Juvenile Court Commission Divides Work for Study

The Rhode Island Juvenile Court Commission created by the General Assembly at its recent session to prepare a revision of the

laws affecting the State juvenile courts has launched into a thorough study of the child delinquency problem.

The commission of which Joseph H. Hagan, chief of the division of probation and criminal statistics, is chairman, has already had several meetings, and at a session at the Tower Hill House five sub-committees were appointed to study various phases of the juvenile question.


Heading one of the sub-committees is Maurice Stollerman, chairman of the Jewish Orphanage and Reverend Joseph J. Lamb. They will study detention homes and child placement. They are to determine whether the juvenile should be allowed to remain in a police station while the probation officer is conducting an investigation, and whether the juvenile court should have exclusive jurisdiction of cases of delinquency, waywardness, neglect and dependency.

Rabbis Arrange Special Services

Jews Will Usher In Year 5698

Ushering in the Jewish year, 5698, the blowing of the ram's horn in synagogues throughout the world next Monday will call adherents of Judaism to reflection and repentance. Religious services on two days for Orthodox Jews, and on one day for Liberal synagogues, will be held in observance of this New Year holiday, known in Hebrew as Rosh Hashonah.

Since the Hebrew day is reckoned from sunset to sunset, the holiday begins this year on Sunday evening, September 5. Jewish legend declares that the world was created on the first day of Tishri. Thus Rosh Hashonah is referred to in the Orthodox prayer book as "the birthday of the world." The day's background is

Berlin (WNS) — The Jewish owners of the Leiser Shoe Company, one of the biggest in Germany, are having the last laugh on Julius Streicher.

After Streicher had attacked the company and declared "no good German would buy from it," the committee of judges in charge of selecting winners of floats in the 700th anniversary celebration of Berlin, awarded the first prize for the most beautiful float to the Leiser entry.

Organizations Fight Calendar Reform

Geneva (WNS) — Jewish organizations from all parts of the world are re-doubling their efforts to block the proposed reform of the calendar, which would make Saturday come on a different day each week, and thus interfere with the continuity of the Jewish Sabbath.

It is reported that the forthcoming meeting of the League of Nations Council will take the Chilean calendar reform scheme, which provides for a year of 13 months, each of four weeks.

Grossman Tactics Hit By Weizmann


Memo. Suggested Speed In Partition

London (WNS) — Disciplinary action against Meier Grossman, leader of the Jewish State Party, is being considered by Dr. Chaim Weizmann, president of the World Zionist Organization, because of the disclosure by Grossman of the text of an alleged memorandum in which Dr. Weizmann is purported to have recorded a conversation with William G. A. Ormsby-Gore, British Colonial Secretary, in which the latter allegedly agreed to important modifications in the Royal Commission's Palestine partition plan.

Dated July 19th, 12 days after the publication of the Royal Commission report, the document was made public in the Jewish Chronicle which obtained it from Grossman.

The highlights of the memorandum credit the Colonial Secretary as agreeing to speedy liquidation of the proposed temporary British mandates over four cities to be included in the Jewish state, to the inclusion of the new quarter of Jerusalem in the Jewish state, to adjustment of the Commission's

plan to exclude the Rutenberg electric concession and the Dead Sea development from the Jewish state.

It also declares that Ormsby-Gore said the "Admirals were after him" with regard to Haifa and that he regarded as "unthinkable" the plan to set up a joint port between Jaffa and Tel Aviv under British control.

According to the document Weizmann is said to have declared that "the Admiralty could get all

they wanted from us by direct agreement, but not through the government itself. If they tried to collar Haifa, we should make things extremely unpleasant for them in Geneva."

While neither Dr. Weizmann nor Mr. Ormsby-Gore have denied that such a conversation took place, Dr. Weizmann said "I do not know how Mr. Grossman obtained it (the memorandum). He had no business to publish it. There is nothing which needs to be hidden, but it is a report of a private conversation and nobody has any right to disclose it."

Grossman charged the memorandum indicated a scheme of Dr. Weizmann to put over something on the Zionist Congress and demanded that Dr. Weizmann "should be asked to resign in order to show the Jewish people he will never submit to threats and never submit to dismemberment of our historic homeland."

Scientists Hail New Theory of Physicist

New York (WNS)—Professor S. Sambursky, a hitherto obscure Jewish physicist at the Hebrew University in Palestine, is being hailed by the world of science as a second Einstein following the publication in the Physical Review of his new theory proving that the whole universe is shrinking, together with everything in it, including the measurable units of energy.

Scientists who have examined the evidence of the 36-year old German-born physicist believe his theory is as startling as Einstein's theory of relativity.

Dr. Sambursky based his theory on discoveries made with the world's largest telescope at Mount Wilson Observatory in California.

TASHLICH

To cast away the sins and errors of the past year and to determine upon a course of righteousness and justice for the year to come is an immemorial custom of Jewry on Rosh Hashanah.

This is the day for us to remember and repent, and to pray to God to be merciful in His judgement of our acts. While in modern times the ancient Tashlich ceremony of emptying one's pockets into a running stream has fallen into almost general discard among even the Orthodox branch of our faith, the spiritual Tashlich—repentance and moral purification—remains part of the tradition of Judaism.

On this day, therefore, all of us must subject our souls to a searching examination; for more important than repentance of sins of commission is repentance of the motives that caused the sins to be committed and may bring about their repetition in the year now dawning.

Before we can honestly make the traditional resolution to lead a better life in the coming year we must erase from our hearts, the baser qualities that have crept in—selfishness and greed, excessive pride and wilfulness, and any other moral failing that we may discover in ourselves. Without such a moral cleansing no repentance can be truly valid, nor any good resolution really sincere.

The God of Israel is a long-suffering God who grants forgiveness to all who sincerely seek it. But let us be sure, as we ask pardon for whatever sins have been marked against us during the year just past, that, in accordance with the ancient Tashlich ceremony, we have discarded even the smallest crumb of evil, so that the year 5698 will be a year of just and righteous conduct in all things for each and every one of us.

Agudath Israel is Opposed to Partition

Marientbad, Czechoslovakia (WNS)—Holding that only the complete fulfillment of the Palestine Mandate can achieve Arab-Jewish peace, the Congress of the Agudath Israel, ultra-Orthodox body, went on record as unalterably opposed to the proposed partition of the Holy Land and the establishment of a Jewish state.

Empowering its executive to deal with Great Britain for a solution of the Palestine problem which would "answer the spiritual and material needs of the Jewish people," the Agudath declared that the Torah is the basis of Jewish rights in Palestine.

BAN STRICKEN BOOK

Budapest (WNS)—A book of anti-Semitic preachments by Julius Streicher, Germany's number one Jew-baiter, has been banned from circulation in Hungary by action of the Hungarian Government.

**An Open Letter to R. I.
Jewry on the Nazi Boycott**

"At no time in the history of the Jewish people have we faced such a period of persecution and organized race hatred. Almost every front is a battle field for us — fighting to preserve for ourselves elementary human rights. Against some nations, an enlightened public opinion might avail, but against Germany we must employ the only weapon her leaders understand — economic pressure. It is the first time in modern history that a government officially instituted such persecution as the Hitler government started four years ago.

"In as much as the power of this regime depends upon its economic success, we must do our utmost to make this success impossible. There should be a concerted action on the part of every Jew and non-Jew to erect an economic barrier against the Nazi government. With us it is a question of life or death and no self respecting Jew will support a nation whose avowed purpose is to exterminate his people. No Jew, worthy of the name, will lend economic support, even in the most indirect manner to Nazi barbarism. It is therefore the solemn duty of every Jew to pledge himself not to purchase German made products.

"In doing your shopping be especially careful when purchasing chinaware, cutlery, hardware, gloves, surgical instruments and

drugs; and remember that with every purchase of goods manufactured in Germany you are helping Hitler in his fight against our people.

"With hopes that the New Year may usher in an era of peace for all, I am,





This she refused to do unless her husband deposited \$500 in her name.



The paper charged that General Nicolas Rodriguez, head of the Gold Shirts, was under orders from Arthur Dietrich, propaganda attache of the Nazi legation. Acting on instructions from Deitrich, La Prensa asserts, Rodriguez organized an intensive anti-Jewish movement here.

JEWISH SHIP SAILS

Rome (WNS)—The Jewish marine training ship, the S. S. Tel Hai, which has been used to drill Jewish seamen, has sailed for Palestine on a trial trip. The entire crew is Jewish.

**World ORT Union
Adopts 1938 Budget**

**Congress Votes
\$820,000 Budget**

Paris (WNS) — Expansion of agricultural, industrial and artisans vocations among the Jews of the world as a means of furthering the restratification of the Jewish people must go hand in hand with defense of the Jewish economic position against anti-Semitic assaults, Dr. Aaron C. Singalowsky told the closing session of the fourth congress of the World ORT Union.

Warning that even maximum immigration cannot outstrip the natural Jewish population increase, he urged a program for expanding the Jewish labor market to take the pressure off the

overcrowded professions. The congress adopted a budget of \$820,000 for 1938 to intensify ORT activities in agriculture, trade schools and emigration of vocationally trained emigrants.

The founder of German Social Democracy was a Jew, Ferdinand Lassalle.

**Hebraist Exposes
Nazi Talmud Lies**

Says Accusations
Are Distortions

London (WNS)—The "immorality" accusations against the Talmud by Dr. Alfred Rosenberg, Nazi chieftain, are based on nothing but distortions, misquotations, and citations torn from their context, Dr. Herbert Danby, Regius professor of Hebrew at Oxford University, declares in a pamphlet published by the Friends of Europe.

Defending the Talmud against Rosenberg's charges, Professor Danby points out that the passages cited by the Nazi leader were deliberately chosen with a view to discredit and ridicule the Jews by "ferreting out absurdities, fatuities and details offensive to modern fashions of reticence. The quotations are given so as to be misunderstood, being given a false sense, owing to separation from the context, or are wrongly quoted."



"Brother Rat" has no serious message to impart; preaches no sermon; advocates no cause except that of laughter and fun in the college spirit; and so pleasantly is this tale presented that when the play was read to the authorities of Virginia Military Institute they gave to it their unqualified approval — even furnishing the models and the tailors to make the uniforms required and permitting the copying of the barracks and the reproducing of the facade of the principal buildings for use in the scenes of "Brother Rat".

**Moslems Propose
 British Boycott**

Bombay (WNS)—Solution of the Palestine problem is possible only by a direct Arab-Jewish understanding, it was declared here by the Pandit of Jawahat Nehru, influential Moslem leader.

At the same time a Moslem mass meeting here went on record as favoring a boycott of British goods as protest against the proposed partition of Palestine. The meeting urged Moslem leaders to intervene in behalf of the Arabs of Palestine.

**Ohio Law Bans Racial
 Trade Discrimination**

Columbus, O. (WNS)—Jewish leaders in Ohio see a new weapon to combat discrimination against Jews in the amendment to the Ohio civil rights code passed by the State Legislature which forbids discrimination by merchandising establishments against prospective customers because of race or color.

The amendment, which provides fines of \$50 to \$500 or 30 to 90 days in jail or both as punishment for violators, is primarily intended to curb discrimination against Negroes, but it can also be invoked to prevent bias against other races.


