War and Refugees

In a war, among those to be pitied are the refugees. Those thousands wandering through Europe and on the high seas are the first to feel the effects of the hysteria against foreigners, the tightening borders, the regimentation and military control.

Those refugees lucky enough to have found homes face varying futures. In France, provision has been made for them to give service, military and otherwise, to the Republic. In other countries, refugees face the prospects of rigid control, perhaps internment.

War means that refugee-aid organizations will find it almost impossible to operate. Germany has already announced that she has suspended emigration of Jews, with the possible exception of the aged and infirm.

To the refugee this struggle means not only the horrors of war but the horrors of homelessness.

It Becomes A Crime to Listen

As war began the Nazi government proclaimed a law under which anyone in Germany who listens to a radio broadcast from a foreign nation is subject to a penitentiary term. Those who spread reports from such broadcasts are liable, in special cases, to the death penalty.

Thus the Nazis seek to protect the morale of the German people against propaganda from abroad.

Germany's leaders, historically, have been tragically inept at understanding the psychology of other peoples. It must be doubted whether they understand the psychology even of their own people.

For, if we know human nature, this law will stir one of the oldest, strongest instincts of the race—curiosity. Even in prison men find means of obtaining information from outside and spreading it from cell to cell. People in Germany, now shut by their rulers into the dismal prison of war, will risk arrest and even death to learn, and to inform each other, what the radio and the press of other countries are saying.

What could more surely cause intelligent Germans to doubt the truthfulness of what their government tells them than the discovery that their government fears to let them hear the other side? What, they will inevitably want to know, is this foreign propaganda of which the Nazi propagandists are so afraid?

Armenian Paper Appeals to Werfel

CAIRO. — The important Armenian organ, the "Husaper," has published on its front page a strong appeal of the Armenian people to Franz Werfel, the German-Jewish author, and to the Jewish people to draw the attention of the civilized world to the new menace to the Armenians as a result of the Turkish occupation of the Alexandretta province in Syria.

The newspaper reminded Franz Werfel of his great pro-Armenian work which once placed before the civilized world the tragedy of the Armenian people, when they were massacred by the Turks in 1918.

Hitlerism Must Go, U. S. Germans Told

Fuehrer Blamed For Present War

CLEVELAND. — Otto Sattler of New York, editor of Solidarity, official organ of the Workmen's Benefit Society and president of the German Cultural League, last week told members of the latter organization: "Hitler alone is responsible for this war."

"The world's hatred against Hitler must not be changed into a hate for a whole people," he said. "We German-Americans have been against Hitler from the beginning and we hope for the destruction of all he stands for. Nazism must be crushed and the true Germany arise to take its place among the civilized nations of the world."

"We hope there will be no new Versailles Treaty with all its stupid errors, but instead the establishment of a United States of Europe working for peace and democracy with the United States of America."

Prague Jews Faced With Huge Problem

PRAGUE. — The Jewish Communal Board of Prague is now confronted with a new gigantic problem and namely the accommodation in the city of the numerous Jewish exiles from the provincial places in Bohemia and Moravia, who have been ordered by the Nazi authorities to proceed to Prague.

In accordance with the decision of Baron von Neurath, the Protector, and the Gestapo, all the Jews in Bohemia and Moravia are to be gradually concentrated in Prague and the Central Jewish Emigration Bureau here is to arrange for a continuous emigration of the Jews from the Protectorate.

The heads of the Jewish Community and of the Central Jewish Emigration Bureau have already been informed by the authorities that by the end of the year 1939 no less than 30,000 Jews must leave the Protectorate.

Plan For Palestine Jewish Legion Made

Workingmen to Hold Memorial Exercises To Dedicate New Burial Plot

The annual memorial exercises of the Rhode Island Workingmen's Beneficial Association will be held next Sunday, at the Lincoln Park Cemetery at 11 o'clock. Alter Boyman, chairman of the Advisory Board, has arranged a program for the occasion.

The observance of these memorial services began two years ago, and the favorable response it has received from the members of the organization, made it possible to arrange similar programs annually. Joshua Bell, attorney and Hebrew scholar, will be the principal speaker.

Following the services, the entire group will proceed to the "new" burial plot of the Rhode Island Workingmen's Beneficial Association and take part in the services relative to the unveiling of the stone in memory to the late Samuel Newman, who was financial secretary of the organization for many years.

The services are open to the membership as well as the general public.

Budapest Cancels Lottery Licenses

BUDAPEST. — Cancellation of all licenses held by Jewish lottery office keepers was announced by the State Lottery Administration which set aside a recent anti-Jewish law which made provisions for cancellation only after four or five years.

Although the keepers brought the State a net income estimated at between four to five million pengos yearly they will not be compensated.

Jewish stall holders in the secondhand goods market were given notice to evacuate on the pretext that their stalls were being rented by Christians.

Palestine Citizens Asked to Register

JERUSALEM. — Registration of British subjects for war-time military service and civilian defense was begun throughout Palestine this week.

The authorities also instituted confidential inquiries among physicians, engineers and mechanics concerning their willingness to enlist for war service. Replying affirmatively, Jewish physicians are understood to have pointed out that many capable doctors were among refugees adrift on ships in the Mediterranean. They urged that the refugees be brought to Palestine where they could be of use in the event of war.

England Negotiates Scheme With Agency 22,000 Jewish Youths Armed

PARIS. — The British Government is negotiating with the Jewish Agency for Palestine for creation of a new Jewish Legion, particularly to defend Palestine it was learned here last week. Palestinian Jewish youth would play the leading role in such a force, but the Jewish youths from other lands might also be considered.

The discussions were started by the British Government, which offered certain concessions, including immediate release of all interned Jewish illegal immigrants in Palestine. It was for these discussions that Moshe Shertok, head of the Jewish Agency's political department, flew to London after conclusion of the Zionist Congress in Geneva instead of returning to Palestine.

22,000 Bear Arms

More than 22,000 Jews in Palestine already have authorization to carry arms. Creation of a Jewish Legion under the sponsorship Agency would release British troops for service on other fronts.

(More than 10,000 Jews, recruited from Palestine, United States, Canada and Europe, served in the Palestine Jewish Legion during the World War as a part of Marshal Allenby's forces in the Near East.)

Emanuel Hebrew School Opens Sunday

The School Board of Temple Emanu-El announces that registration for the Hebrew School Department will be held on Sunday morning, September 10, from 10 to 12 o'clock at the Temple. New and old pupils are required to register at this time. The work in the Hebrew School will begin at once. Services for the children of the Religious School will be held during the High Holydays at 10:30 each morning in the Temple Vestry.

The School continues under the charge of Fred Weiser. He is assisted in the Hebrew School by Samuel Kessler.

Arsenal on Wheels Seized by Police

JERUSALEM. — An arsenal on wheels was seized by Yebanese frontier police as an Arab car sought to cross the border into Palestine with a hundred bombs, land mines, dynamite, revolvers, and ammunition. The driver of the car, identified as a Palestinian Arab, was arrested by the police.

Mexican Jew Baiter Wounded

MEXICO CITY. — Col. Simon Bolivar Sierra, anti-Semitic opposition member of Congress, was near death here from wounds suffered in a political gun battle in the center of the capital in which two men were killed.

High Holydays Begin Wed. Night; Rabbis Announce Service Schedule

Orthodox, Conservative and Reformed Jewry throughout the world will assemble in their respective synagogues next Wednesday evening, to commence the celebration of Rosh Hashonah.

The festival is traditionally observed for two days by Conservative and Orthodox Jews, while the Reformed group confines its observance to one day. Unlike other Jewish festivals, the holy days which start the New Year are not related to primitive nature holidays or identified with any historic event. Rather, they are regarded as days of self-examination, self-criticism, and self-judgment.

Warners Accuse Fritz Kuhn in Suit

NEW YORK. — The German-American Bund was intended to destroy the Constitution and the Bill of Rights and, ultimately, to bring this country under "the will and dominion of Nazi Germany," Warner Brothers Pictures, Inc., charged in an answer on file this week in Federal Court to Fritz Kuhn's suit for \$5,000,000 damages which he claims resulted from the Warner picture, *Confessions of a Nazi Spy*.

Kuhn, head of the German-American Bund, bases his suit on the ground that the picture had stigmatized his organization.

JERUSALEM. — Palestine, together with the Mandatory Power, moved forward rapidly to cope with war and the emergency situation preceeding it, as military and economic measures were taken to conserve food supplies and distribution and to strengthen the country's defenses.

A series of regulatory enactments published here included as a principal feature a drastic and unprecedented banking law which will severely hit the smaller banks of the country which were the first to feel the uneasiness striking a population expecting the imminence of war.

Legislation issued provides for the maintenance of reserve stocks of essential commodities, the control of food imports and the control of food commodities, including the regulation of prices and consumption.

Coughlin Problem Stated By Priest

Denies Speaker
Is Authorized

WILLIAMSTOWN, Mass.—The Rev. Gregory Feige of Newton, N. J., a Catholic priest, said last week that the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin did not represent the Catholic Church in his writings and radio speeches and that the "problem" was one for the radio priest's ecclesiastic superior.

Not Approved

Father Feige, a member of the committee of Catholics for human rights, and a former professor of philosophy at Fordham University said:

"The question is, how can a church founded in justice and charity permit its official representative to go contrary to these principles of justice and charity?"

"The direct answer is that he is not an official representative of the Church when he speaks over the radio or writes in that paper that goes under the incongruous name of Social Justice, for the reason that his own superior has stated more than once he has given no approval."

Treasury to Quiz Pelley on Taxes

WASHINGTON. — A full investigation of the income tax and finances of William Dudley Pelley will be undertaken by the Bureau of Internal Revenue, Chairman Martin Dies of the House Committee Investigating un-American Activities, revealed. At the same time it was learned that the Federal Bureau of Investigation is probing into Pelley's activities as an "unregistered foreign propagandist."

The frenzied finance of the Silver Shirt leader was exposed before the Dies Committee. At the same time it was revealed by Dies that all efforts to bring Pelley before the committee had failed and that he has recently "disappeared" from his headquarters in Ashville, N. C. "We don't know where he is, although he was last reported in Montana," Dies said, "and he has refused to avail himself of every opportunity to appear before us."

Arab Pledge Their Loyalty to England

JERUSALEM. — The government announced in a special issue of the official Palestine Gazette that colonial defense regulations similar to the imperial regulations are effective in the Holy Land, with the exception of conscription.

An Arab delegation headed by Ragheb Bey Nashashibi, leader of the moderate Arab Defense Party, called on High Commissioner Sir Harold A. MacMichael and assured him that the majority of Palestine Arabs were loyal to Britain and would support the government in the current international crisis.

Predicts Amnesty For Reich Jews

LONDON. — Reynolds News, organ of the cooperative movement, predicted that Chancellor Hitler's next surprise will be to declare amnesty for the persecuted Jews in order to impress foreign Jews, particularly Americans.

The newspaper pointed out that in the last fortnight all Jewish doctors in Germany have been called to war service and many other Jews have been given well-paid posts.

TROTSKY HITS PACT

MEXICO CITY. — Leon Trotsky, exiled former Soviet war commissar this week said Russia "in reality" took the place of Japan in the Fascist axis by signing a non-aggression pact with Germany. He denounced the pact as a "capitulation of Stalin before Fascist imperialism."

Emigration Halted by Nazis

Reich Herds Jews In Labor Battalions

Must Work on War Projects

PARIS. — Emigration of German Jews from the Reich struck new obstacles yesterday because of the tense international situation, advices reaching here indicated, stating that Nazi authorities no longer permit young and middle-aged Jewish men to leave the country. Most of Germany's frontiers are virtually closed and foreign consulates have ceased to accept applications for visas to foreign countries.

Informed sources said that the Nazis, who hitherto had placed no obstacles in the way of Jews wishing to emigrate, providing they gave up most of their property, were now making distinctions between women and aged, on the one hand, and young and middle-aged Jewish males, who are prevented from leaving by being conscripted into labor battalions.

Most emigrants seen at railway stations in Berlin and Vienna recently are women, aged men and children, waiting for trains to

take them out of the country while their menfolk were forced to remain behind to work on war projects.

Fascist Head Tells Of "Jewish Plan"

NEW YORK. — George E. Deatherage, of St. Albans, W. Va., head of the fascist Knights of the White Camelia, addressing several thousand persons at the Innisfail Stadium here, attributed the Russo-German non-aggression pact to "a great rebuilding of the Christian faith inside Russia," as well as pressure from outside, and warned his listeners of a "Jewish plan" to confuse Americans on the issue.

"I know what has been happening behind the scenes," he said. "It will surprise you to know there has been a great rebuilding of the Christian faith in Russia . . . Stalin didn't dare to do anything else (than agree to the pact.)"

New ORT Projects

NEW YORK. — George Backer, president of the American ORT Federation, reports that his organization is about to conclude a year of unprecedented activity and increasing expansion. Unsettled conditions in Eastern Europe together with the aggravation of German anti-Semitism after the November pogroms necessitated adding 40 new centers for agricultural and industrial retraining to the 306 already established in various parts of Europe.

Decree Labor Camps For Hungarian Jews

BUDAPEST. — Persistent reports are current here that the Hungarian Government is planning to establish a Jewish Emigration Bureau in Budapest to organize an orderly emigration of the Jews from the country. It is also reported that the Government proposes to levy a special tax from the Jews for the upkeep of the new Emigration Bureau.

At the same time it is reported here that the German Government is pressing the Hungarian Government to send a large number of Hungarian Jews to Germany to work in the forced Labour Camps and especially in the units engaged in erecting fortifications. Whether the Hungarian Government will agree to such a proposal is not yet known.

Kuhn Says Hitler Will Lick Europe

SELLERSVILLE, Pa. — Fritz Kuhn told a rally of his German-American Bund last week that "Adolf Hitler will lick the whole of Europe."

Speaking before 2000 at the Deutschorst Country Club Kuhn declared they could "best serve the Fatherland and show that their heart is with Germany by being absolutely neutral."

Church Approves Anti-Jewish Drive

MONTREAL. — Anti-Semitic campaigns in the nearby Laurentian mountain resort area received the official sanction of Roman Catholic Church leaders at St. Agathe when Canon J. B. Charland, parish priest, approved the drive against the hundreds of Jewish residents of the district. Canon Charland's approval followed appearance over the week-end of hundreds of placards warning Jews to "scram while the going is good." The priest told his parishioners that "we must keep the district French-Canadian and must remain masters in our own community."

Anti-Nazi Boycott Intensified in Europe

NEW YORK. — A survey conducted by the Joint Boycott Council of the American Jewish Congress and the Jewish Labor Committee shows that the anti-Nazi boycott has been "greatly intensified" throughout Western Europe in the last year as a reaction to the Munich agreement and the dismemberment of Czechoslovakia, the council announced here.

Nazi exports to Western Europe dropped from 387.4 million marks in the corresponding period of this year, a decline of 17 per cent, the survey declared. The boycott was found to be most effective in Great Britain, France, the Netherlands, Belgium and Poland.

Issues Warning On Help to Refugees

LONDON. — A warning that the British Government does not contemplate unilateral action in the matter of financial assistance for overseas refugee settlement projects was voiced in Commons by Lord Winterton, chairman of the Inter-governmental Refugee Committee.

Speaking for the Government in a debate on the refugee question prior to adjournment of Commons, Lord Winterton cited hostility of public opinion toward single-handed British financial aid for refugees. He expressed the hope that the Coordinating Foundation, recently set up by private groups to facilitate emigration of refugees from Germany, would be generously supported by private subscription.

VESSEL LAUNCHED
JERUSALEM.—Representatives of the government, the Jewish Agency for Palestine, the Palestine Federation of Labor and others attended the launching of the "Chaim Arlosroff," a new training ship for Jewish sailors. The vessel is named for the Palestine labor leader who was assassinated six years ago.

Jews Ordered To Rebuild Synagogues

Nazis to Allow Holiday Services

BERLIN. — Leaders of the Jewish community here were ordered to begin rebuilding synagogues and other buildings destroyed by fire and during the disturbances of last November, it was reported unofficially.

The order came as a complete surprise to Jewish leaders who were told by Nazi officials that only Jewish workers may be employed.

Representatives of the Jewish community announced that only two synagogues will be rebuilt at the present time inasmuch as many Jewish families had already emigrated from Germany and the need for additional houses of worship was not pressing.

It was reported also that the Nazi government will allow Jews to gather for prayer during the coming high holidays. Permission to gather for prayer on the high holidays has been granted to Jews in Berlin and not yet to Jews in other cities throughout Germany.

Brazil Tightens Immigration Laws

SAO PAULO, Brazil. — The Brazilian government enacted a law forbidding immigrants who came as tourists to remain in the country. The law prohibits issuance of permanent residence permits to such tourists, but excepts technicians of unquestioned ability who have three-year employment contracts and capitalists who undertake to create industries of value to Brazilian national interests. Also excepted from the terms of the law artists and scientists of world renown, who will be permitted to remain under the immigration quotas of their respective countries or origin.

Tourists violating the law will be subject to severe punishment, including heavy fines and forced labor to the tune of their deportation. Many Jewish tourists now in Brazil and others on the way are affected by the measure.

Fear Pressure May Bring New Program

PARIS. — A newspaper man just returned from Berlin said this week that the Jews of Germany were in an extremely dangerous position at this moment, perhaps more dangerous than at any previous time since the Nazi regime. He quoted extremely qualified foreigners in Berlin whose names could not, for obvious reasons, be divulged.

Berlin, he reported, was in the grip of an almost hysterically feverish war atmosphere. It was an ugly atmosphere, full of plain evidence of bitterness and disappointment which might at any time take the form of brutality against the Jews, but a breakdown in the negotiations to find a way out of the crisis may bring pogroms of unprecedented severity and proportion. If the present crisis is prolonged for any length of time, the results may be the same.

SAVED FROM DROWNING

LONDON. — Two Jewish refugees, Walter Altmann and Gunter Mann, were sent back to Belgium when it was established that they had permits allowing them to remain there until Aug. 31. The refugees were saved from drowning in the English Channel after attempting to cross from Ostend, Belgium, in a dinghy.

U. S. School Books Teach Nazi Code, Survey Reveals

NEW YORK. — Sixty per cent of 166 textbooks used in the study of the social and biological sciences in this country, it was revealed this week, misuse the concept of "race" in one way or another and 22 per cent in the same group teach what amounts to Nazi doctrine about superior and inferior races.

The disclosure was made in a pamphlet, "Can You Name Them?" just published by the American Committee for Democracy and Intellectual Freedom, of which the noted anthropologist Prof. Franz Boas is the chairman. The pamphlet was prepared by a panel of experts under the direction of Prof. Boas, set up to examine the way in which race questions are treated in school books. The panel's study was declared to be part of a broad educational campaign to be conducted by the committee against unscientific teaching of race problems in American schools.

Blind Veteran Returns Medals

ROME. — A Genoese Jewish war veteran, who was blinded in action, has returned his two silver medals to Premier Benito Mussolini, with the following message: "I am returning your medals. Please give me back my eyes." The veteran's action was taken in protest against Italian anti-Semitic laws.

Dies Seeks Prison Terms For American Bund Leaders

WASHINGTON. — After hearings which exposed German pressure for restrictions on Jews in a college and attempts by the German-American Bund to form a united front with other similar organizations, Chairman Martin Dies of the House Committee on Un-American Activities announced today he would ask Federal and State Governments to act against the Bund.

Dies said he expected the Justice Department to file charges soon against the Bund for failure to register with the State Department as foreign agents.

He said he hoped the issue could be tried in the Federal courts so that if the leaders were guilty they would go to the penitentiary.

Palestine Hebrew Culture Fund Begins U.S. Campaign

According to the latest news received from Palestine by Dr. Simon Ginzburg, who is representing the Agudat Hasofrim (the Hebrew Writers Association) of Palestine and the Brit Ivrit Olamit (the World Federation of Hebrew Cultural Organizations), the Writers Association has already begun its publication activities.

At the last meeting of the Hebrew Publication Society, founded by the Agudat Hasofrim, Asher Barash and A. Steinman, editors, declared that all preliminary preparations have already been made, and that shortly a whole series of books will begin to appear, one book every month. The series, the first book of which will appear in Tishre (October 1939), will consist of the following divisions: 1) Poetry; 2) Novels; 3) Science; 4) Essays.

The campaign of the Palestine Hebrew Culture Fund, opened in America for the purpose of helping this publication work of the Hebrew work of the Hebrew writers in Palestine, as well as of helping the Brit Ivrit Olamit in her efforts to spread the Hebrew book throughout the world, is being continued, throughout the United States and Canada, under the leadership of Dr. Ginzburg with the assistance of all loyal Hebrews and leading spirits of American Jewry.

"We Will Win Despite War"

Suspend Palestine Paper For Protesting Maltreatment

TEL AVIV. — There was deep resentment here when the Government ordered the suspension for one week of the Labor Daily, Davar, because the Hebrew newspaper had criticized the authorities in a leading article the previous Sunday for maltreatment of the 297 refugees who arrived at Haifa in five lifeboats.

This article pointed out that the refugees had been transferred to the concentration camp at Sarafend on the Sabbath and contrasted the humanitarian attitude of the British policemen who witnessed their arrival with the political motive of the Government to discourage other refugees from seeking to enter Palestine. In conclusion Davar appealed to the

Government to stop the maltreatment of the refugees which cannot deter a people without any other choice.

For nearly a year no Jewish newspaper had been suspended except "Hamashkif," the Revisionist daily which was recently ordered to stop publication for a fortnight. It is considered typical of the Government's hostile attitude that while the article on the refugees appeared on Sunday, suspension was ordered to begin the following Thursday, the first day of the Zionist Congress, thus depriving many thousands of readers of Davar of the only channel of news concerning the Geneva sessions. This has caused considerable indignation.

Workmen's School Registration Sunday

Registration for the Workmen's Circle School will take place Sunday, September 10, at the School, 29 Snow street, it was announced this week by Beryl Segal, head instructor.

Subjects to be taught this year include Yiddish, writing and reading; Jewish history, elements of Hebrew; labor problems; and current events.

Free transportation is provided for children residing in South and North Providence.

Parochial School To Re-open Sept. 11

The Providence Hebrew Parochial School will reopen for its second year on September 11, it was announced this week by Rabbi J. Werner. The school, located at 129 Chester avenue, offers regular school courses and thorough Hebrew instruction. In addition courses in voice, piano and theory of music will be given to those desiring these courses.

Rabbi Werner urged that children be registered immediately. Transportation will be provided free of charge for children residing a distance from the school.

Washington Zionist Branches Proposed

GENEVA. — Moves to establish branches of the World Zionist Executive and Jewish Agency Executive in the United States were under way. The American delegates backed by representatives from other countries contended that establishment of a division of the Zionist Executive in Washington would be an advantage in combating Britain's Palestine policy, and in the event war involving Britain broke out.

Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, in a speech to the Congress, urged that a branch of the Agency Executive be set up in the United States on the ground that such a division would prevent the complete disruption of Palestine up-building work in the event of an European war. Branches of the two executives now exist in London and Jerusalem.

Disregard Sabbath To Aid in Emergency

Assure Gov't. Of Solid Support

WARSAW. — The Jewish population was actively participating in special defense measures throughout the country. Old and young Jews, many of them wearing traditional garb, are digging air raid precaution trenches, of which Warsaw alone has 250 covering several kilometers. Many orthodox Jews are working even on the Sabbath, holding that the danger of war and the duty of defending their country absolves them from observing the Sabbath rest.

Numerous Jewish food stores were open to enable the population to lay in emergency rations. Several shopkeepers, both Jews and non-Jews have been committed to the Government concentration camp at Kartuz-Bereza for profiteering.

All Jewish organizations, including the Writers' and Journalists' Association, have instructed their members to take part in the trench digging. Special contingents of diggers have been formed by refugees from Germany.

The entire Jewish press appeals to the Jews to make the greatest possible sacrifices to defend the country against Nazi aggression.

The Bund, Jewish Socialist party, issued a proclamation declaring that the Jewish masses were prepared to make the supreme sacrifice, together with the Polish masses, for the liberty and independence of Poland.

Urges Church To Cure Race Hatred

LOS ANGELES. — Declaring that "no nation can prosper or endure in which either anti-Semitism or any other form of persecution exists," Rabbi Edgar F. Magnin, of Los Angeles, the first Jewish rabbi ever to address the

Northern Baptist Convention, in session here, urged the church to pave the way for an "ultimate cure."
