### **Washington Police** Disperse Marchers

Stage Demonstration At British Embassy

WASHINGTON — Washington police dispersed several hundred Jews, led by 12 rabbis, who staged a demonstration last week in front of the British Embassy, chanting

Its leaders said the demonstra-tion was sponsored by the "Washington Jewish Community."
Marchers carried signs reading
"Justice for Our People," "Neither
Nazi nor British Concentration
Camps," and "Fight Buttish Tyranny in Palestine."

Ten policemen arrived and told the demonstrators they were violating a district law forbidding such gatherings within 500 feed of an embassy. No arrests were made, however. An embassy physical facilities have already spokesman said they had not summoned the police.

Earlier in the day, a crude Union Jack with a black swastika was found hanging from two trees the words, "America—1776; Palestine—1946" and "Dachau, Buchenwald, Cyprus."
