## Nazi Bund Seeks Members In R. I.

### Wife of Litvinov Reported Detained

#### Confined to Summer Villa

LONDON.—The Daily Express quoted friends of Mrs. Maxim Litvinov, wife of the Russian Foreign Affairs Commissar as alleging that she had been forbidden by secret police to leave the city of Sverdlovsk, in the Ural Mountain area.

Litvinov and his wife have a summer villa at Sverdlovsk and the Daily Express quoted Mrs. Litvinov's friends as saying she had been unable to leave there for six weeks, though able to move freely in the city, where she directs a school teaching English to children.

There were reports, the Daily Express said, that Litvinov had been asked by the government to divorce his wife.

Mrs. Litvinov is British by birth. Her mother, Mrs. Alice Herbert, was quoted as saying:—"The Russian Embassy told me nothing had happened when I telephoned there. I receive letters from my daughter sometimes. She never mentions politics and she never has mentioned divorce. That would be their private concern. I have no reason whatever to believe there is going to be a divorce.

There have been frequent reports for years in London newspapers that Litvinov or his wife, or both, had incurred the displeasure of Russian authorities.

### Open Million-Dollar Jerusalem Post Office

JERUSALEM.—Jerusalem's new \$1,000,000 post office and \$300,000 automatic telephone exchange were inaugurated by Postmaster General George H. Webster in the presence of officials, foreign consuls and prominent Arabs and Jews. High Commissioner Sir Harold Alfred MacMichael made the first telephone call, exchanging congratulations with Mayor Daniel Auster of Jerusalem.

The first cable to be handled was a message of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency reporting an Arab attack in which a Jew was fatally wounded.

### Elect E. Kaufman Chairman In "Big Four" Unity Session

NEW YORK.—Meeting for the first time since the adoption of the Pittsburgh resolution authorizing the creation of an organization to coordinate their activities relating to the safeguarding of equal rights of Jews, representatives of the American Jewish Congress, American Jewish Committee, B'nai B'rith and Jewish Labor Committee convened here and elected Edgar J. Kaufman of Pittsburgh, prime mover in the unity meeting, temporary chairman.

The meeting also discussed an organization plan, appointed various committees and decided to hold a report meeting on August 1. The meeting also sent the following message to Myron C. Taylor, head of the American delegation to the intergovernmental refugee conference at Evian-les-Bains, France:

### Secret German Radio Station Combats Nazi Anti-Semitism

BERLIN.—The German underground "Liberty Station," broadcasting from a secret location within the Reich, has appealed to German workers not to allow themselves "to be misused by participating in the shameful outrages against the Jews, instigated by the Nazi racketeers."

The broadcast said the renewed anti-Jewish drive was intended "to stupefy" the German people and "to cover up their own sins of corruption, war-mongery and baseness" and declared that "to oppose the barbarism of Jew-

### Jersey City Center Locks Out Synagogue

#### Opinion of Hague Cause of Quarrel

JERSEY CITY.—The Congregation Emanu-el was locked out of the Community Center here and was forced to meet at the home of a member.

The Congregation was notified several weeks ago that its privilege of renting quarters in the Center would be canceled, presumably because Rabbi Benjamin Plotkin is an outspoken opponent of Mayor Hague. A committee of prominent Jews was formed in New York to investigate the case. It met in Brooklyn yesterday for what was to have been the final hearing.

Harry Goldowsky, chairman of the executive committee of the Center, asserted that Rabbi Plotkin and Dr. Irving Schuman, president of the congregation, had refused to participate in the hearing because Rabbi Robert Gordis, chairman of the Social Justice Commission of the Rabbinical Assembly of America, was not able to attend. As a result, said Goldowsky, the Center was locked.

### Solicitor Selling Combination Magazine and Membership Into German-American Bund

Evidence that the German-American Bund is extending its activities to Rhode Island was unearthed this week, when a representative of the organization was discovered peddling subscriptions to a "cultural" magazine, which discloses methods of saving America from un-American influences.

A secondary offer was made with a five-year subscription to the magazine. If, at the end of two years, the reader wished to join the German-American Bund he could do so at a reduced initiation fee.

This information was disclosed by a resident of the East Side who, although Jewish, is non-Semitic in appearance. The incident described below in his own words. While he divulged his name to the Herald, he wished to remain unidentified to the public. The story follows:—

### Find Bomb Near Hadassah Hospital

JERUSALEM.—Police discovered a high-explosive time bomb near Hadassah Hospital in the center of Jerusalem, two hours before it was set off.

A large store of explosives, arms and ammunition also was found near the Mosque of Omar in a rapid series of raids.

Troops fired on an Arab crowd attempting to invade the Safad Jewish quarter and wounded three Arabs, one fatally. The incident followed a bomb explosion in the Safad Arab quarter which wounded also three Arabs.

More than 17,000 British soldiers, marines and sailors guarded the most troubled spots in the ten days of bloodshed between Arabs and Jews.

### Wealthy Jews Sell Sudeten Holdings

PRAGUE.—The Petschek family, Jewish industrialists, have sold their mining interests in Sudeten territory, valued at \$20,000,000, to a Czech group headed by Zivnostenska Banka.

The transaction, described as the largest in the history of Czechoslovakia, was interpreted as a step toward forestalling possible difficulties which may arise for Jewish business connections in proposed concessions to Germans living in the Sudeten region.

The Petschek family retained its Prague banking house and chemical and mining holdings outside Sudeten German territory. Members of the family had operated the vast holdings through Czechoslovakia since the death in 1934 of Dr. Otto Petschek, founder of the industrial empire who was known as Czechoslovakia's "Coal King."

### Hebrew Teachers Picket Synagogue

NEW YORK.—The West Side Institutional Synagogue Hebrew School, which has about 250 pupils, was closed and its five teachers picketed the synagogue demanding a minimum salary of \$25 to \$30 a week. The strike was called, they said, after Rabbi

"I didn't say anything until he pulled out pencil and paper and asked me where he could send the magazine. I laughed like hell and then told him a few things. He hurriedly put his papers away and walked into a store on Hope street.

### Dictators Linked to Palestine Outbreaks

LONDON.—The names of Mussolini and Hitler were linked to the present troubles in Palestine in the House of Commons when John McGovern asked Colonial Secretary Malcolm MacDonald whether the Italian or German rulers might not be held responsible for some of the activities now disturbing the Holy Land.

His question was met with a negative reply from MacDonald who said there was no evidence of terrorist inspiration traceable to Hitler or Mussolini. MacDonald also said he had no information on McGovern's question as to whether it was true that a number of revolvers and wire-cutting implements discovered by police had German markings.

### Asserts Fascism Zionism Don't Mix

OMAHA.—Should a Jewish state be established in Palestine, it would raise the question "whether or not I should continue to be a Jew," the Omaha Jewish Press quoted Arthur Hays Sulzberger, publisher of the New York Times, as saying during a one-day visit to Omaha.

According to the Jewish Press, Mr. Sulzberger said "I do not subscribe to the theory that all Jews are brothers. When I was in the army during the war, a German Jew supposedly made as good a target for me as any other alien soldier."

Mr. Sulzberger was also quoted as saying that he believed Mussolini was in his rights when he stated that Italian Jews could not be Zionists as long as Zionism was part of British imperial policy and as long as that policy conflicted with Italian aims and interests.

## Egypt Closes Doors To Jewish Refugees

CAIRO.—The government press condemned "the attempt to create a Jewish problem" in connection with a campaign for an anti-Jewish boycott launched in universities by Senator Abd-el-Meguid.

The Senator interpellated the Government in Parliament regarding Jewish usurers, land speculation and Jewish refugees, who, he said, "are coming to Egypt like locusts, causing unemployment."

The press hailed the announcement of Premier Mohammed Mahmoud Pasha that Egypt is closed to refugees and that only six of them have been admitted in the past three years.

## Jewish Capital Ballooned in Order to Goad Anti-Semites

NEW YORK.—To swell to a staggering total the amount of capital ostensibly still in Jewish hands, the Nazi Government is employing fictions of accountancy in applying the law for registration of Jewish property, according to an analysis this week by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency.

The agency views this practice as propaganda to goad radical anti-Semites of the Nazi Party who already have been complaining that Jews are not emigrating fast enough and that economic "Aryanization" of the country is proceeding at a snail's pace.

### Nazi Definitions

One important joker, according to this analysis, lies in the definition of capital. Ordinarily it is used by German business to denote actual assets in cash or property. In this instance, however, a Jew owning nothing but a small pension for example, is arbitrarily decreed to be possessed of a certain amount of capital based on the size of the pension. Thus, a Jew of seventy-five living in a home for the aged, whose sale income is sixty marks a month (\$24), as a former government employee, is compelled to list himself as owning a fortune of 4,040 marks (\$2,016).

All recipients of pensions must multiply their yearly income by a figure which varies with age. For persons up to twenty-five,

the multiplying unit, based on life expectancy, is seventeen.

For persons of seventy-five, the figure is seven. Thus the aged Jewish pensioner owns a capital of \$2,016 which exists only on the official registration blanks.

### Balloons Property

Observers estimate that this clause alone will swell Jewish-owned "property" by thirty-three per cent, for the provision includes not only Jewish civil servants but also tens of thousands of persons retired from business enterprises on pensions, owners of war loan bonds who received pensions in lieu of interest or principal, and aged persons supported by their children.

Oddly, the provision does not apply to salaries or wages received by Jews. Thus a business executive receiving \$200 a month need not compute it as part of capital, while the mother he may support with sixty marks a month is considered a "capitalist" owning some \$5,000 of assets.

(In Austria, however, a special decree lists salaries also as capital.) Another important joker expected to swell the figures is that which requires business men to value their business as thought they were in "Aryan" hands.

Thus a Jewish storekeeper whose income grows smaller and smaller because of boycott pressure must assess his enterprise at normal market values.

If he should try to sell his business, of course, the bargain-seeking "Aryan" buyer would pay only a minor fraction of this fictitious evaluation.

## Urge Elks to Fight Nazi Activities

ATLANTIC CITY.—Major Charles Spencer Hart, retiring grand exalted ruler of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks urged the half million Elks in the United States to join in a movement to stamp out "foreign propaganda" during his message to the 74th annual convention here last week.

"We must stop Nazi and Fascist propaganda in this country," said Maj. Hart, "and each man can play his part. Do not permit four or five minor political parties to become established. They will split our country wide open if experience of other nations is anything to go by."

### DEPLORES OUTBREAK

LONDON.—Colonial Secretary Malcolm MacDonald praised Palestine Jewry's "admirable restraint throughout difficult times," but voiced regret that it had broken down in some cases recently "thus increasing the difficulties of the situation." He spoke in the House of Commons.

# Nazi Trial Data Being Prepared for U. S.

## Foes of Nazi Bomb Camp With Leaflets on Patriotism

NEW YORK.—A pursuit plane roared out over Long Island, spun down toward the thousands of American Nazis on the grounds of the German-American Settlement League camps at Yaphank and let go with a barrage of red, white and blue leaflets, asking the Hitlerites to follow purely American principles.

Sponsored by the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League, Inc., the flight was the first move taken in North America to rededicate followers of the German Volksbund to the pledges they made when they became citizens of the United States.

Twenty-five thousand leaflets were dumped. The raid had been planned for several weeks. Officials of the League contacted officials of Nassau County, L. I. to ascertain that they were not violating local ordinances. Copies of the leaflets were kept under lock and key in the League's office until a few hours before the flight was to take the air, then were rushed to Floyd Bennett field by motor and loaded directly into the plane.

### IMITATED CHINA

"China gave us the idea three

months ago when they answered Japanese bombardments by dropping leaflets on the Japanese mainland," officials of the League said. "Our League felt that a campaign should be organized to bring the truth directly to members of American Nazi organizations. Many of these people, we know, have no knowledge of the real issues at stake. They are victims of a constant barrage of speeches by Nazi propagandists such as Fritz Kuhn, the Fuehrer of the Bund, of Nazi publications printed in both German and English. Camp life at Yaphank and other Bund camps is a series of ballyhoo stunts, drills and parades, all arranged with a view to convincing the membership that Adolf Hitler is a combination of Midas and Santa Claus.

Court trials and imprisonment of Nazi leaders are a necessary move, inasmuch as they bring the dangers of Nazism home to the American public. However, these actions also create a martyr complex among the members of the Nazi organizations. Nothing is more valuable to a movement than a martyr.

## 600 Jews Exiled From Linz Colony

VIENNA.—The secret police today ordered the entire Jewish colony of 600 to leave Linz, shrine of Austrian Nazism, by the end of September.

The order means exile, since virtually no German community will accept Jews. Unless provision is made for their admission to other lands, the Linz Jews, like those of the Burgenland province, will be shuttled back and forth by border officials, facing imprisonment wherever they go.

## Judge Can't Believe "It Happened Here" Bund Appeals Verdict, Fines

RIVERHEAD, L. I.—Minutes of the trial in which the six incorporators of a Nazi camp at Yaphank were found guilty here of violating the State civil rights law, were being prepared today for submission to the "proper Federal authorities."

This step was ordered by County Judge L. Barron Hill immediately after he passed sentence on the convicted Nazis. The jury which heard the case deliberated less than fifteen minutes before returning its verdict.

Mueller's Contempt Costly  
The German-American Settlement League, which operates the camp, was fined the maximum of \$10,000. Fines of \$500 and jail sentences of one year were imposed on the defendants.

## Would Bar Nazi Uniforms in U. S.

NEW YORK.—Uniforms such as those worn by members of the German-American Bund and the display of such insignia as the swastika would be outlawed in New York City under the terms of a resolution introduced in the city council of Councilman Joseph Sharkey.

The resolution would ban the wearing of uniforms or insignia of foreign nations in the streets of New York unless the wearer is attached to the military of that country.

## Not All Little Hitlers

Interesting items in a Times dispatch from Berlin: "What could be established with considerable certainty was that the mass of workers and bourgeoisie in Berlin were opposed to these anti-Jewish excesses. Radical anti-Semitism is finding a diminishing number of adherents among those classes now."

And this: "The Boersen Zietung admits that competing 'Aryan' shopkeepers had something to do with the excesses."

Not a "Crusade," in other words, but plain and simple gansterism, for the benefit of the top gangsters.

## Business and the Nazi

The press throughout the country is giving considerable attention to the Nazi spy expose and the activities of the Dies committee. But a Federal probe of Nazis in America has already unearthed some much more startling facts.

More ominous even than the wide network of Nazi propaganda is the evidence of the extent which American business interests are bolstering the Hitler regime and the German-American Bund in this country. Many firms have contributed large sums of money to furthering Nazi interests here and many have gone to the extreme of aryanizing their personnel.

This phase of Nazi activity is a duplication of the rise of Fascism and Nazism in Italy and Germany. In both cases, industrialists believed that by aiding the "isms" they would be lining their own pockets in anticipation of huge profits. Later events proved the contrary.

Whatever disclosures the Federal investigators will publish are certain to throw light on the extent American business are involved with the Nazis.

## Turkey Denies Plan To Hire Scientists

ISTANBUL.—It was officially denied that the Turkish government is contemplating engaging 200 Jewish scientists from Austria. The Ministry of Health declared that it had not negotiated with the German authorities. The country must be protected against mass immigration, the statement said, but foreigners attached to Turkish culture will be welcomed regardless of faith.

It was unofficially reported last week that the government of Turkey had negotiated with a scientific group in Austria to al-

low Jewish scientists in that country to enter Turkey in the employ of the Turkish government.

## POLISH THEATRE

WARSAW.—The existence of the Yiddish theatre in Poland, particularly the serious stage, is endangered by the attitude of State and municipal authorities, which has undergone a change in recent months, it was reported to a conference of Yiddish dramatic societies held in Warsaw with delegates from the provinces attending. It was decided to call a Jewish theatre congress in the Fall.

## Dr. Isaac Goldberg, Biographer, is Dead

### Literary Critic and Translator

BOSTON.—Dr. Isaac Goldberg, 50, biographer, music and literary critic and editor, died last Thursday at his home in Brookline. He was the author of biographies of Havelock Ellis, H. L. Menchen, George Gershwin and Gilbert and Sullivan.

Born in Boston, Dr. Goldberg was graduated from Harvard with A. B., M. A., and Ph.D. degrees.

During the World War he was a critic of the Boston Transcript. He also was an authority on Hispano-American literature and the translator of literary works from the Yiddish, Spanish, French, Italian, Portuguese and German.

In 1932 he received a Guggenheim Foundation fellowship to prepare a history of Spanish and Portuguese literature produced in America.

His latest book, which he completed shortly before his death, is "The Wonder of Words," which will be published in August.

## Florence Installs New Fascist Rabbi

ROME.—A rabbi appeared in a synagogue pulpit in full Fascist uniform for the first time in Italian history when Rabbi Kalman Feldman of Poland was formally installed as chief rabbi of Florence. Rabbi Feldman devoted the bulk of his introductory sermon to praising Mussolini and to lauding the heroism of the Italian legions in Ethiopia and Spain.

Attending the services were the governor of Florence, the Secretary of the local Fascist party and the Cardinal Archbishop of the city as well as Jewish dignitaries.

## Italy Denies Curb On Jewish Books

ROME.—Official circles denied reports published abroad that the Government had prohibited the publication of translations of books by foreign Jewish authors and discouraged the displaying of books by Italian Jewish authors in bookshops. These circles reiterated Italy's attitude as expressed by the communique published by Informazione Diplomatica on February 16, which said that the regime was considering no measures against Jews except for Anti-Fascist elements.

## 130,000 Jews Quit Reich in 5 Years

NEW YORK.—Approximately 130,000 Jews quit Germany during the five-year period ended last January 1, it was reported today by Joseph C. Hyman, executive director of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee.

Most of the 130,000 have found permanent homes in other countries, but many others are still in dire need, Hyman said. He added, the committee spent \$2,375,000 to aid the Jewish refugees in the five-year period.

## Nazi Stock Crash Laid to Race Laws

### Jews Liquidate Stock Holdings

BERLIN.—Increased anti-Semitism of the last month and decrees by Germany's economic director, Field Marshal Hermann Wilhelm Goering appeared to have become a double-edged sword—hitting the Jews and resulting in a stock market tumble.

Lethargy on German stock exchanges appeared in July, a result of Goering's decree of April 24 whereby Jews were required to register their property. This was seen as a step toward breaking the "Jewish hegemony of business life."

The so-called "Aryanization process" went into full swing, and, along with the barring of Jewish brokers from exchanges, it induced Jews to realize on their share holdings.

Cash-hungry industry, in an effort further to enlarge its plants, also offered a considerable part of the stock holdings.

## "Probe of Kansas Hitler" is Asked

### Clergy Appeals To Committee

TOPEKA, KANSAS.—Alarmed at the increasing political strength of the Rev. Gerald Winrod, fundamentalist minister and anti-Semite, who is seeking the Republican senatorial nomination in Kansas, a statewide committee of religious and educational leaders here have appealed to the Dies Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities to investigate Winrod's record.

"We appeal to the Dies committee to investigate Winrod, his record, the sources of his lavish expenditures and his Fascist connections," the committee said.

"The swastika must not fly over Kansas." Rev. J. C. Cleveland of the First Congregational Church in Kansas City, Kan., chairman of the committee, said Winrod had forced the Nazi issue upon Kansas and had attacked many Protestant denominations, the Catholics, Free Masons, Jews and the Y. M. C. A.

The committee quoted excerpts from Winrod's magazine, "The Defender Magazine" and asserted that "in fact the pages of his periodicals frequently read like pages from Hitler's 'Mein Kampf'!"


