Temples Schedule Special Services; Moes Chitim Aid Needy

One of the most ancient festivals of the Jewish year and one of the three pilgrim feasts which bring worshipers to Jerusalem, began on Friday. The eight-day holiday is today most closely associated with the story of the deliverance of the people of Israel from Egyptian bondage under the leadership of Moses, about 1400 years before the Christian era. The holiday antedates that deliverance, however, for it was the Passover, or Pesach holiday which the Israelites vainly asked leave of Pharaoh to celebrate.

Hitler's recent edict that Austria does not want its Jews has its parallel in the exodus from Egypt thousands of years ago, and will be mourned by Jews the world over at their Passover seders this week-end.

At Temple Beth Israel, Sabbath services were conducted on Friday night. Services will start on Saturday morning at 9 o'clock, with Rabbi Morris Schussheim preach-

ing. Evening services on Saturday night will start at 6:30 o'clock, and Sunday morning services will commence at 9 o'clock.

Service scheduled at Temple Emanuel started on Friday night at 6:30 o'clock. At Saturday morning services, starting at 9 o'clock, Rabbi Israel M. Goldman will preach a sermon. Saturday evening services start at 7 o'clock. A special program of organ music by Cantor Harry Bettman and Arthur Einstein will feature the Sunday morning services at 9 o'clock, and Rabbi Goldman will deliver a sermon. During the closing days of Passover, services will be held as usual with a special Memorial service on the last day of Passover, April 23.

During the past few weeks, the Moes Chitim has solicited Passover collections to supply the neediest of the community with food and clothes for the festival, so that all may be equal for the celebration.

Naming her son Peter Franklin Israel the middle name being in honor of President Roosevelt, Mrs. Israel said "Hitler shall never have

LEGISLATURE PASSES REFUGEE RESOLUTION

Endorse Roosevelt Plan for Refugees

Persecution In Nazi Countries Scored

Members of the General Assembly went on record this week as endorsing the aid to refugees plan put forward by President Roosevelt and Secretary Hull. Introduced in the House by Representative McEntee and in the Senate by Senator Roberts, the resolution was approved in the house by a voice vote and is expected to be approved, similarly, by the Senate.

The resolution expressing the sentiment of the Legislature follows: Whereas, Recent, precipitate, strategic developments in Central Europe resulted in the Nazification of Austria in which there are ten times more Jews than there were in Germany; and

Whereas, The persecution of the Semitic and Catholic minorities in the Nazi controlled countries have augmented the ranks of the homeless until they are becoming wanderers upon the face of the earth; and

Whereas, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt and Secretary of State Cordell Hull have both publicly advocated the break down of the barrier to increased immigration quotas in the face of this emergency; and

Whereas, To Rhode Island in 1636 came Roger Williams, hound-

Franco "Yes Man" Denies Jewish Action

Says No Jewish Problem In Spain

New York—The only reason the Spanish loyalists are protesting about the bombing of Barcelona is that they have lost control of the air, Russell Palmer, publisher and personal friend of Generalissimo Francisco Franco, said this week as he sailed on the Italian liner, Conte de Savoia. "The loyalists bombed plenty of civilians," he said. "I know, because I've been behind the lines."

Mr. Palmer lived in Spain in 1932 and 1933, and returned after the war broke out there. He said he traveled 3,000 miles in rebel Spain, spent several weeks in the front line trenches and has recently written a book about Spain called "They Died Standing."

"I could work up a lot of stories for you about Spain," said Mr. Palmer, "but nobody would print them. The American newspapers have been won over by loyalist propaganda. They won't print the truth. Here's a story for you:—There hasn't been a Jewish problem in Spain since America was discovered. Many of the Spanish people have Jewish blood in them. General Franco has never taken any action against the Jews.

"Yet if American people keep on sending aid to the loyalists they will force him to. If the American people want to avoid a Jewish problem in Spain they should stop helping the loyalists."

Sir Leonard Cohen, London Banker Dies

London—Sir Leonard Lionel Cohen, 79, for many years president of the Jewish Board of Guardians died here this week.

Sir Leonard was knighted in 1930 in recognition of his philanthropic works.

A prominent banker, he was a member of the Committee of the London Stock Exchange from 1896 to 1904.


Sir Leonard's family came to England from Holland 150 years ago and was closely related to the Rothschilds, Montefiores and other leading continental Jewish families.

1,684 Profs. Ousted By Nazis; Half Jews

Chicago—The Nazi regime has dismissed 1,684 professors since it came into power, 896 of them for being Jewish, Catholic or "politically unreliable" and nearly 800 for no known cause, it is declared by Edward Y. Hartshorne of Cambridge, Mass., in a study presented to the University of Chicago as his thesis for the degree of doctor of philosophy.

Among those ousted were five Jewish Nobel Prize winners. Mr. Hartshorne's study reveals that pseudo-scientific courses on race culture

Reveals Threats

Washington. — Eddie Cantor comedian, told a Hadassah meeting here that he had received anti-semitic and Nazi threats against his life and the lives of his wife and children.

Adolf Hitler "has made it his business to exterminate Jewry," Mr. Cantor said.

"My home, my wife and my children have been threatened," he said "These Nazis have called upon my wife and told her "Tell Cantor to get out of Los Angeles before he is carried out in a pine box."

Three Nazis Seized In Spy Ring Hunt

New York—Three more German-born men, two of them members of a uniformed Nazi organization in this country, were in custody in the investigation of the activities of an alleged German spy ring which is said to have sold American naval defense plans and Air Corps codes.

The three men were arraigned before Federal Judge Francis G. Caffey and held in \$1,000 bail each as material witnesses, but it was noted that the complaint submitted to Judge Caffey charged that they were actually engaged in espionage for "a foreign power."

Fourth Man Vanishes

The arraignment as material witnesses was believed to have been decided on after a fourth man, Ewald Rossberg, vanished after being questioned and the authorities received information that at least one of the others was preparing to flee the country.

Warner Bros. to Film Life of Salomon

Hollywood—The long talked of picture depicting the life of Hyam Salomon, Jewish patriot of the American Revolution, was moved a step nearer reality when Warner Brothers studio announced it would start production on the picture. It will be called "My Country First."

It is understood that George Jessel has written the scenario. The picture will tell how Salomon served as an American spy and then loaned his entire fortune of \$800,000 to George Washington to help finance the Continental Army.

Reich Punishes "Race Defilement" Abroad

Berlin—Any Jew who takes an "Aryan" woman abroad for the purpose of "soiling the race" commits a punishable crime, according to a ruling handed down in a Berlin court. The locale of the "crime" is of no consequence in the eyes of the law.

\$10,000 to be Had, but Table Refuses to Respond to Psychic

New York—William Roseman, who helps make automobile brakes in an Ossining factory, went back up the river this week, thoroughly discouraged over the stubborn behavior of a bridge table in an office at 22 W. 48th street.

Mr. Roseman, who has quite a local reputation in Ossining as a psychic who can communicate with the hereafter through tables, came down to Manhattan bent upon winning the \$10,000 award offered by

Buys Opera House With Money Saved from Checkroom Tips

New York—Abraham Ellis sold candy in the Manhattan Opera House when he was 14, and today, having bought the opera house for \$750,000, he is preparing to turn it into a giant convention hall and ballroom to accommodate 5,500 persons.

The money for the purchase—\$250,000 of which was cash—and for renovation comes from the fortune Mr. Ellis built up from the tines and quarters people pay for checking their hats and coats. For Mr. Ellis, with check room concessions

all over town, is known as this city's "hat check king."

Mr. Ellis was born about the time Oscar Hammerstein was building the opera house. There were nine Ellis children and the hat check king recalls they "slept under tables, on top of them or any place we could hang on."

He started his business career selling candy in Webster Hall, and sometimes the Negro checkroom attendants would let him help them. When the war came, Ellis was 17. And when the older hat check boys were called to the colors, Ellis was placed in charge of the checkroom. He soon learned there was money in the tips, so he leased the concession for \$600. Everybody thought he was crazy, but he cleared about \$1,600 a year.

And he's been making money out of checkroom tips ever since.

However, Mr. Ellis said he was planning to get out of the hat check business now. He explained that places all expect big money for the concession, and they go out of business fast, leaving the concessionaire stuck. Asked about the checkroom concession at the Manhattan Opera House, he said: "You don't think I'd rent that out, do you?"

Propaganda Control Bill Before Senate Aimed At Nazi Fascist Agents

Washington—Senatorial action is expected this week on the bill requiring the registration of all agents employed to distribute propaganda in the United States, according to advices received this morning by Samuel Untermyer, president of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League.

The act, to take effect 90 days after passage, requires every agent of a foreign principal to file a registration statement giving his name, address, and the address of his employer. The agent must also submit copies of his contract of the employer.

Failure to file the statement would entail a fine of not more than \$1,000 imprisonment for not more than two years, or both.

The bill is definitely aimed as a control medium of the thousands of Fascist and Nazi agents reported to be active in the United States.

Authoritative information unearthed by The Anti Nazi League and other agencies during the past three months, indicates an approximate propaganda fund of \$30,000,000 spent in this country by the Nazi-Fascist nations each year, and this enrollment of 250,000 active members in pro-Nazi organizations.

British Ort's Head Here for Campaign

New York—About 250 Jews, most of them eminent medical specialists, who were forced to emigrate from Germany as political refugees, already have been placed in this country. Lieutenant Colonel J. M. Levey, acting chairman of the British Ort, said on his arrival on the Normandie. A similar number of prominent German Jews have found homes in England, he said.

Coloney Levey came here to discuss with American leaders of the Ort plans for rehabilitating Jewish refugees here and elsewhere in the world, because the American government appealed to twenty-nine countries to co-operate in efforts to help emigrants from Austria and Germany.

Brings a Message

"There are about 350,000 Jews left in Germany out of 600,000," he said. "There are 200,000 in Austria who have got to come out. The Jews of the world are doing what they can for them. The majority will go to Palestine, which will take care of 2,000,000 Jews in the next twenty years."

Jerusalem—German refugee, 22-year old Mordecai Baier, was shot to death when Arabs ambushed 20 Jewish workers in Mt. Carmel Forest.

Jerusalem—The lives of four Jews and an Arab were added to the toll in current Arab disorders.

Renewed terrorism was climaxed by discovery of the bullet-riddled bodies of two young emigres from Germany in an olive grove in the Washashibi quarter here. They were brothers, Richard and Werner Traube. Both were shot by unknown assailants as they were returning from a job-hunting trip to the Czechoslovak Monastery on the Mt. of Olives.

Rotterdam, Holland—The first synagogue in the world to have a gas and bomb-proof shelter is the Great Synagogue of Rotterdam which is converting its basement into refuge from air raids. Decision to include a bomb-proof cellar was made after the synagogue authorities began alterations. It is the first house of worship in Holland to have a bomb-proof shelter.

Nazis Tighten Ban On Austrian Jews

Bar Them From Law, Markets

Vienna—The Nazi authorities took measures to bar Jews from the law profession and from Vienna's twenty-two public markets.

Hans Frank, Reichsminister of Justice, empowered the Austrian Ministry of Justice to revoke at will the licenses of Jewish lawyers, except those licensed before 1914 and those who are war veterans or sons of veterans. It is estimated that between 800 and 900 attorneys will be eliminated.

Jewish dealers in the public markets today were ordered by the municipal authorities to vacate their premises.

Arrest of three well-known Jews was revealed. They are Sigmund Strauss, electrical engineer and collaborator of the famous scientist, Heinrich Hertz; Felix Salten, author, whose books were confiscated in Vienna bookshops last week, and Chief Rabbi Herzog of Graz.

Jewish M. P. Slaps Tory Who Told Him "To Go Back To ..."

London—Emanuel Shinwell, Laborite member for the Seaham Harbor constituency interrupted the proceeding of the House of Commons by administering a slap in the face to Commander R. T. Bower, Conservative, who had broken into

the Jewish member's questioning of Undersecretary for Foreign Affairs, Richard A. Butler, by telling him to "go back to Poland."

Enraged by the insult, Shinwell rushed across the room and slapped Bower and then left the House after apologizing to the Speaker. After Shinwell's departure, Bower apologized to the House and said he would have apologized to Shinwell, too, if he had stayed.

Shinwell was not born in Poland but in London in 1884. He is one of the key figures in the Labor Party. He was minister of mines in the Labor governments of 1924 and 1930 and also served as financial secretary to the War Office from 1929 to 1930.

Actor's Collapse Not Part of Play

Greenwald Stricken During Performance

Santa Barbara, Cal.: It wasn't part of the plot when Joseph Greenwald, forty-eight, Broadway character actor, collapsed last week as he said: "All my life." Greenwald's collapse was genuine; he had died of a heart attack. Not until members of the cast shouted for the curtains to be drawn did the audience know the truth. The audience was dismissed and tickets were refunded.

Greenwald had one of the leading roles in the play, "Golden Boy." He was the father of Joe Bonaparte, played by Francis Lederer, the Czechoslovakian screen star. Playing opposite Lederer was Betty Furness, also of the movies.

Sam White, movie and stage actor, was on the stage with Greenwald. It was the second scene of the first act. Greenwald got the word "life" out of his mouth, then fell. White shouted for the curtain.


Beth-Israel Bazaar Week After Pesach



This Nazi Business

Fascism and Nazism, they say, are good for business. They stabilize finance, make industry prosperous and build up Government credit.

Uh-huh.

A year ago Austria 7 per cent dollar bonds were selling at 105. Under the threat of Hitler's intervention in Austrian internal affairs, they dropped to 74.

And on the day Hitler actually announced his intention of annexing Austria, including presumably the obligations of the old Government, the Austrian dollar bonds plummeted from 74 to 36½ between transactions.

The financial markets of the world may admire Hitler in some ways. But they don't seem to think him a very good risk.

An American Abroad

One cannot escape a feeling of uneasiness when a leading American is feted by high Nazi officials. The reports of former President Hoover conferring with Der Fuehrer and pictures of him with Goering evoke a feeling of distress.

That feeling, of course, did not for a moment conjure up any doubts with regard to the stalwart Americanism of the former President. Still, it was reassuring to read the speech delivered last week by Mr. Hoover before the Council of Foreign Relations and to note his severe negation of everything smacking of dictatorship, Nazism and Fascism. It was especially gratifying to see Mr. Hoover paying particular attention to the Nazi treatment of Jews. "Its darkest picture," he said speaking of Nazism, "is expressed in the heartbreaking persecution of helpless Jews."

Mr. Hoover's European study and the report rendered on his return should help unify America on its attitude toward Fascism and the persecution of our people by Nazism and its adherents.

Hebrew Typewriter Wins Contest Prize

New York—Thrift House, at 7 E. 57th St., decided to hold a contest to determine which gift to their cause has been unique.

Ilka Chase, Mrs. Richard Rodgers and Miss Anne Goodman, the judges pondered over a baby alligator, an old typewriter with a keyboard in Hebrew characters, a crystal bear, a dishwashing machine, a dagger in sheath, a forty-year-old

corset, a pair of Turkish cocktail mittens with bells (bells not explained), a miniature bale of cotton and a bag of Philippine seeds.

The old Hebrew typewriter got first prize and the alligator second.

U. S. Secures Release Of Frankfurter's Uncle

Washington, D. C.—Dr. Solomon Frankfurter, octogenarian uncle of Prof. Felix Frankfurter of the Harvard Law School, has been released from jail in Vienna as a result of the intervention of the American State Department, according to a cable received here from Vienna. Dr. Frankfurter is an eminent scholar.

The State Department has been asked by the Jewish War Veterans to intercede in behalf of Captain Sigmund von Friedman, president of the Austrian Jewish War Veterans, who is under arrest.

HINT IN RIOT

Warsak — Fifty-two Jews were wounded, two of them seriously, when extreme Nationalists rioted late today in what was described as apparent disappointment over the peaceful settlement of the Polish-Lithuanian crisis.

American Killed In Arab Attack

Jerusalem—A United States citizen and a Canadian were killed when a large band of Arabs attacked a group of laborers traveling in horsedrawn wagons from one settlement to another in the Jezreel Valley.

The victims were Ephraim Titkin, twenty-four, of Detroit, and Eliezer Kongold, twenty-one, of Toronto. Both belonged to the new Zionist youth colony of Ein Hashofet (Fountain of the Judge), named for Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis.

Swastika Insignia Stirs Guardsmen

Denver.—The Forty-fifth Division of the National Guard adopted the swastika as its insignia in 1925 because it was the emblem of Francisco Vasquez Coronado, Spanish conquistador.

But now it's identified in the public mind as Adolf Hitler's Nazi symbol and Adjutant General Alphonse P. Ardourel announced he would ask the War Department to change the insignia.

"Some of our officers are afraid they will be mistaken for Hitler supporters," Ardourel said.

U. S. Again Sifts Bund Activities

Washington— Justice Department officials sifted new evidence today to determine whether the Amerika-Deutscher Volkeshund and its Nazi-saluting membership are adhering strictly to federal laws.

The investigation, the second within six months, was made recently by federal agents. A 1,100 page report prepared in January by J. Edgar Hoover, chief of the G-men, previously had been submitted to Attorney General Cummings. Officials declined to divulge results of the latest investigation.

President to Greet B'nai B'rith Conclave

Washington—It was stated this week by Rep. Celler of New York that President Roosevelt will send a message of greeting to the international convention of the B'nai B'rith to be held in Washington from May 8 to 11.

Celler conferred with the President in the company of Maurice Bisgyer, executive secretary of B'nai B'rith. Celler stated that the Jewish situation abroad was also discussed briefly with the president.

Assails Prelates Who Back Hitler

Dr. Wise Speaks At Peace Meeting

New York—Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, of the Free Synagogue, denounced prelates in this country and abroad who have defended the cause of Hitler or Franco. He spoke to 10,000 persons in Madison Square Garden in a mass meeting organized by the Committee for Peace Through World Co-operation.

Dr. Wise specifically reproved Cardinal Innitzer for advising the Austrian Catholics to vote "yes" in next Sunday's plebiscite, and took issue with Herbert Hoover, who suggested Americans keep out of troubles arising from "Old World ideologies." He asserted that any American who considers the war in Spain and the invasion of Austria wars of Old World ideologies has ceased to be an American.

Denies Knowledge of Anti-Semitic Paper

Washington.—Secretary of State Cordell Hull this week denied knowledge of a State Department investigation reported by "The Philadelphia Inquirer" to have been launched into a Nazi-inspired plan to establish a chain of pro-Nazi, anti-Semitic daily newspapers in the United States.

According to a copyrighted Washington story in "The Inquirer," the initial effort to launch the chain met with failure when 13 of 18 American newspapermen to whom a proposal had been outlined refused to join "any such subversive undertaking."

"Of eighteen newspaper men gathered from all sections of the United States and Canada in the Austrian Legation here, all but five turned deaf ears to the offers that they were to become managing editors of the projected newspaper."

Golden to Forgive If Wife Drops Suit

New York—If his wife, Loretta Dennison Golden, will return to him, Maurice Martin Golden, theatrical producer, will forgive her and his mother-in-law, Mr. Golden's attorney, Eli Johnson, indicated today.

Mr. Golden was to appear in Supreme Court to oppose a suit for separation brought by his wife, a former Follies girl.

Mr. Johnson said that Mr. Golden would forget the times when Mrs. Golden is said to have occupied a room with her mother, while he slept in a guest bedroom.

Mr. Johnson insisted that when and if Mr. Golden chased Mrs. Golden through the lobby of their apartment he did not have violence in mind, but was only trying to patch things up.

Hungary Reaffirms Independent Stand

Budapest—An attack on Nazi Germany for its "armed seizure" of Austria, coupled with vigorous reaffirmation of Hungary's intention to defend its own independence against all aggression, was launched in the Magyar Parliament by the government opposition.

Synagogue Sisterhood To Elect Officers

Mrs. Samuel Farber will present a slate of officers for election at a meeting of the Ahavath Sholom Sisterhood, of Pawtucket, in the vestry of the synagogue on Monday evening. Mrs. Martin Curran will preside.

The meeting will be in the form of a surprise package party.

Installation of officers will take place on May 16. Rabbi Israel M. Goldman will induct the new officers.

Youth Passover Program Arranged

Temple Emanuel has arranged a youth rally for Sunday, April 17, the second day of Passover. A special invitation has been sent to members of the Alumni and the Young People's League to be special guests of the congregation.

Dr. Israel M. Goldman will deliver an address titled "Passover—A Call to Youth." Arthur Einstein and Cantor Harry Bettman will present a program of organ and vocal music.



Song Writers Act To Aid Refugees

Royalties Abroad May Be Used

New York—The Songwriter's Protective Association, a large majority of whose members are also members of the American Society of Composers, Artists, and Publishers, awaited action on their plan to help composers and musicians of Austria and Germany.

The plan, proposed at the annual dinner of the association, calls for the use of about \$100,000 in royalties due the A. S. C. A. P. and now tied up in the Nazi countries.

The money, which cannot be taken out, it is proposed, would be used to aid musicians of all faiths and possibly help these musicians emigrate.

Action on the plan must await a meeting of the A. S. C. A. P. Irving Caesar, head of the association, presented the proposal and said he hoped other cultural groups which have funds tied up in Germany or Austria would adopt the same type of plans for use of those funds.

Vetoes Bill



GOVERNOR LEHMAN

Albany, N. Y.—Expressing his faith in democracy and declaring that the passage of the McNabee bill might open the "flood gates of oppressive legislation in the nation against religious, racial labor and other minority groups," Governor Herbert H. Lehman vetoed the bill which would have barred Communists and other radicals from the civil services and teaching staffs of public schools.

Anti-Nazis Riot Bunds at Rally; Gate-Crashes Take Over Meeting

Philadelphia—Riots featured Bund meetings held here and in Trenton, according to police who were called to preserve order after Nazi and anti-Nazi sympathizers clashed in halls where Wilhelm Kunze, New York Nazi leader attempted to speak.

In Philadelphia, the meeting was continued only after a cordon of police surrounded the hall. About 20 persons were injured in the argument which preceded the meeting.

The only one to gain from the Nazi meeting in Trenton was the landlord of the building in which the meeting was held. He collected ten dollars from the Bund and when the Nazis were ousted bodily from the hall by members of the

American League for Peace and Democracy, he collected another fee from them for their meeting.

When Kunze attempted to speak, members of the audience began booing and hissing.

Nazi Culture Invades Austria; "Have More Babies" New Slogan

Vienna.—Vienna indicated that a reawakening in Austrians of the desire to have children will be one of the first services of Nazia administration.

Vienna long has been called a

dying city because of the excess of deaths over birth, and the new Government today presented statistics to demonstrate a startling shortage of babies in recent months.

It was revealed that in January there were only 960 birth, compared with 2,634 deaths—figures which the newspapers presented with such headlines as "Few Babies, Many Coffins." Eighty-eight persons committed suicide.

Propaganda agencies preparing for the April 10 plebiscite were quick to seize upon the situation as evidence of the incompetence of former Austrian governments.

"Whoever has peeped into the slums of Vienna's suburbs, who has observed the miserable camps under bridges where many made their homes for years, will understand why the blessing of children were denied these citizens," said the Freie Presse.

Toronto—The New Commonwealth, organ of a left wing party, charged today that Adrian Arcand, Canadian Fascist, and his National Social Christian Party, were being financed by Nazi Germany.

The weekly quoted from a letter which it said Arcand had written to an unnamed friend. Referring to Arcand's Fascist newspaper, the New Commonwealth quoted the letter:—"Le patriote, which is very known to Hitler and which is very well appreciated by the Nazi Propaganda Bureau."

The Fascist party was distributed through Canada and the United States, the newspaper said, thousands of copies of an anti-Semitic pamphlet, "The Keys to the Mystery," the newspaper said.

RESOLVED, That this General Assembly of the State of Rhode Is-

land and Providence Plantations now places itself upon record as supporting in every way the statement of President Roosevelt and Secretary Hull that United States immigration bars should be lowered in the face of this existing emergency, praying His Excellency and His Honor, the Secretary of State, to make every effort to expedite the widening of the channels by which the tortured, the persecuted and the hard pressed may find haven in this land of liberty; directing the secretary of state of Rhode Island to transmit to them a duly certified copy of this resolution.
