Any relation, Joe?" . . .

It so happens that Cantor Nathan Schlossberg is Joseph Schlossberg's brother, and the five-year-old Label is his nephew . . . With a beaming smile on his face, Mr. Joseph Schlossberg took out of his pocket, the following clipping which gives some data concerning his very talented nephew.

Leon Schlossberg, five, is like most children his age in his opinion of the relative importance of playing with his toys and demonstrating his talents on command from strangers . . . He comes by

his talents naturally . . . His grandfather, whose name he bears, was a leading cantor . . . His father carries on the tradition . . . Haifa, Jerusalem Get Military Courts

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—The first military courts to deal with terrorism, which are being created under the emergency regulations, have been set up in Jerusalem and Haifa, it was officially announced.

A Deputy Judge Advocate General has been appointed by the Government to advise Commander-in-Chief A. P. Wavell on points of law that will come before the courts martial. The Deputy Judge will also advise members of the tribunal.

The official Gazette publishes legislation specially enacted providing that proceedings of the military courts can not be challenged by writ or before any civil court.

Wife is Citizen But Exile Must Go

New York (WNS)—Carl Ohm, whose Jewish wife is a naturalized American citizen, was denied permission by the Labor Department this week to remain in the United States and has been ordered to leave the country by January 1, or be deported to Germany, where he faces death, according to a communication received here by the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born.

Clashes Between Jews, Arabs Worst of Year

Shootings, Bombings Cause Death of 8 in Two Hours

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—After two hours of the most violent clashes Jerusalem has seen this year, seven Arabs were dead, five seriously wounded and others slightly wounded, and one Jew killed, four seriously injured and a number of others slightly hurt.

The shootings and bombings that caused the casualties occurred with such rapidity and in so many different points at the same time that it took hours to establish the toll of dead and injured.

The curfew hours had barely ended when the terrorism was launched upon the city. An Arab walking through Rehavia, Jewish residential quarter, was shot and killed.

Another Arab walking beside him was slightly wounded. At the same time a group of Arab laborers in the Beit Israel quarter was fired upon, resulting in the instant killing of one and the wounding of another who died shortly thereafter and the injury of a third.

Later Arabs stoned Jewish la-

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

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Palestine Divorces Increase

4 of 6 Weddings End in Split To Evade Immigration Laws

Jerusalem (WNS-Palcor Agency)—For every two weddings at which they officiated rabbis in Eretz Israel had to grant one divorce in the first half of this year. During the second quarter of 1937, divorces rose to the rate of four against every six weddings.

Figures published by the Palestine Government's Office of Statistics here reveal that the rate of divorce among the Jewish population was 534 per thousand in the first quarter and 617 per thousand in the second quarter of the year.

There were 6,467 marriages among all communities during the first half of the year ending June 30th. Of these, 2,696 were Jewish weddings. Against the latter total, there were 1,553 Jewish divorces out of a total of 2,097 reported for all religious communities.

Behind these figures lies a human story of profound interest. It is the problem of "fictitious" marriages (ceremonies were conubial life is not entered) for the purpose of evading the immigra-

tion laws. Residents of Palestine who have acquired nationality by continuous residence marry Jewesses while on holiday abroad in order to get them into the country as the legal wives of Palestinians.

On arrival here, a divorce is secured, so that the female newcomers may be free to settle in spite of the British Government's political restrictions on immigration.

Shipping Magnate On Trail for Life

Berlin (WNS) — Facing the death penalty if convicted, Arnold Bernstein, Jewish head of the Arnold Bernstein and Red Star shipping lines, both of which fly the German flag and operate between German, Belgian and American ports, went on trial before the Hanseatic special tribunal in Hamburg together with five Jewish directors on charges of treason and violation of the foreign exchange laws.



Admit Planning Anti Jewish Disorders

Danzig (WNS)—A tacit admission that the anti-Jewish excesses in Danzig during the first three days of complete Nazi political control were planned and executed with the knowledge of Nazi authorities, came from Albert Foerster, Nazi fuehrer here, in addressing a mass meeting when he warned the Polish Jews to leave peacefully unless they wanted to be driven out by renewed violence.



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In Debt to Goering?

Comment of pro-Nazi Lord Halifax upon reaching Berlin (supposedly to attend a hunting expedition, actually to try to make a deal with Hitler by which colonies will be swapped for peace):

"Great Britain and every country owe a debt of gratitude to General Goering for the encouragement given sport by the international hunting exhibition at Berlin."

We back away from this nauseating mixture of soft soap and sugar to recall that the usual "hunting exhibitions" in Berlin are hunts for human beings, that America owes NO debt of gratitude or debt of any kind to General Goering or to Germany, and that while Lord Halifax's Government may owe such a debt it also owes the U. S. A. six billion dollars.—N. Y. Post.

Give Us Liberty

News reports tell us that Mr. Arnold Bernstein is on trial for his life before the Hanseatic Special Tribunal in Hamburg. The Nazi government charges him with "economic sabotage." Mr. Bernstein is in the unenviable position of heading two German shipping lines. His directors failed to report accurately the foreign exchange in the company's possession abroad.

If we did not know that Nazi and Communist doctrines were utterly irreconcilable we should say that the proceedings smacked of Moscow.

Mr. Bernstein does not deny the facts of the case as presented by the government. Privately he probably feels it would be a miracle if there were no discrepancies in his reports. Publicly he makes the mild excuse that the internal direction of his companies has become "rather confused." The fact of the matter is that Nazi regulations on foreign exchange have become so complicated that everybody is "rather confused."

It seems to us the height of injustice to put the death penalty on disobedience to a law which, due to inherent faults, cannot always practically be obeyed. It would be no more unjust to put the death penalty on a mistake in an income tax report here.


But the drastic enforcement of this Nazi regulation is only another proof of the desperation of totalitarian planners. Hitler is trying to do the impossible and his people suffer the consequences. Perhaps opinion will compel clemency as it did during the persecution of the German Protestant clergy.

We prefer the American way, muddling and ineffective as it seems at times.

Wherein the Timely Subject of Partition is Discussed

When we tackle the timely subject of partition, we must remember that it has created in the minds of Zionists a collision between two philosophies. According to Dr. Leo Pinsker, author of "Auto-Emancipation" the hatred of the Jew is based on fear. A spirit without a body is bound to cause fear and mistrust, and a nation for two thousand years deprived of its land, yet retaining its religious and national identity, is comparable to such a bodyless soul; hence, the eternal hatred of the eternal people. Only the restoration of the historical homeland to the Jew can remedy this situation. Only when the Jew will form a majority in one land, which he will be able to call his own, can he be respected as a minority elsewhere.

On the other hand, some Zionist leaders opposed to the partition plan, state that to them Zionism means the ingathering of the Diaspora. This calls for a majority of the Jewish people in Palestine, and a partitioned Palestine offers no such opportunity.

This second theory may have been correct in the seventeenth century when there were only one million, five hundred thousand Jews all over the world, but today, with sixteen million Jews, no optimist can possibly say that a majority of Jews could settle in Palestine, even if not partitioned.

The technicalities which are emphasized by those opposed to the plan are:—where will such a small state get the financial resources necessary for a functioning government? How will we be able to guard long frontiers? What guaranty can we have that the Arabs will make peace with the idea of partition? How can such a small state solve the problem of the Jews of Poland, Roumania, Germany and other countries where they are oppressed?

Those in favor answer:—Seventy per cent of the budget of the Palestine government is supplied by the 425 thousand Jews in Palestine. Eight per cent of it comes back to them in the form of subsidies paying the bulk of the taxes to the government, the Jews sidles to education and sanitation. must maintain at their own expense their schools, hospitals and all other institutions ordinarily maintained by a government.

According to the recommendation of the Royal Commission, Great Britain is to assume the responsibility of protecting both the Arabic and the Jewish states from foreign invasion. Besides, the British corridor inland will separate the Jews from the Arabs. Our frontiers on the north border on the friendly Republic of Lebanon.

a Jewish self-defence, well trained and armed, existing illegally. Give this organization its legal status and you have your militia. Furthermore, our best defence against bandits will be a thickly populated area of young Jews tilling the soil. Peace with the Arabs will come when the Jewish and Arabic governments will meet as equals in conference. So far as solving the problem of suffering Jews is concerned, I believe that the area offered to us together with the British corridor, can, in time, accommodate five million Jews, who are at present living under precarious economic and political conditions in Eastern and Central European countries.

Even if the two hundred and twenty-five thousand Arabs now living in the would-be Jewish state, decide to remain there, we will still have five million dunams of rich soil, fit for irrigation, which in a sub-tropical climate, under intensive cultivation, can absorb an agricultural population of one million.

The alternatives offered by the Royal Commission if partition is not acceptable, that is, an immigration of twelve thousand a year, dooms us to remain an eternal minority in Palestine, which could solve neither the problem of the Jewish people nor that of suffering Jews. To summarize: A Jewish sovereign state, with all its attributes, will bring us back as a member into the family of nations, raise our prestige in the eyes of the world, will give an immediate answer to the pressing needs of millions of Jews for a haven of refuge and will restore hope and human dignity to our young people. If the area for the third Jewish commonwealth is small, we, as an old people, must consult history. There we find that the first two commonwealths in their beginnings were even much smaller than what is offered to us now. This is an offer which has come to us but once in two thousand years. Let us not reject it; history will do the rest.

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

borers in the same section, causing the serious wounding of one and slight injuries to three others. The one seriously injured succumbed late this afternoon in the Hadassah hospital as a result of a brain concussion. He was Ovadiah Mizrachi, thirty years old, a Kurdish Jew.

The heaviest toll of death centered around an Arab bus in the Romema quarter. As the bus passed through Mahneh Judah quarter, shots were fired at two Jewish girls, one of them 15 years old, wounding both of them. Subsequently a fusillade of shots was directed at the bus.

Three Arabs, including two women, were killed by the gun-fire and four other Arabs were wound-

ed, one of them seriously. Among those wounded was the Arab driver.

A Jewish youth was arrested tonight in connection with the shootings when two Arabs pointed him out. A little while later a bomb was hurled into an Arab cafe near Romema, the explosion injuring six Arabs slightly.

Iron Gate Set Up In Old Jerusalem

Jerusalem (WNS) — Reflecting increased efforts of the authorities to avert attacks on Jews that have occurred in Jerusalem recently, there was installed this week at the entrance of the Jewish quarter in the Old City, a gate, alongside which is a police booth.
