Dies Investigator Called Anti-Semite

Expect 20,000 War Veterans at 43rd Annual Nat. Convention at Detroit

To Adopt Program For Combatting 'isms'

War Memorial To Be Considered

DETROIT. — Representative Martin Dies, chairman of the Special Congressional Committee Investigating Un-American Activities and Assistant Secretary of War, Louis Johnson, will be the principal speakers at the 43rd Annual National Encampment of the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, to be held at Detroit, Mich., September 2nd to 5th, it was announced yesterday by Samuel J. Leve of Detroit, general chairman of the Convention Committee. Other speakers will be General Frank T. Hines, Administrator of the U. S. Veterans Bureau; Representative Samuel Dickstein of New York; Dr. Abba Hillel Silver of Cleveland, National Chairman of the United Jewish Appeal; and Ernest Stiasny, former vice Commander of the Austrian Jewish War Veterans, the first Jewish ex-serviceman from Austria to reach this country since the Anschluss.

Vienna Suppresses Catholics' Bund

VIENNA. — The Volksbund of Austrian Catholics, a cultural organization, has been suppressed by Nazi authorities, it was disclosed this week.

The only Catholic association of any kind now left in Austria, according to church authorities, is Catholic Action, all others having been suppressed.

Excitement prevailed today among the congregation of the English church here and the foreign colony generally when it became known that the secret police had arrested the church sexton, named Richter, a German citizen of Jewish ancestry. He was taken into custody two weeks ago. No reason was given.

Anti-Zionist Libel Spreads in India

CALCUTTA. — Despite all denials of the shameful libel that the Jews are desecrating Moslem holy places in Palestine, new pamphlets are being spread among the Moslems in India and Afghanistan, accusing the Palestine Jews of violent acts against the Moslem sanctuaries.

The attention of the Government of India has been drawn to those pamphlets and it understood that it is taking steps to counteract the effect of this anti-Zionist propaganda.

WARN REFUGEES

BERNE. — Police chiefs of the various Swiss cantons have decided that more than 1,000 refugees who have crossed the Swiss frontier illegally from German Austria would be allowed to remain for the present.

Report 50% Drop In Infant Mortality

NEW YORK. — A direct link between American child welfare techniques and the dramatic 50 per cent in Jewish infant mortality since modern Zionist immigration began in Palestine was indicated this week in a report made public by Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America. Hadassah, which comprises 70,000 Jewish women from almost every state in the Union, maintains a series of public health institutions in the Jewish National Home through American subsidy.

A million dollar medical center, the first of its kind in the Near East will be opened by Hadassah and the American Jewish Physician's Committee on Mt. Scopus in Jerusalem this year.

Shocken Chain Now Under Aryan Control

BERLIN. — One of Germany's largest chains of retail shops passed into Aryan control when the Jewish-owned Shocken Department Stores Trust was sold to new owners. Salman Shocken, the founder of the chain, now lives in Palestine, where he is chairman of the Hebrew University's executive council.

Two other Shocken firms in Germany—the Shocken Verlag and the Shocken Estate—will continue under their old ownership.

Rob Palestine Bank of \$25,000

JERUSALEM. — A daring bank robbery with all the features of a movie melodrama was carried out at Barclays in Nablus when eight armed bandits held up its employees and escaped with at least \$25,000 in cash. As the bank clerks were preparing to go to lunch, the gang marched in, drew guns and scooped up the cash, making their getaway in a commandeered taxi. As they fled, the bandits opened fire to clear the streets.

Jabotinsky War Talk Called Exaggeration

Speech Aimed At Yishub Unity

JERUSALEM. — Charging that Vladimir Jabotinsky, leader of the Revisionists, is seeking to undermine the unity of the Yishub in the present disturbed situation, authoritative circles here characterized as exaggerated the rumors which Jabotinsky has broadcast throughout the Diaspora regarding an impending civil war in Palestine.

This maneuver, the spokesmen for the Yishub said, is intended to undermine the unity of the organized Yishub in the present crucial hour.

The report, sinisterly circulated, that the Histadruth has declared an internecine struggle was described by these circles as absolutely baseless. They point out that although individual assaults have been made upon Jews during the past week including attacks on two Jewish constables in Tel Aviv, the assailants in all cases were Revisionists.

DEPORT REFUGEES

HELSINGFORS, FINLAND. — Sixty Austrian Jews were deported from Finland because they arrived after the coming into effect of new regulations severely limiting immigration. The refugees had sailed from Stettin, Germany, in a Finnish ship without knowing of the new regulations.

Brandenburg Flight Ends U. S. Isolation

The trans-Atlantic flight of the Nazi plane, Brandenburg definitely ends the era of North America as an isolated continent, officials of the Non-Sectarian Anti-Nazi League pointed out in a message to Postmaster General James A. Farley requesting him to stand firm against granting a mail subsidy to the German Lufthansa air lines.

"If one hundred Brandenburgs had left Berlin secretly, could the United States' air force have stopped them before Boston, New York and Philadelphia were in ruins," the League's message asked. "The alleged aim of the Nazis is to obtain airmail and passenger franchises to Europe. We beg you to stand firm against such a proposal. Air services backed by democratic nations and operated by free men will soon be in the field."

Sullivan's Evidence Protected Fascists

Was Associated With Nazi True

WASHINGTON. — Edward F. Sullivan, chief investigator of the Dies committee, this week was accused of being an anti-Semitic and anti-Catholic agitator as well as a professional labor spy.

Following up the demand two days ago that the committee start its investigation of subversive activities by digging into Sullivan's record, Labor's Nonpartisan League sent a voluminous dossier on Sullivan's extensive Jew and Catholic-baiting operations.

In submitting the league's evidence, E. L. Oliver, executive vice-president charged Sullivan with complaining to Angoff there were "too many Jews working for the labor board"; calling Lucien Koch "a Jewish Communist."

2 Refugee Farms Open in Palestine

NEW YORK. — Two new agricultural settlements for Jews fleeing persecution in Germany, Austria and other countries have been established during the past week in Palestine, it was announced by the United Palestine Appeal.

They are at Kfar Joshua and Acre, both in northern Sharon, Money for their establishment came from funds raised by the United Palestine Appeal, which which is in the midst of a \$4,500,000 campaign to aid refugee settlement.

Phillipines to Admit Jewish Workers

MANILLA, P. I. — Instructions to admit 1,000 Austrian and German Jews to the Philippine Islands have been sent to American High Commissioner Paul V. McNutt by President Roosevelt. The refugees will be selected by the Hilfsverein der Juden in Deutschland and the Hias-Ica-Emigration Association.

Each immigrant must be a skilled worker and in possession of 260 pesos. The Jewish community here has already taken steps to absorb the refugees when they arrive, having asked the government to issue practice licenses to 20 Jewish doctors and 25 physicians' assistants. Grants of land for agricultural immigrants will be asked for the refugees.

Suggest Refugee Camps for Jews

PRAGUE. — The Central Jewish Refugees Committee of Czechoslovakia has submitted to the government a proposal to establish a net work of refugee camps along the Austrian and German frontiers where refugees would be housed at Jewish expense until the Intergovernmental Refugee Aid Committee can make provision for their permanent resettlement. One such camp has already been opened.

Italian Edict Expels Jews

Residents Since 1919
Affected by Decree

Must Leave Land
Within Six Months

ROME. — By a Cabinet decree, an order was given this week that all Jews who have settled in Italy since January 1, 1919, must leave the country within six months.

The decree was applicable even to Jews who have become citizens of Italy, because all citizenships conferred since the above named date have been revoked. The order was made effective in Italy proper, Libya and the Aegean Isles. However, no mention had been made of Italian East Africa.

Issued after a Cabinet meeting, presided over by Mussolini, the decree did not mention the number of Jews who have settled in Italy during the past nineteen years, but it is estimated that the total Jewish population is approximately 44,000. It is believed that about 10,000 Jews will be affected by the order.

The decree stipulated that if Jews affected did not leave the country voluntarily within the provided time, they would be expelled "following the application of penalties fixed by law."

Fear Boxer Killed Self After Losing Love Bout

NEW YORK. — Samuel Sherman, 27, amateur middleweight boxing champion of Canada and owner of a hardware store in Toronto, arrived in Connecticut a week ago with a friend, Ben Sugarman, for a vacation at the Pine Brook Country Club, outside Nichols.

Sherman met a New York girl at the club and fell in love. He and Sugarman came to New York with the girl when her vacation was over.

Then she decided she could not marry him. Sherman disappeared. Police are searching for him, having found a note which would suggest he contemplated killing himself.

The girl, according to Sugarman, was in love with Sherman, but did not wish to leave her family in New York and go to Canada to live.

The three came to New York from Nichols yesterday. The men registered at the Times Square Hotel and in the afternoon Sherman went out with the girl—known to Sugarman as "Jeanette"—in a last attempt to persuade her to marry him.

Last night Sugarman found this note in his room:—

"Dear Ben:—You may think I am a chump but there is nothing left to live for. Tell my mother and father that I just can't help it. I feel like an empty shell—devoid of any feeling. Tell Jeanette I love her more than life. So long, pal. Sam."

Sugarman said Sherman is five feet eight, weighs 165, has black hair, and wore a gray suit, green shirt and white shoes.

Man, 117 Years Old, Still Reads Without Cheaters

JERUSALEM.—Meyer Dickstein

came to the Holy Land about 35 years ago with the intention of spending his declining days in Palestine. It was his life-long wish to be buried in sacred soil.

Today Mr. Dickstein is 117 and still going strong.

He lives in the all-Jewish city of Tel Aviv on the Mediterranean coast with his second wife, who is 90.

When Mr. Dickstein was 82 he left the town of Luck in Russia (now part of Poland) and settled in Jerusalem. At the age of 102 he moved to Tel Aviv.

He spends most of his time studying the Talmud and other sacred books. He reads without glasses and his hearing is unimpaired.

His diet consists of a glass of milk and some rusks in the morning and in the evening, and the ritual wine on Sabbaths and holidays.

Italy's Stocks Slump; Jews Sell Holdings

Admiral Tries To Quit Post

ROME. — Recent Fascist restrictions imposed on Jews in Italy have resulted in repercussions in unexpected quarters.

It was reported reliably that Admiral Aldo Ascoli, commander of the Rhodes naval base, had offered his resignation but that Count Cesare Maria de Vecchi, Governor of Rhodes, had refused to accept it. Admiral Ascoli is Jewish.

Intensification of the racial program was held in brokerage quarters to be responsible for a bearish tendency on the Stock Exchange, which reopened Monday after the usual twenty-day summer holiday. It was asserted that wealthy Jews were selling their holdings.

Stock of the Snia Viscosa Artificial Textile Co. lost 22.50 points as compared to the July 29 quotation of 384. Montecatini Chemical lost 5.75 points, Fiat Motors 17. Terni Steel dropped 47.50 points.

In the Aqueduct groups, in which Jewish investments are considerable, Aqua Maria lost 10 points, Condotta, Serino and Palermo 7 each and Chianciano 3, compared to the July 29 quotations.

"Vigo" Says Italians Are Friends of Jews

NEW YORK. — American Jews are warned to stop their attacks against the Italian race unless they want to intensify anti-Semitism in Italy and create discord between themselves and Americans of Italian origin, in the current issue of the Vigo Review, a monthly.

The magazine says: "The Italians in America are not responsible for the policies of the Rome Government. They have always entertained kind feelings towards their Jewish fellow citizens and expect to remain their friends in the future, so long as their friendship is reciprocated."

BERLIN. — The Nazi government gave the answer this week to a question that has been troubling hundreds of thousands of Germans, Jews and non-Jews alike:—What is a Jewish name?

Since the Interior Ministry decreed that Jews having non-Jewish first names should take the additional name of Israel if male, or Sarah if female, this question has been anxiously debated.

Many Nazis whose fathers christened them with such Biblical names as Joseph or David have been almost as much concerned as the nearly 500,000 Jews who must take additional names by New Year's.

The list of 276 officially selected Jewish names published in today's official gazette set worries the bearers of many such names at rest. Thus, Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goebbels need not worry about his Biblical names.

The gazette listed 185 male and 91 female names whose bearers will not be required by law to take the additional name to identify them as Jews. Included are names of nearly all the major and minor prophets and the kings and judges of Israel and Judah.

Others are Ahasuerus, the wandering Jew of legend; Abner, Baruch, Enoch, Herod, Job and Simson.

Synagogue Ruined by Nazis in Danzig

DANZIG. — Members of the Hitler Youth Movement this week invaded the Jewish Community building here, wrecked the interior of a synagogue and the headquarters of the Zionist youth organization.

The authorities, informed of the raid, have taken no steps to apprehend the marauders.

A Study In Health ... Camp Jori

Orphanage Children Plan Own Activities

To Return Home On Labor Day

"Conservation of children's health is the most precious gift you can make to them and to the nation." ... I repeated the words to myself, and reflected how perfectly, parallel was this quotation on the bronze plaque that hangs in the social hall of Camp Jori, with the fine activities of the Jewish Orphanage of Rhode Island ...

To any stranger, Camp Jori appears to be a regular camp, located on the shores of Narragansett Bay, offering all the exciting features that provide young boys and girls with an enjoyable and healthful summer ... Towards this end has Maurice Stollerman, superintendent of the Orphanage, striven, and now it can be told—the glory is his ...

Day Begins at 7:30

A visit last Friday to the camp provided me with these facts and schedules about a Jori summer ... Rising revelry is blown each morning at 7:30 and 8 o'clock to awaken all the campers from their sleep in the deep ... From the three main cabins they stream into the open and gather around the platform to salute the "red, white and blue." ... Following the allegiance, the boys and girls are divided into three groups for calisthenics classes ...

Outlining the camp's activities, Mr. Stollerman said, "Most camps have a social director, but here one of the older girls acts as director of social events, assisted by an older boy ... They plan during each day for an evening program—and the entire responsibility rests with them." ... On the social program are such activities as ping pong matches, spelling bees, dances, blackberry picnics, hot dog and marshmallow roasts, movies, badminton, tennis, baseball ... Oh, yes, and speaking of baseball ... It seems that during the summer, the married men guests at the Mansion House formed a team and played a game against the Jori outfit ... They played good baseball, these Mansion men, and tried their hardest—but the Jori boys came out leading with a score of 10-3 ...

Girls Knitting Sweaters

The girls of the camp have been knitting sweaters during the past few weeks, and when I saw the work they've done, it was just the impetus I needed to proceed to finish the sweater I started way back in January ...

Noteworthy bits of creation were the four flower pots, made by the boys of large stones ... They selected stones of symmetrical size at the beach and cast them in cement on four flower pots ... These pots now form the four corners of the stone platform that stands in the middle of the camp's grounds ...

Friday was a coolish sort of day, so the boys and girls who had gone bathing were called for rather early in the afternoon ... Mr. Stollerman goes after them in a beach wagon—which was presented to the camp this summer by Archie Joslin, formerly of this

city, and now of New York ... Never dreamed so much humanity could be packed into one car—and without overcrowding ... I think I counted about twenty-one of them, all at one sitting ...

Bungalows Large, Airy

The bungalows of the camp are beautifully large and airy ... An inspection of the kitchen and storeroom proved very interesting ... The cook was busy peeling carrots, and I kept thinking about the lovely hair all the children are going to have—if that saying it true about carrots making one's curl ... In the back of the social hall is a large garden, and basking in all the glory of admiration were some healthy looking tomatoes, cucumbers, beets, raddishes ...

To go back to the educational program of the camp ... Instructions in Hebrew have continued on right through the summer—and many of the classes have been conducted in the open air ... Sabbath services are held each Friday evening and Saturday morning in the social hall, with one of the boys acting as cantor ...

Raise Radishes

And here are a few more observations and impressions of

what goes on there in the camp: ... Mr. S. said that when the first raddish popped its red head up into this wonderful world, it had to be tasted by almost everyone ... Asked what the camp did during the rainy season, Mr. Stollerman replied, "It's always sunshiny here." ... Currently the camp is swinging to that non-sensical but delightful aria, "A Tisket, A Tasket," ... While I was talking to Mr. S. I heard strains of the "Dipsey Doodle," dribbling from someone's saxophone and I had all I could do to keep from truckin' on down ... So you see, these Jori children are just a bunch of modern youngsters enjoying life to the enth degree—and being with them, one finds their happiness very contagious ...

The culmination of the season comes on Labor Day, to be known as Field Day ... A diversified program will be presented, to be followed by a dance ... And then next week the men and women of Jori will return to the city, physically and mentally fit to meet the varied and sundry problems that each new season presents ...

British Peer Seeks German Cooperation

To Meet With Nazi Leaders

BERLIN. — Lord Allen, British peer, who is now in Berlin in connection with private Anglo-German negotiations started by the recent talks between Lord Halifax, British foreign secretary, and Captain Fritz Wiedemann Hitler's personal adjutant, is expected to meet Chancellor Hitler, Field Marshall Goering and Propaganda Minister Goebbels for a discussion of the Jewish problem, according to reports in well-informed foreign circles here.

It is believed that Lord Allen will reiterate to the Nazi leaders Lord Halifax's statement to Captain Wiedemann that Germany can prove her desire for better relations with Great Britain by cooperating in a solution of the refugee problem through permitting the refugees to take a portion of their capital with them.

Il Duce's Scapegoat

With great candour the Gazzetta del Popolo, the Duce's mouthpiece, has finally revealed the reason for the sudden racial and anti-Jewish campaign in Italy. It is attributable apparently to the discovery that the Jews are staunch friends of the British Empire, in fact the Fascists now refer to the Jews constantly as the "Allies of Great Britain."

It is somewhat astounding declaration to make after the conclusion of the Anglo-Italian agreement, that the friends of Great Britain must be treated as the enemies of Italy, but the Fascists do not appear to mind Great Britain knowing what Italy thinks of the value of the Jewish National Home to the British Empire, and what she thinks of the Jewish devotion to British interests, just as she has never missed an opportunity of speaking of the Arabs in terms of open expectation that in an emergency they would prove the allies of the Duce, the self-proclaimed "Protector of Islam."

Farming In Palestine

The vegetable production of the Jewish settlements in 1937 amounted to 15,000 tons. A variety of vegetables were produced, including potatoes, tomatoes, cucumbers, carrots, beets and cabbages. There has been a rapid advance in recent years, while figures for the first two months of the present year show a further advance in Jewish mixed farming production, indicating an increase in egg production of 24 per cent., in vegetable production of 75 per cent., and in dairy production of 7 per cent.

Encouraging as these figures undoubtedly are, it has to be pointed out, none the less, that the Jewish farms are still by no means producing sufficient to supply the needs of the home market. Ninety-three million eggs were imported in 1937 and over 7,000 tons of fresh vegetables. Indeed in 1937, foodstuffs to a value of £1,295,796 were imported into the country. It is clear therefore that even if the demand for foodstuffs remains at its present level, Jewish mixed farming has still a long way to travel before it can satisfy that demand.

Faculty, Students Protest Barbarity

CORK, Ireland. — A signed appeal by the entire faculty of University College, headed by Father Mahoney, protesting against the "cruelty and harshness" with

which Jewish students in Rumania and Poland are treated, has been made public here, and will be handed to the Rumanian and Polish ambassadors the statement declares that the situation does not reflect credit upon Polish and Rumanian cultures.

Coughlin Censured by Catholic Organ

Paper Scores His Jew-Baiting

DETROIT.— Father Coughlin's anti-Jewish writings and utterances, whether stated or implied, are totally out of harmony with the Pope's vigorous position against anti-Semitism, the Michigan Catholic, official organ of the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit, declared in a veiled yet unmistakable rebuke to the Detroit radio priest for his renewed anti-Jewish writings.

In an editorial in its issue of August 11, the paper declares that "totally out of harmony with the Holy Father's leadership are Catholics who indulge in speeches or writings which in fact tend to arouse feeling against the Jews as a race. Even when their remarks are qualified in such a way as to set the discerning on their guard, these writers should, in view of world conditions today, carefully weigh the danger of creating prejudice in the minds of less discriminating readers and of seeing their writings exploited by unscrupulous promoters of anti-Semitism."

The editorial in the Michigan Catholic asserts that "history records a long list of instances in which Catholic Church authorities, especially Popes, vigorously and effectively opposed the persecution of the Jewish people.

In keeping with this tradition, Pope Pius XI has recently denounced the false racial theories enunciated by present dictators.

Hungary's Leading Nazi Parties Merge

BUDAPEST.— Hungary moved a step closer toward Nazism when two of the country's three major Nazi movements formally fused into a single organization. The merger united the Arrow Cross Party of Count Alexander Festetics and the National Will movement of Major Ferenc Szalasy, known as Hungary's Hitler.

Szalasy is now in prison serving a three year sentence for leading an abortive putsch. The fusion was affected in his behalf by Koloman Hubay, his chief lieutenant, who is expected to become the leader of the united party. The third major Nazi movement is the National Front of Ferenc Rainiss.

Racial Rules Affect Teachers in Italy

ROME. — Orders for the dismissal of all Jewish teachers from the Italian public and high schools have been issued by Minister of Education Giuseppe Bottai. The dismissals take effect October 1 with the opening of the new school year. In instructions sent to school principals, Bottai announced that in the future all candidates seeking school jobs must present documentary proof that they are not Jewish. Provision is made for exemption in cases where the applicant or his family possesses "particular national merit."

Hadassah Exhibit Portrays Far East

NEW YORK. — One of the chief exhibitors in the Palestine Pavilion planned at the 1939 World's Fair in New York will be Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America. The organization has a membership of 68,000 persons in forty-five States.

Arieh El Hanani of Jerusalem is the designer of the exhibit, which will feature introduction of modern health methods brought to Palestine from the West.

Britain Gives 825 Children Certificates for Palestine

NEW YORK. —To permit the filling of a special Palestine immigration schedule which expires on September 30, Great Britain has issued 825 certificates for the immediate transfer of Jewish children from Germany, Austria and Poland, it was announced here by Haddassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America.

This information was cabled from the London headquarters of the Youth Aliyah (immigration) movement under whose auspices the children will be sent to Palestine. Hadassah is the sole agency for Youth Aliyah in this country.

Fifty-eight of the certificates will be used to settle orthodox Jewish children in Kfar Noar Dati (village of religious children) established in the Emek Zebulum section of Palestine near Haifa two years ago. These children will receive a two-year training course in agriculture and trade and will be encouraged to continue adherence to orthodox religious practices, Mrs. David B. Greenberg, of Mt. Vernon, N. Y., national Youth Aliyah chairman of Hadassah, said. Hadassah helped erect dwellings for the orthodox group when the village was founded.

The new immigration certificates will also permit the Youth Aliyah movement to rescue a group of Austrian Jewish children from the Burgenland province who were among those set adrift on the Danube River four months ago, Mrs. Greenberg revealed. The children and their elders have just been taken from an old boat which they moored off an island in the Danube and on which they lived for 110 days.

Italian King Emanuel Is Friend of Jews

Unsympathetic to Duce's Program

SALONIKI.—King Victor Emanuel of Italy indicated that he was out of sympathy with Italy's new racist policy when he wrote a letter to Samuel Levi, prominent Greek Jewish publicist.

Published in the Messagero, the biggest Sephardic daily in the Balkans, the King's letter emphasized that he was always a friend of the Jews and that he has not changed his attitude. The letter was regarded as being particularly significant because it was written after the adoption of the racist and anti-Semitic policy in Italy.

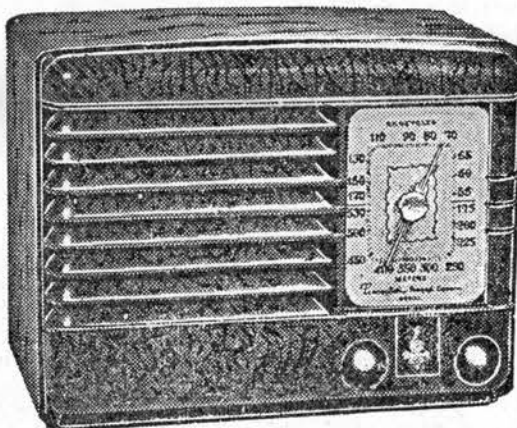

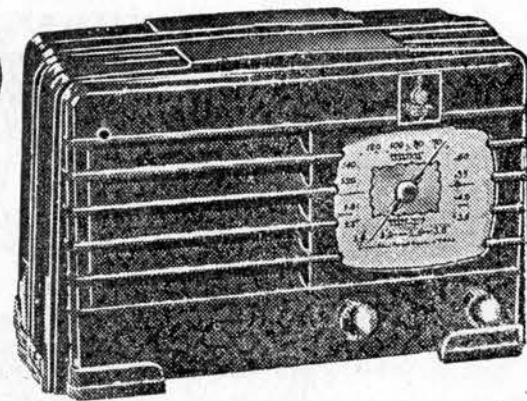

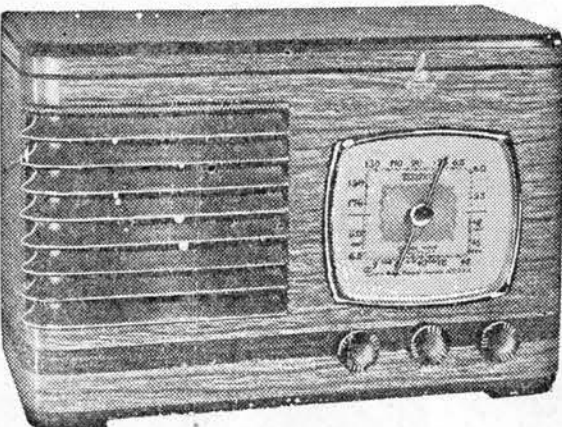

withdrawing from it and affiliating with the Polish National Catholic Church and thereby becoming active in the Ukrainian Nationalist movement.

Advocating "a particularly violent kind of anti-Semitism both privately and publicly," associating himself with True Semitic tracts, and co-operating with Gerald Winrod, the Kansas Fascist, recently defeated for the Republican Senatorial nomination, in conducting an anti-Semitic conference at Ashville, N. C., in 1936.

Circulating "industrial control reports" put out by "the White Knight" and "America First" publications, published by True, in which President Roosevelt was labeled "a traitor controlled by international Jews" and the country was pictured as being ruined by Bernard Baruch, Donald Richberg, Felix Frankfurter, Justice Louis D. Brandeis and other Jews.

Photostatic Copies

Oliver submitted with his charges photostatic copies of newspapers and magazine interviews in which True, Sullivan's former associate, was quoted as saying, "We're not going to drive the Jews out of the country. We're going to bury them right here."

True at one time patented a truncheon which he called "the Kike Killer" and kept samples of it on his desk along with a revolver.

Meanwhile, the Jewish community was startled by the murder of Ernst Blumenfeld, Talmud scholar and hawker of Hebrew books, who was murdered by two peasants in the village of Vaja, Szabolcz district.

Blumenfeld was slain when he mistakenly knocked at the door of a non-Jewish home. The murders have been arrested.

Jewish Boy - Girl Free in Bomb Case

JERUSALEM. — Two Jewish children—Rachel Koka, thirteen, and Israel Mishali, seventeen—were acquitted by a military court of terrorist charges.

The girl was accused of carrying a bomb which killed four Arabs and wounded thirty-six in a bus explosion here August 7. The boy was charged with hurling it.

The court discharged them without calling the defense. The death penalty would not have been applicable to them since they are under eighteen.
