The first would eliminate discrimination because of race, color, creed or religion by the utility companies, insurance companies, banking organizations and businesses affected with a public interest. NEW YORK. - Declaring that the Jewish problem is a world problem representing a challenge to those who will guide the post-war reconstruction efforts of the world, Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the Jewish Agency for Palestine and of the World Zionist Organization, said this week in his first public declaration since his arrival by Clipper in the United States, that British statesmen and the leaders of democracy everywhere must recog-nize that the solution of the Jew-ish problem lies in giving the Jewish people an opportunity to build a land of its own.


