeyer warned that Americans would refuse to aid Poland economically "so long as pogroms are tolerated by the Polish government" and added that should the Polish government decide to guarantee protection and the rights of Polish Jews, Americans will help Poland become once more an economically independent state.

#### Gypsies Claim Descent From Lost Tribes

Warsaw (WNS)—Claiming that the Polish gypsies are descendants of the Ten Lost Tribes of Israel, King Witles of the Polish gypsies has called on the Polish government and the Jewish community here to provide him with funds to transport his tribe to Palestine.

The gypsies are said to be anxious to emigrate to Palestine now that there is talk of a Jewish state there.

The Polish government is reported to have advised the gypsy chieftain to obtain the consent of the Palestine government first and then discuss the matter with officials here.

#### Reforms Reform Temple

Chicago (WNS) — Continuing the trend back toward Orthodox in Reform Judaism, Temple Isaiah Israel, one of Chicago's largest Reform temples, will return to the Friday evening services which will start after the High Holidays.

#### Nazis Allow 24 P. C. Jews to Change Name

BERLIN — The Ministry of Interior announced today that it would entertain requests to change names of Aryan persons with Jewish names even though they had a slight percentage of Jewish blood.

### Commission Warns Against Undue Haste In Partition

Geneva (WNS-Palcor Agency)—A warning that it is dangerous to hurry with the partition of Palestine is sounded in the report which the Mandates Commission completed for the forthcoming session of the League of Nations Council. The final session of the Commission was marked by the adoption of its report which is secret and cannot be published until the League Council registers its decision. It is emphasized, therefore, that any information as to its contents is hypothetical.

It is learned, however, by the Palcor News Agency, that the report of the Commission will advise

the Council to give the British Government the necessary authority to explore, by negotiations, the partition solution which the British Government considers the most hopeful for Palestine.

But the recommendations of the Mandates Commission are couched in such terms that, in the event of failure, the continuance of the existing Palestine Mandate and all other negotiations remain fully guaranteed.

#### Goebbel's Paper Says German Jews Well Off

Berlin (WNS) — Bitterly attacking the officials of the Paris International Exposition for allowing the sponsors of the Palestine Pavilion to illustrate Jewish suffering in Germany, Der Angriff, mouthpiece of Propaganda Minister Goebbels, complains that the pavilion is merely anti-German propaganda.

#### FARMERS YIELD

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—A lengthy struggle over the inclusion of Labor schools in the school system of the Vaad Leumi ended with the withdrawal by the Farmers Federation of its opposition to the scheme of consolidating the country's Hebrew school network.

### Nazis Establish Berlin Ghetto Parks

Berlin (WNS) — Ghettolization, Nazism's solution for the Jewish problem in Germany, was introduced to Berlin for the first time when officials of the Prenzlauerberg district installed 100 new benches in a public park and inscribed 92 of them with the words "Jews prohibited" and the remaining eight with the inscription "reserved for Jews."

Der Angriff, mouthpiece of Propaganda Minister Goebbels, indicated that similar steps will be taken elsewhere.

## Jewish Agency Names New Executive Members

Zurich (WNS)—Placated by the compromise resolution which authorized conferences with the Arabs and negotiations on partition with Great Britain, the Jewish Agency Council found little difficulty in naming the new executive.

The new Jewish Agency Executive consists of the following: ZIONISTS—Prof. Selig Brodesky, El-eazar Kaplan, Fishel Rotenstreich, Isaac Gruenbaum, Rabbi J. L. Fishman, Moshe Shertok and David Ben Gurion; NON-ZIONISTS—Dr. Maurice J. Karpf, Dr. Werner Senator, Dr. Maurice Hexter, Dr. Arthur Rupp and Mrs. Edward Jacobs, the latter being the new members, although they are members of the Zionist Organization. Menahem Ussishkin, president of the Jewish National Fund, and Dr. Nathan Goldman, Agency representative at Geneva, were made ex-officio members of the Executive.

In accordance with the usual custom of electing the president of the World Zionist Organization to head the Jewish Agency, Dr. Chaim Weizmann was reelected president. Louis Lipsky and Dr. Karpf were selected as the Agency's representatives in the United States, with Lipsky being accorded membership in the Executive. Lord Melchett and Morris Rothen-

berg were reelected chairman and co-chairman, respectively, of the Agency Council.

To the political commission which will negotiate with Great Britain the Agency named as non-Zionist members Felix M. Warburg, Lord Reading, Lionel Cohen of London, Sir Osmond d'Avigdor Goldsmid of London, Prof. Herbert Spyer of Belgium and Neville Las-ki of London.

The Zionist members, elected by the Zionist congress, are Dr. Stephen S. Wise, Prof. Lewis Namier of Manchester, Harry Sachor of London, Rabbi Meier Berlin, Mizrahi leader, Prof. Felix Frankfurter and Leonard Stein, ex-officio member.

## Conference Avoids Attacks on Poland

### Belgium Requests Modified Policy

Antwerp (WNS)—Attacks on Poland and the Polish government for their treatment of the Jews are being carefully eschewed by all speakers of the second world conference of the Federation of Polish Jews abroad which is meeting at Harmonie Hall here.

This policy has been adopted because the Belgian authorities exacted a guarantee from the sponsors of the conference that no attacks on Poland would be permitted.

It is understood that the Belgian government took this attitude to mollify the Polish ambassador who had insisted that the whole conference be prohibited.

The opening session was addressed by Benjamin Winter, president of the Federation of Polish Jews in America and also of the World Federation; Jacob Fishman, editor of the Jewish Morning Journal; S. Liber, leader of the Polish Jews in Belgium, and Rabbis Bradt and Shapiro of Antwerp.

## Ku Klux Klan is on The March Again

Atlanta, Ga. (WNS) — After long years of political inactivity and organizational desuetude, the Ku Klux Klan donned its white robes and announced that it was on the march again, this time against "alien labor agitation." The one-time terror of Jews, Negroes and Catholics plans a series of meetings throughout the country as part of a "national Klan mobilization to crusade against un-Americanism," it was declared by J. A. Colescott, KKK chief of staff, at the first of the planned demonstrations held in the birthplace of the hooded order.

## Magnes Denies Dealing With Arab Delegation

Paris (WNS)—The report in the Palestine Hebrew daily, Davar, that he had dealt with an Arab delegation in Geneva for an Arab-Jewish round table parley was denied unequivocally here by Dr. Judah L. Magnes, president of the Hebrew University. Pointing out that he has not been in Geneva since last April, Dr. Magnes declared point blank he had had no negotiations with Arab spokesmen there or anywhere else.

## Needy Polish Jews To Get More Loans

New York—Plans to establish 100 additional free loan societies for needy Jews in Poland were announced today at the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee's headquarters, 100 East Forty-second street. The new societies will bring the total to 925.

Last year, committee officials said, the societies made 157,830 loans, aiding considerably in the relief and rehabilitation of Jewish towns that had suffered from boycotts or other persecutions.

A majority of the new offices are to be opened in the districts of Bialystock, Lublin, Lodz and Kielce, where the need is reported to be especially acute.

## Britain's Rich Jews Refuse Polish Help

### Force Abandonment of Relief Drives

London (WNS)—The unwillingness of England's wealthy Jews to contribute to a special fund for the relief of Polish Jewry has forced the Board of Deputies of British Jews to abandon plans for a Polish Jewish relief drive.

The well-to-do Jews are reported to have argued that they cannot do anything for Polish Jewry at this time because they are still raising funds for German Jewry.

To meet this situation the Federation of Jewish Relief Associations of England has issued its own appeal for the Polish Jews but this plea has not received the support of the Board of Deputies.

## Church Head Asks For "War" on Jews

### Roumanian Jews Expect Violence

Bucharest (WNS) — Intensification of the widespread anti-Semitic feeling prevalent in Roumania with the possibility of renewed violence on a large scale were feared by Jews here following a virtual declaration of war upon the Jews by the Patriarch Miron Christea, head of the Greek Orthodox Church of Roumania, with which an overwhelming majority of the population is affiliated.

In an interview with a representative of the Bucharest daily, Curentul, the Patriarch charged the Jews with having "caused an unrest" accused them of monopolistic of corruption and socializing the press "which, with the aid of foreign help, permanently flays all the spiritual treasures of the Roumanians" and said the "very marrow has been sucked from the bones" of the Roumanian nation by the Jews.

## Cardinal Scores Nazi Race-Breeding

MUNICH — Cardinal Faulhaber, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Munich, officiating at a royal fenstahl, located documents proved wedding ceremony vigorously denounced the Nazi-approved idea of "race-breeding."

"When, however, wedlock, is instituted as an instrument of racial breeding—by which the lowest level of ethics is obtained—a nation is unable either to achieve national renaissance or to rise to a really high cultural standard."



## Reich Rules Aryan Wife's Debt to Jew Not Payable

Berlin (WNS)—Pursuing the extra-legal drive to eliminate Jews from business, a Nazi court has ruled that an Aryan whose wife patronizes a Jewish shop against his wishes cannot be held responsible for her debts and the Jewish merchant cannot demand payments.

In upholding the Aryan husband for refusing to pay his wife's debts, the court set an important precedent which opens the way for

a good-sized racket.

In the future it will be possible for Aryan women to buy goods in Jewish-owned stores and then avoid payment by having their husbands object and cite the court's ruling.

At the same time the famous Wertheim department store passed completely into Aryan control, when Fritz Sternberg and George Wertheim, its principal stockholders, were eliminated.

## Arabs Say Jewish State Contains Moslem Property

Geneva—An attack upon the Royal Commission's proposal to establish a Jewish State in Palestine as an invasion of Moslem religious rights was contained in another message sent today to Pierre Orts, Chairman of the League Permanent Mandates Commission, by Auni Bey Abdul Hadi, Secretary of the Arab Higher Committee of Palestine.

In the territory of the future Jewish State, Auni Bey writes,

there is a great deal of Moslem Waqf (church endowment) property, particularly between Hedera and Jaffa. This, he points out, is inalienable. There are also mosques and cemeteries north and south of Jaffa and in Galilee.

The letter emphasizes that all mosques and cemeteries are Islamic sanctuaries. The letter is couched in a tone that would probably arouse Pan-Moslem feeling.

## Jealousy Cause of Leni Riefenstahl's Downfall

WARSAW — Chancellor Hitler's alleged "non-Aryan" favorite, Leni Riefenstahl, was the victim of jealousy nurtured by Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goebbels' wife, who wanted to occupy her role of the Reich's unofficial "first lady," it was reported last week by the Polish-Jewish newspaper Nasz Przeglad.

The Polish-language paper said the Chancellor named Fraulein Riefenstahl official film producer over the Propaganda Minister's protests, engendered by the fact that her duties were properly in his scope.

The Goebbels' protests were sharpened, the paper stated, by his wife's jealousy.

"Goebbels," the paper declared, "ing her non-Aryan ancestry, and submitted them to Der Fuehrer." The report however, said that

contrary to published reports, the Chancellor did not acquiesce to Goebbels' demands that his favorite be ousted. Instead, he permitted Fraulein Riefenstahl to exhibit a propaganda film being currently shown at the Reich pavilion of the Paris Exposition.

According to a report widely circulated in Europe and America Goebbels stalked out of a party attended by Fraulein Riefenstahl, with the remark, "There is someone here who is non-Aryan." The report was denied officially in Berlin.

## Warburg Speaks

Felix M. Warburg's statement on partition before sailing for the Jewish Agency meeting, which is now in session at Zurich, is of great importance. The British Government unquestionably regards the New York financier and philanthropist as the spokesman for the Non-Zionist Jews in America. It also realizes that Mr. Warburg and his supporters represent from a material point of view as great, if not greater asset for the upbuilding of Palestine as the Zionist Organization.

When Mr. Warburg, therefore, said that he hopes to "avert the partition of Palestine, a land too small to be so divided," it means that the resolution of the Zionist Congress approving in principle partition cannot be regarded as a final action. Even if the Zionists were united in support of partition by the views of the Non-Zionist section of the Jewish Agency would carry weight on any decision of the British Government.

When, however, approximately one-third of the Zionists of the world, as represented at the Congress, uncompromisingly oppose a new Mandate and then are reinforced by the united attitude of the Non-Zionists, also against the partition, the League of Nations as well as Great Britain must take notice.

It is of course obvious that the motives of the Zionist "neinsagers" and the Non-Zionist adversaries are far from identical. The Zionists opposing division of Palestine do so because they want a real Jewish State and not a toy State for political purposes.

## G-Men on the Job

Announcement by Attorney-General Cummings that he has asked the Federal Bureau of Investigation "to make a cursory examination" of the network of Nazi camps in the United States "to ascertain if there are any facts warranting further investigation" is good news.

The G-men are justly famous for the efficiency with which they function. With the job of investigating the Nazi camps in their hands we can be sure it will be well done.

There is little doubt that the agents of the Department of Justice will find enough to warrant a further investigation either by the Federal government itself or by a Congressional committee.

The boast of Fritz Kuhn, boss of the Nazi camps, that he welcomes an inquiry, is sheer braggadocio. The fact of the matter is that he and his cohorts are in deathly fear of an inquiry.



## League Suggests Arab, Jewish State Supervision

(Continued from Page One)

the report follows:

"In its conclusions on the 1936 disturbances the commission fully recognizes the difficulties in preventing disturbances of this nature, but it is not convinced it would not have been possible to adopt more decisive measures at an early date with a view to putting down armed resistance. The 1936 disturbances reveal a state of great political tension, due to the underlying causes to which reference was made in a preliminary opinion given elsewhere at the Council's request. These causes were largely responsible for the great difficulty experienced in putting down the disturbances and for the continuance of conditions of political instability.

"In its preliminary opinion on Palestine's future the commission, after briefly outlining the date, recommendations and statement of policy by the mandatory power in which it was asked to advise the Council, summarizes the advantages, disadvantages and the various solutions proposed.

"The commission considered it necessary first to give an opinion to the Council on the maintenance of the existing mandate. After

noting the mandate's obligations had not appeared irreconcilable, the commission states that the inevitable antagonism between the two races' aspirations was further accentuated and exasperated by circumstances which could not have been foreseen twenty years ago. Increasing anti-Semitism on the one hand, and growing Arab national feeling on the other, combined to increase the difficulties in maintaining a balance in applying the mandate.

"At the same time a certain fluctuation in policy by the mandatory power tended to encourage the belief on the part of Arabs that violence could stop Jewish immigration. Moreover the present mandate became almost unworkable, the commission considers, when it was publicly declared to be so by the Royal Commission and the mandatory Government itself. The commission, therefore, considers it is worth continuing the examination of the advantages and drawbacks of a new territorial solution."

In 1724 the governor of Louisiana decreed that all Jews should leave the colony. However there is no record of any expulsion.







According to an estimate, seventy-nine Protestant pastors now are under arrest in Germany

## Actress Bluffs Nazis; Denies Faith In Order to Escape

London—Here is the story of a Jewish actress who fled Germany because she had Jewish blood in her veins and faced arrest:

"My name is Sonja Schubert. I am an exile. I have to report to the police at regular intervals. They are always pleasant to me, but I always feel like a criminal.

"I am the only daughter of devoted parents. Every penny they had was spent on my education. I was eighteen when I decided on a stage career. Talent and luck helped me forward. Hitler's fan-fares woke me cruelly from my dreams of fame and fortune. One lovely spring morning in 1934, I walked to my theatre in my home town for a rehearsal. As I walked the sunlit street I fingered the telegram that lay in the pocket of my coat. A Berlin director was to come and see my work. If he was pleased, it was Berlin for me, the aim of every artist!

"At the stage door I was about to bid the door-keeper a happy 'good-morning' when a heavy hand suddenly rested on my shoulder. Angrily I turned to see a tall man in uniform. 'Follow me', he said roughly. I was in custody. A troop of uniformed Nazis crowded the theatre vestibule. They stared insolently at me. In the

corner I saw my director; his hands were tied. His crime, I soon learned, was being a Jew on his father's side. Four ferocious-looking men held him down in a chair. When I saw him I trembled. I, too, had Jewish blood in my veins. Someone spoke, snapping out his words. I heard something about Liberals, Jews . . . 'Creatures that must be wiped out'.

"A man in a brown uniform questioned me. My mind flashed back to my parents. Should I confess the truth about myself? I was young and wanted to live! And so I lied. When I answered, 'No,' to the questions put to me, a fellow artist jumped forward. His face was white. It was the eternal Judas face. 'Why don't you admit it,' he shouted. Then turning to the officer: 'She's got Jewish blood,' he said. 'Look at her!'

"The man hated me, and I knew why he hated me—a few months before I had saved a fifteen-year-old chorus girl from his claws. I acted. It might be for the last time, so I acted for my life. I turned to the officer calmly and informed him that if he had any doubt as to the truth of what I had told him, he had only to look up the police register. Had they looked it up there and then, I should have been lost; I had bluffed. I was playing for time.

"For the moment I had won the battle. Grudgingly I was released, but without any kind of apology. Some may despise me for denying my Jewish blood, but my parents will understand. I hurried out. I had to act quickly now. They must not have time to look up the register. I waited 'till dark and then fled over the frontier.

"Then the real struggle began. I had to find a new livelihood. But I am one of the lucky ones. I have a university degree and speak several languages. But what of the other—the vast majority? Girls like me, who worked in Germany as secretaries, managers, shop assistants? Mostly they don't speak anything but their mother tongue, and who wants a German shorthand typist? We have no homeland. It has been taken from us by Hitler and his ruffians."

## Heil, Heil Gang Chooses Copeland

### Nazi Subscribers Told How to Vote

New York — New York's Nazi organization came out in full support of Senator Royal S. Copeland for Mayor today.

The indorsement of Tammany's anti-New Deal candidate was announced in the current issue of the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter, weekly Nazi organ of the German-American Volksbund.

Fritz Kuhn, American "Fuehrer," is editor of the newspaper, which is generally credited with faithfully representing the views of Adolph Hitler in this country.

"Where the German element stands is fairly clear," an editorial in the August 1 issue of the Weckruf says.

### The Only Way Out

"It will give its vote neither to LaGuardia nor Mahoney. The only alternative of escape from both LaGuardia and Mahoney is Senator Royal S. Copeland."

This, according to persons familiar with American Nazi activities, is virtually an order to members of the Hitler organization to cast their votes for the Tammany candidate.

"Mahoney is practically making his race on the prestige he gained in certain circles by opposing American participation in the Berlin Olympic games last year," it adds.

### France Considers Jewish Colonies


