

These statistics, gathered from a half-dozen recent surveys, are astonishing. They present a travel pattern dramatically different from the one we reporters usually draw when we emphasize that our record amounts of income, vacation and leisure time are pushing vacation travel in 1964 to the highest peaks in history.

Money, the surveys show, is not the key problem. One study found that one-third of American adults claim to have no desire to take any trip of any type. Another, which people were asked how.

adults claim to have no desire to take any trip of any type. Another, in which people were asked how they would spend an outright gift of \$5,000, came up with the finding that only 12 per cent of us would spend it on travel.

What, then, is the problem? On Sept. 13 the National Assn. of Travel Organizations (N,A,T,O,)—the domestic industry's major trade organization—will convene a three-day meeting in New York

the domestic industry's major trade organization--will convene a three-day meeting in New York City to consider the question and to develop ways to spur more Americans into traveling more. It's a story going far beyond the profits of the comparatively low-profit travel industry, of course. In fact, boosting travel within the U.S. has not become part of the "war on poverty" program as well as a vital part of our relentless drive to maintain the integrity and reputation of the U.S. dollar. To be specific:

The travel and tourism industry is the nation's largest single employer of the unskilled worker. As Charles Gillett, N.A.T.O. president, says, "The quickest way to find jobs for the unskilled and unemployed is to put them to work in this industry."

The "tourist gap"--the differ-

unemployed is to put them to work in this industry."

The "tourist gap"—the difference between what we Americans spend for travel abroad and what foreigners spend for travel in the U.S.—will be the worst in history this year, will be a crucial factor in the continuing deficit in our balance of payments. It's impure balance of payments. It's impure halance of payments. factor in the continuing deficit in our balance of payments. It's im-perative that we control this gap by encouraging more foreigners to travel here and by encouraging more enthusiasm among Ameri-cans who travel for seeing our

cans who travel for seeing our own country first.

Each dollar you spend on travel "multiplies" into as much as \$3 as it flows through the economic stream, according to some experts. For instance, when you spend an extra \$1 at the gas

station, the station's owner has an extra \$1 to spend at the food store, the store's owner in turn has an extra \$1 to spend at the barber's, etc., etc. Nearly half the states in this country count tourism among their top three industries, and the prime source of revenue for many states is travel.

Efforts to hike travel and tourism are being sharply stepped up.

Efforts to hike travel and tour-ism are being sharply stepped up. President Johnson has gone on record in support of a massive "See the U.S.A." drive and a nationally-known man is to be named as chairman of the cam-paign. The program's ambitious goal is a hefty 40 per cent in-crease in domestic travel in the next couple of years.

crease in domestic travel in the next couple of years.

The drastic slashes in international air fares and the development of low-cost air package trips are spurring foreigners to travel within our borders. Simultaneously, both the airlines and railroads are launching unique educational - advertising campaigns aimed directly at the domestic non-traveler. Tours are being tailored to the individual interests and budgets of U.S. families as never before.

The challenge to all segments of the travel-tourism industry is implicit in the startling statistics

implicit in the startling statistics on how many of you are vaca-tion stay-at-homes and no-go's.

Going to Israel is not a Status Symbol. Not yet, at least. You would not find people at their clubs, or at cocktail parties, or at bridge games, or playing golf, discuss their planned trip to Is-rael.

rael.
They would discuss their latest cruises, or their trip to the Iberian Peninsula, or any other place
where "people" are in the habit
of going just at that particular
season. But you will hardly hear
them discuss a trip to Israel. In
fact I know many who went almost
to the brink of Israel but had the
"courage" to bypass it, for
reasons mown only to them. "courage" to bypass it, for reasons known only to them.

Israel is not fashionable. Unless you are a member of one of the various Zionist organizations, or you have relatives there, or you are a simple Jew who is curious to see with his own eyes what he has heard speakers tell him, or what he has read in the newspapers; unless you are in one of those categories, you do not go to Israel.

And there are a goodly number of us in these categories. Large Israel is not fashionable

And there are a goodly number of us in these categories. Large enough to make a difference in the economy of the country. Large enough to make tourism the second industry in the country.

Oh, yes. People come to Israel for comfort of the soul. That may sound old fashioned and out of style. But there are many, many people for whom the comfort of the soul is still of great relevance.

So they come to Israel to seek that comfort.
You read in the newspapers daily of conventions and congresses and scholarly get-togethers and even of scientific consultations

sultations.

For Israel, small as it is, has become a fountain of scientific knowledge and many come to drink from the source. They talk in whispers of the scientific discoveries made in Rehovot, the seat of the Weitzman Institute, to which scientists from the four corners of the earth stream in groups of two or three, to be shown and to be instructed.

And then there is music. Israel has become one of the most important musical centers in the

important musical centers in the Middle East. The Arab countries almost do not count. Cyprus is

torn by civil wars. The Arab torn by civil wars. The Arab countries: They have a phobla for everything that reminds them of Israel. How can you talk of music and make sure that no Jews are involved? So they boycott every play, every concert, every dance, every cultural ef-fort, and even movies that have a Jew in them.

But Israel listens to musical works before they are heard by the ears of any other nation.

the ears of any other nation.

During our stay in Israel there came to the land one of the great lights in music and presented his work for the first time. Apparently he thought that Israeli listeners are appreciative and sensitive. Igor Stravinsky brought his work on "Abraham and Isaac" to Israel for the world premiere. It is a work for orchestra and chorus, and is, as Stravinsky calls it, a Religious Ballad. The work was presented in Caesarea Amphitheater, an open air area for was presented in Caesarea Amphatheater, an open air area for concerts built by the Romans, at the shores of the sea. Of Caesarea it is my plan to write in a separate column. But let us go back to the concert by Stravinsky in the open air amphitheater by the Mediterranean Sea.

In the printed programs dis-

In the printed programs dis-tributed on the night of the con-

cert, Professor Yadin wrote the

cert, Professor Yadin wrote the following:

"If someone would have prophesied, before the rise of the Republic (of Israel), that a day will come when Stravinsky will conduct - in the presence of the President of the State of Israel - the world premiers of his work conduct - In the presence of the conduct - In the presence of the world premiere of his work 'Abraham and Isaac,' in the theater of ancient Caesarea, his words would have sounded legendary. By the will of the people this legend also became a reality. Happy are they who sense this miracle." Everything in Israel is a miracle. Only in that light is Israel to be judged. Only then can you forgive her the shortcomings and the discomforts and the total disregard for what we call essential. You do not ask for such things in the presence of a miracle. Let me further quote what Stravinsky himself had to say when he came in the heat of the summer, at his advanced age, to conduct

at his advanced age, to condu the Israel Philharmonic Or chrstra.

chrstra.

"Everyone knows that Israel is one of the most democratic countries in the world, but very few, unfortunately, know of the aristocracy of the people of Israel. I am very happy to dedicate my religious ballad (Abraham and Isaac) to this aristocratic people whom I highly regard and love."

I must add that not only did I must add that not only use Stravinsky come to conduct his work himself, but also refused any fees, and gave it all to the 'people of Israel, with love."



Shragai told the Cabinet that, before embarking, every immigrant is given full and precise details about allocated housing, including the areas and prevailing conditions, and is asked to sign an agreement accepting the conditions.

While most of the immigrants

while most of the immigrants disembarked earlier, Shragai said that a number of them refused to leave the ship. The Agency arranged for the ship to remain in port until after the Sabbath, and renewed efforts to persuade the immigrants to leave the ship the following night. When the new-comers again refused, police were called in to forcibly remove the newcomers from the vessel.

In his report, Shragai noted that it was usually relatives in Israel who instigate the newcomers to object. He said the Agency is considering means of avoiding such incidents in the future.

One Cabinet Minister, who recently traveled aboard an immigrant ship, praised the devotion and patience of Jewish Agency emissaries accompanying the newcomers.

Boycott of Israel Tightened By Arab League

LONDON -- Irked by the fact that the six-member European Common Market signed an agreement with Israel this summer, giving Israel certain concessions in regard to exports to those countries, the Arab League Economic Council has decided to tighten its anti-Israel boycott to try to keep Israeli products from "infiltrating" into Europe, Cairo dispatches received here reported last week.

The League's Economic Coun-cil, backed by the Arab Boycott Office, has been holding sessions in Cairo to try to work out meth-ods for frustrating the Israel-Eur-

ods for frustrating the Israel-Euromart agreement. A communique issued at the conclusion of the council's session stated that "a positive plan" barring Israeli goods from Arab countries has been worked out.

The six Euromart countries are France, West Germany, Italy, Holland, Belgium and Luxembourg. Another dispatch, from the Boycott Office headquarters at Beirut, announced that Sophia Loren, the film star, has been put on the blacklist. The announcement stated that all of her films will be banned Junless she withdraws from the cast of a new film, Judith, now being filmed in Israel.





The declaration stated flatly that the Chamber has, "since 1951 been adamant in being opposed to any form of recognition of the Arab boycott and has always refused to sign any certificate which included any form of discrimination."

The joint statement noted further that the Chamber's official journal this year reaffirmed "support of resolutions deploring the intervention of political questions into the field of international trade by countries having recourse to commercial boycotts based on racial and religious criteria."

racial and religious criteria."

"The president of the Chamber," the joint statement continued,
"Is selected irrespective of his ethnic origin or creed. It is the normal practice for confidential approaches to be made to distinguished persons to allow their names to go forward,
"Occasionally, names are withdrawn. It is regretted that, in connection with a recent approach and withdrawal, a public misunderstanding has arisen which is jointly deplored."





Hebrew Actors Union Plan \$500,000 Campaign To Build Performing Arts Center

NEW YORK -- The Hebrew Actors Union is planning to erect a performing arts center here next year. This was reported this week by Seymour Rexsite, president of the union. He said the center would contain a theater for the presentation of Ydddish classics, a museum for stage memorabilia and two schools, one for acting and one for musical composition. A campaign to raise \$500,000 will soon get under way, he said.

Study Of Jewish **Voting Patterns**

The consistent liberalism of American Jews has been noted time and again by scholars and politi-cians. Jews tend to be equally liberal on political, economic and social matters, whereas workers, for example, tend to be liberal only on economic issues, the educated on political subjects like freedom of speech but not on economic questions, and Negroes on civil rights but not on foreign affairs.

on civil affairs. Most Jewish affairs.

Most Jewish voters in the United States regard themselves as political independents. But in practice Jews during the last forty years or so have tended to vote Democratic rather than Republican. This voting behavior has appeared aberrant, particularly in the last two decades, because other americans in the same scale account. Americans in the same socio-eco

Americans in the same socio-economic position have voted mostly Republican.

American Jews today are predominantly native. Their incomes are mostly in the middle and upper-middle range; many have college degrees and are self-employed businessmen, proprietors, professionals or managers. More and more of them live within city limits. In occupation and income, they mostly resemble Presbyterians and Episcopalians, upper status Protestant denominations. Similarly situated Protes-

come, they mostly resemble Presbyterians and Episcopalians, upper status Protestant denominations. Similarly situated Protestant and Catholics vote Republican in considerable numbers, and by all rules, Jewish support of the Democratic party should have declined and withered away. True, during their upward socio-economic passage Jews have trimmed their vote on the Democratic line—witness Great Neck in Long Island and Highland Park outside Chicago. But what is striking is not that Jews in Great Neck vote only 60 per cent Democratic; it is that they vote only 40 per cent Republican.

This display of party loyalty seems to contradict the popular notion that Jews will vote for a Jewish candidate regardless of party—or Catholics for a Catholic, Italians for an Italian, Negroes for a Negro, and so forth. Actually, this kind of voting reflects the striving of the group for status in society and its need for political recognition. Nearly every ethnic, religious and social group in America, in its drive for power and prestige in the community, has sought public office for its members as tangible evidence of its place in the political body. The more the group needs such recognition, the more likely are its members to vote for "one of their own"— a circumstance to which politicians have traditionally removed with "balacead" tickets. members to vote for "one of their own"— a circumstance to which politicians have traditionally re-sponded with "balanced" tickets. Such political contests among groups, for prestige and some-times for control of the political machine, occur most frequently in nachine, occur most requently in local politics, though occasionally they erupt also on a national scale, the notable examples being the presidential elections of 1928 and 1960.

Another example was the may oralty election of 1945, when Jeworalty election of 1945, when Jew-ish voters overwhelmingly backed William O'Dwyer, an Irish Cathwilliam O'Dwyer, an Irish Cath-olic Democrat, against his Repub-lican opponent, Jonah J. Goldstein. This has been a recurrent pattern in New York City since 1903. The untypical character of Jew-ish voting has been the subject of considerable analysis and specula-tion among politicians and students

considerable analysis and specula-tion among politicians and students of politics. In 1948 a study of voting among eight religious groups (Baptists, Lutherans, Methodists, Episcopalians, Presby-terians, Congregationalists, Ro-man Catholics and Jews) showed man Catholics and Jews) showed that on politico-economic questions, groups low in class and status were liberal and groups high in class and status, conservative. But the Jews were an exception: though high in class, they nevertheless remained politically liberal. In spite of their economic interests, their feelings as Jews seemed to have determined the way they voted. The authors speculated that Jews felt insecure because they were not fully accepted by high-class ingroups and that this insecurity forced them to identify with outgroups, that is, low-class groups.

low-class groups.

A more elaborate interpretation along these lines was based

on the political experience of a Philadelphia Jewish banker who had made his fortune in real eshad made his fortune in real estate. Early in his career he associated himself with the Republican party and at the 1928 Republican National Convention seconded the nomination of Herbert Hoover. Shortly thereafter, in the crash of 1929, the bankers of Philadelphia — Republicans all — banded together to meet the crisis, but falled to include the Jewish banker and even denied him help. After that he turned to the Democratic party.

A more ideological interpre-tation of the Jews' political posi-tion is that "Jewish liberalism" took shape when Franklin D. Roo-sevelt began to formulate the New Deal. In the light of their Euro-pean experience, this theory, holds pean experience, this theory holds, Jews saw in the New Deal a lib-

eralism which they construed as the political opposite of the right, whose extreme was fascism.



Democratic Plank Pledges Israel Support

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J., -- The 1964 Democratic Platform Committee last week drafted and submitted to the national convention, foreign affairs planks pledging strong support of Israel and deploring Soviet persecution of Jews.

The final platform draft, submitted to the convention after consideration by the full Platform Committee, pledged to "work for the attainment of peace in the Near East as an urgent goal, using our best efforts to prevent a military unbalance, to encourage arms reductions and the use of national resources for internal development, and to encourage the arms reductions and the use of national resources for internal development, and to encourage the resettlement of Arab refugees in lands where there is room and opportunity. The problems of political adjustment between Israel and the Arab countries can and must be peacefully resolved and the territorial integrity of every nation respected."

The platform also pledged to encourage by all peaceful means the growing independence of the captive peoples living under Communism and hasten the day when captive nations will achieve full freedom and self determination. The platform said specifically that "we deplore Communist oppression of Jews and other minorities."

The determination of the United States to aid Israel through nuclear desalination was outlined in another portion of the platform submitted to the convention.

A supplement to the platform, entitled "An Accounting of Stewardship," was also approved unanimously. In it the party's accomplishments were reviewed. The supplement said that the 1960 Democratic plank pledged pursuit of Arab-Israel peace by preventing

supplement said that the 1960 Demicratic plank pledged pursuit of Arab-Israel peace by preventing an arms imbalance, and that this policy brought the Arab States and Israel "closer to peace and stability than at any time since World War II."

The Platform Committee poted:

and Israel "closer to peace and stability than at any time since World War II."

The Platform Committee noted: "In 1960, we urged continued economic assistance to Israel and the Arab peoples to help them raise their living standards. We pledged our best efforts for peace in the Middle East by seeking to prevent an arms race while guarding against the dangers of a military imbalance resulting from Soviet Arms shipments."

"In the period since that pledge was made," said the new 1964 platform draft, "the Near East has come closer to peace and stability than at any time since World War II." The draft added: "Economic and technical assistance to Israel and Arab nations continues at a high level, although with more and more emphasis on loans as against grants. The United States is determined to help bring the revolution in the technology of desalination to the aid of the desert regions."

Action on immigration reform was requested in another portion of the draft. The platform said: "In 1960, we proposed to "adjust our immigration, nationality and refugee policies to eliminate discrimination and to enable members

of scattered families abroad to be united with relatives already in our midst. The national origina-quota system of limiting immigra-tion contradicts the founding principles of this nation. It is inconsistent with our belief in the rights of man'."

(charity), love of learning and rejection of asceticism are thought to have molded the political outlook of Jews, as has their constant sense of identification with persecuted minorities.

Undoubtedly all these factors have played larger or smaller roles in making Jews politically liberal. Their European heritage and their political experiences in the pursuit of emancipation may have been the most significant. With the French Revolution, when the attainment of political equality With the French Revolution, when the attainment of political equality became the goal of enlightened Jews, support of Jewish enfranchisement became part of the program of non-Jewish liberals and revolutionaries throughout Western Europe. As Jews gradually won their political rights in Western countries, they found that the liberals and radicals who sought to change society were their allies, whereas the conservatives and reactionaries who wanted to keep the system of caste and privilege — the noblity, the landed gentry, the established churches — were their enemies.

Jews had learned in Western

churches — were their enemies.

Jews had learned in Western Europe that the political right was at best conservative, avowedly Christian, and committed to the preservation of ancient privileges; it could, and often did, become reactionary and anti-Semitic. The left was either moderate—favorable to change in the established order, opposed to anti-Semitism and often neutral in matters of religion — or revolutionary, anti-

ble to change in the established order, opposed to anti-Semitism and often neutral in matters of religion — or revolutionary, anticlerical, and committed to the overthrow of the social and economic system that had brought little besides poverty and persecution to Jews.

Jews supported the left, not primarily because they were exploited as workers or oppressed like peasants, but because they were a persecuted minority. This political outlook was characteristically East European. The German Jewish immigrants of the previous generation had had a somewhat different political experience. They had come to America during the reaction that followed the 1848 revolution. In Germany the struggle for emancipation had seemed possible within the framework of the existing society, and Jews by and large had felt committed to that society, provided it made room for them. In the revolution Jewish leaders had fought for the individual rights of Jews as German citizens differing from their neighbors only in religion—a matter which they felt ought to make no difference to their civic status. This opinion was shared by many of the German liberals who played leading roles in the 1848 revolution.

Disappointed by the reaction after 1848, German jews migrated to America together with other German pattern of settlement in the Middle West and the West. Active participants in the German immigrant community, they often shared the political outlook of their Christian compatriots. The lib-

migrant community, they often shared the political outlook of their Christian compatriots. The lib-eralism of Lincoln's Republican party attracted them, though comparty attracted them, though com-paratively few Jews were passion-ate abolitionists. Admiration for Lincoln was what enabled many Jews to remain Republican and vote for General Grant in 1868, despite well-founded charges of anti-Sem-itism against him. In time, the German Jewish immigrants flourished; many who had started as peddlers became

immigrants flourished; many who had started as peddlers became prosperous businessmen and some even merchant princes. They remained almost uniformly loyal to the party because of its business outlook and its conservative fiscal and tariff policies. There was, in fact, hardly any other choice for the politically liberal middle-class voter in the second half of the nineteenth century. The Democratic party, at that time, could not have appealed to him; even when not actually split, as it often was, it was riddled with factions—torn between economic radicalism and between economic radicalism and conservatism, pulled apart by re-gional differences among the agrarian populists in the Midwes and West, the agricultural con-

To the East European immigrants, streaming into the squalid ghettos of the industrial cities, the Democratic party looked quite different. They viewed it from their position among the poorest, most sweated, exploited and submerged proletariat of the rapidly expandsweated, exploited and submerged proletariat of the rapidly expanding industrial system. True, the competition between Democrats and Republicans did not fit their old-country concept of a left-vs.-right polarity. That ideological outlook found expression instead in radical parties, largely transplantations from Europe, which occasionally attracted a significant proportion of the Jewish immigrants' vote. But the Democratic party performed a vital function for the immigrant; however corrupt and greedy, it was often the chief mediator between him and the larger society. The ward heeler and the local boss could help in misunderstandings or disputes with the policie the local day. misunderstandings or disputes with the police, the landlord, the "authorities." All the party wanted in return was a vote, and immigrant Jews were among those who provided the votes.

provided the votes.

If Jews tended to vote mostly Democratic in those early days, it was not merely out of mistaken loyalty to the local machine. The Democrats were also the prominigration party, and immigration was a subject of considerable interest to Jews. In the last decades of the century, the Republican party was essentially nativist, favoring restrictions on the admission of allens. Later, when even the Democrats could no longer resist restrictionist pressure, the

the Democrats could no longer re-sist restrictionist pressure, the Republicans clamored still more loudly for closing America's gates. There were exceptions to this voting pattern, however. If a Re-publican candidate was clearly pro-Jewish or responsive to some Jewish need, the immigrants gave him their votes. For example, lews Jewish need, the immigrants gave him their votes. For example, Jews supported Theodore Roosevelt in 1904, no doubt because in 1902 his Secretary of State, John Hay, had issued a strong note to Rumania condemning mistreatment of Rumanian Jews, and the following year both Hay and Roosevelt himself had denounced the Kishinev pogram.

The third parties—Socialist,
Socialist-Labor and Progressive—
attracted substantial numbers
(though never a majority) of Jewish voters when the major-party choice was between an agrarian populist Democrat and a conservapopulist Democrat and a conserva-tive Republican, a choice without

meaning for the Jewish industrial proletariat, whose estimate of so-cial justice was based on how Jews and urban workers were treated.

The ideological, as against the pragmatic, attractions of the Dempragmatic, attractions of the Democratic party for Jewish voters all, over the nation emerged with Alfred E. Smith's candidacy in 1928. Usually this attraction is thought to have been created by Franklin D. Roosevelt, first with the New Deal and later with anti-Nazism. But in actual fact Roosevelt seems to have reinforced an attachment which had been in the making throughout Smith's four terms as Governor of New York (1919-20, 1923-28).

Smith had been called the first

Smith had been called the first Democratic candidate to speak on behalf of the workers in an industrial society. When Smith was Governor of New York, more than half of America's Jews lived in New York. Mostly factory workers and small businessmen, they were increasingly drawn to the Democratic party by its growing concern with the social and economic evils of industrial society. In Al Smith they saw not merely the practical social legislator but also the social conscience, the spokesman for the underprivileged and the downtrodden. He fitted into the European concept of the liberal leader who seeks to change the status quo peacefully in ways liberal leader who seeks to change the status quo peacefully in ways that will help the Jews. Moreover, though he was not of their religion and ethnic background, the Jews of New York looked upon Smith as a symbol of embattled minorities, including their own—a symbol with which they could identify.

(Continued from Preceding Page) nation, Smith's attractiveness to urban industrial workers and to religious, ethnic and racial minorities, was unmistakable.

The campaign of 1928 succeeded in tying the Jewish voters even more closely to Smith than might have been foreseen. The vicious anti-Catholic propaganda deeply reinforced Jewish loyalty to Smith in a way that class interest could not have done. not have done.

not have done.

In all large cities, Jews voted overwhelmingly for Smith. Because Smith spoke unmistakably for the industrial worker in the big city (he broke the Republican hold on the Northern cities, carrying 122 previously. Resublican hold on the Northern cities, carry-ing 122 previously Republican counties), and because Jews were largely industrial workers, their support of the Democratic ticket was generally assumed to be based essentially on class interest. Actu-ally, with this election the modern liberal voting tradition among liberal voting tradition among American Jews emerged, in which the class point of view was sub-ordinated to a large political out-

look.

There is no precise way of knowing how much a voter's perception of his situation as a Jew affects his political behavior. It is doubtful whether most Jews consciously think of themselves as Jews when they act politically. Perhaps only the most ethnocentric do so. Most Jewish voters who support a liberal party or candidate probably justify their position intellectually by explaining that a liberal program extends more benefits to more than a conservative program, and is more likely to lead a good society where it is individual merit rather than famprogram, and is more likely to lead a good society where it is individual merit rather than family, race or religion that counts. But who can say to what extent these voters explicitly calculate that such a society is inevitably good for Jews, or that in such a society Jews will not be scapegoats? Studies of political behavior are not yet refined enough to tell us how much and in what way submerged or subconscious insecurities affect rational political decisions and color political motivations. In any event, this widevations. In any event, this wide-spread feeling about the good so-ciety which we have come to iden-tify as Jewish liberalism first began to express itself in the support for Al Smith in 1928. With Roosevelt's accession and

his New Deal program, American politics took on a character which Jews had no difficulty in recognizing as distinctly European. The New Deal reforms made theimage ing as distinctly European. The New Deal reforms made the Image of the Democratic party created by Smith appear ideologically even more appealing. Left and right were now clearly discernible. In addition, Jews were particularly susceptible to Roosevelt's charisma—witness Republican Judge Jonah J. Goldstein's pun: "The Jews have three velten (worlds): di velt, yene velt (this world, the next world) and Roosevelt."

In 1940, when fears of intervention in Europe's war stirred isolationism and opposition to Roosevelt, Jewish voters became even more firmly rooted in the Democratic party. On the eve of the election, one report to Roosevelt stated that in New York only the Jews were solidly for him. By 1944, when America was deeply involved in the war, political alignments were shifting decisively and

1944, when America was deeply involved in the war, political alignments were shifting decisively and the Roosevelt coalition began to break up; but the Jews stood firm. They remained Democratic even in 1948, except for a modest defection to Henry A. Wallace, the Progressive candidate.

paralleled the pattern of voting in
industrial urban areas where
working-class immigrants and
their children have predominated.
But in the 1930's the occupational composition of American Jews began to undergo substantial changes. The second generation, better educated than their immigrant parents, were then taking on white-collar jobs, entering government service, and becoming professionals, though widespread unemployment and the prevailing poverty of the depression partially obscured the extent of the occupational transformation. Observers during this period erroneously took eccomposition of American lews be-

onomic factors to be the main reason why Jews supported the Democratic party. A few cited in-fluences other than economic, but on the wrong evidence: they sug-gested that Roosevelt had solidi-fied the Jews' Democratic loyal-ties by his appeal as an anti-Nazi. Actually, Roosevelt was far from being a political or ideological pioneer of anti-Nazism; he followed a policy of utmost caution until the tide of public sympathy following the Battle of Britain in 1940 swept him into the interventionist camp. Most Jews did indeed see Roosevelt as an ardent anti-Nazi even in the early days

indeed see Roosevelt as an ardent anti-Nazi even in the early days, but in their intense admiration they were attributing their own feelings and views to him.

After the Second World War, the economic and occupational metamorphosis of American Jews became unmistakably apparent. They had shared in the country's rising prosperity. At the start of the 1950's most Jews were in business, white-collar occupations and the professions. Their socioeconomic structure now increasingly resembled that of high-status groups who voted Republican, and groups who voted Republican, and their continued preference for the Democratic party appeared ever idiosyncratic. In the 1952 presidental election, the Democratic candidate received about 75 per cent of the votes cast by Jews. No other group in the population—trade unionists, Negroes or young people — supported the party so solidly and consistently. And in 1956, when many other Democratic voters shifted to Eisenhower, the Gallup poll found that 75 per cent of Jewish voters remained firmly entrenched in the accustomed column. their continued preference for the

In the absence of firm data we can only speculate about the reasons. Jews were greatly at-tracted to Adlai E. Stevenson, in tracted to Adlal E. Stevenson, in part because the qualities of urbanity, education and culture which he personified have always appealed to them. But, more important, Stevenson's popularity with Jews was deeply rooted in their political—in fact,ideological—outlook on Mc Carthy'sm. Stevenson had been a target of Senator Joseph R. Mc Carthy's "anti-Communist" campaigns, which neither the Republican pres-Stevenson had been a target or Senator Joseph R. Mc Carthy's "anti - Communist" campaigns, which neither the Republican presidential candidate nor the Republican party leadership had repudiated. The image McCarthy conjured up among Jews were frightening: visions of storm troopers goose-stepping down Broadway, of an America taken over by a red, white and blue reincarnation of Hitler's Brown and Black Shirts. The Senator from Wisconsin seemed to symbolize that "it could happen here." However exaggerated their fears, most Jews recognized McCarthy as a demagogue bent on exploiting for his own aggrandizement the nation's abhorrence of Communism and anxiety over Russia. They sensed in McCarthy's anti-Communism qualities similar to Hitler's, though he was not anti-Semitic and even tried to show his philo-Semitism. They feared his cynical opposition to liberalism and his contempt for due process. Many felt threatened in their security not only as American citizens but also as Jews, associating McCarthy with anti-Semitism. Most believed instinctively that no good could come to them from this quarter.

quarter.

The depth of hostility against McCarthy among Jews has been measured in various surveys. A Gallup poll in June 1954 found intense disapprovål among 65 per cent of Jews interviewed, as compared with 31 per cent of Protestants, 38 per cent of Democrats and 45 per cent of college graduates. In March 1957 a Roper poll gauged attitudes toward McCarthy by index numbers; the Index gauged attitudes toward McCarthy by index numbers; the index
for the Jewish group stood at-46,
while the group next in line, consisting of executives and professionals, rated only -18.

Nor was he as pro-labor as Jews and liberals believed, in 1952, as a generation earlier, the political or ideological, more than the economic, differences between the Republican and Democratic Capital Companies determined by more Law. parties determined how most Jews voted. The same was true in 1956 and 1960, when Nixon incurred a good deal of the suspicion Jews had felt about McCarthy.

Political traditions brought

Political traditions brought from Europe (particularly Eastern Europe), economic experiences among the urban proletariat, and insecurities about anti-Semitism have combined to shape a middle-class American Jewish liberalism that has usually expressed itself. class American Jewish liberalism that has usually expressed itself at the polls in Democratic voting. This liberalism has become so prevasive that many descendants of German Jewish immigrants, whose fathers and grandfathers were Republicans, have come to vote Democratic in the last two out three decades. By now liberal vote Democratic in the last two or three decades. By now liberal voting may have become part of a family group tradition—a habit and custom difficult to shed,particularly at that final moment in the voting booth when what Paul Lazarsfeld once called "terminal horror" assails the voter, preventing him from pulling the unaccustomed lever. customed lever

Today American Jewish liberalism seems to be sustained largely by this family and group tradition. Its earlier formative elements apparently are fading. European experiences antedating the First World War are remote and unfamiliar to the three-fourand unfamiliar to the three-four-ths of American Jews who are native-born. Even the recent past of Nazi Germany and the Second World War is a matter of book learning for a new generation. Memories of unemployment and poverty may still linger among the many American Jews who ex-perienced the depression of the 1930's or witnessed the economic hardships of immigrant parents; but such recollections, too, are increasingly becoming part of a distant and even irrelevant past. The decline of overt anti-Semi-tism, the growing acceptance of The decline of overt anti-Semitism, the growing acceptance of Jews in nearly all occupations and at nearly all evels, will also probably affect the political behavior of Jews. If Jews find themselves wholeheartedly accepted, socially as well as professionally, by Gentiles whose class and status have made them Republican, the Jewish political style may change. The indentification of the political right with anti-Semitism-an indentification based almost exclusively on European politics—may then lose its meaning. Acculturation and full acceptance by Christians may in time deaden or curturation and full acceptance by Christians may in time deaden or at least dull Jewish sensitivity and feelings of insecurity. When this happens, class interest will probably affect voting more than Jewish group identity. But that time is still in the future.



QUESTIONS

On Being

By MANHEIM S. SHAPIRO

In a recent presentation on the "Eternal Light" television series, dramatist Howard Fast had a per

former portraying a non-Jew say to a group of Jews:

"All right. A black man is black. He looks at his skin and knows it. The Turk is a Turk. He talks Turkish, He is Turkish.

He talks Turkish. He is Turkish. A Dutchman is a Dutchman. They take it for granted. But I watch Jews and they seem to be members of a debating society that doesn't exist."

Indeed, for American Jews today this is true, doubled, and in spades. Not only in each group of Jews a society debating what it means to be a Jew, but each individual Jew also tends to carry around within himself a continual controversy. With some it is explicit; with others, unexpressed. But most of us have many unresolved questions about the true nature of Jewish identification.

Many American Jews were in-

fication.

Many American Jews were indignant when David Ben Gurion, then Premier of Israel, expressed the view that Jews could not survive as Jews outside of Israel, particularly not in America. "Ben Gurion." they said, "doesn't really understand America, or us."

us."
Similar agitation arose when Israeli courts had to formulate a legal definition of what is meant by "a Jew" and decided, in accordance with traditional Jewish law, that a Jew is one born of a Jewish mother and who has never renounced his Judaism. Many American Jews felt that this was neither an accurate nor an appropriate definition of a Jew. But few among them could have offered an alternative definition that

few among them could have offered an alternative definition that
would satisfy even themselves.
What Mr. Ben Gurion was saying, and what troubled many of us,
was that the Jewish group and
its traditions could not survive
the challenges of a free, open
and mixed society. He was saying
what the late President Kongedy. the challenges of a free, open and mixed society. He was saying what the late President Kennedy said in a quite different context; that the "pressures of opportunity" would provide too great a temptation for us to resist. The challenge of a free and voluntary society is that is requires of the individual that he have the strength to make choices. The "land of opportunity" has therefore confronted Jews in America with dilemmas they did not face when the choices were more limited. And they have mixed feelings about these choices.

For many centuries after the explusion of the Jews from the Eiblical kingdom of Judah, they lived in many places, among many nations. Almost always, however, Jews lived as a society within a society. They were distinguished from their neighbors by customs and habits, often by their dress, always by their concept of God and His expectation from men.

Sometimes this isolation was self-imposed. The sociologist, Louis Wirth, pointed out, for example, that the first ghettoes were established as a result of petitions by Jews to local rulers for a place in which Jews could live together, undisturbed in their maintenance of their group identity.

On most occasions, though, this isolation was imposed by the larger society—and often carried with it oppression and persecution, or even death and destruction.

But in this kind of atmosphere, there was little doubt about what made a Jew a Jew. His difference in almost every respect from the recolle among whom he lived made the late President Kennedy



The Jewish Community In America

By IRVING KANE

Some months ago, in an article in the New York Times Magazine, the distinguished political scientist, Andrew Hacker, posed the question, "What kind of nation are we?" This suggested to me some observations on "What kind of Jewish community are we?" We are, first of all, free — freer than we have ever been. We live in a land in which the concepts of voluntarism and of plural-

cepts of voluntarism and of pluralism — in religion, in politics, in the organizations we join and take part in — characterize our society. Even Jewish organized life is completely free and voluntary. There can be no compulsion in American Jewish life. There is no group that seeks it; there is no force that can exert it.

The voluntary and pluralistic nature of the American society affects not only the equality of opportunity we enjoy but our very Jewishness. We are free to participate in American life in every aspect of its richness and variety. cepts of voluntarism and of plural-

aspect of its richness and variety We are also free to leave Jewish life, with all its heritage and his-

There remains, in the midst of the freedom we enjoy, antisemitism in America. There remain prejudice and discrimination. I do not underestimate them. But neither do I permit myself to be frightened by them. Nor do I think they are necessary to keep our community together. I cannot accept the notion that we need a little bit of anti-Semitism as a kind of cement to hold Jewry together. together.

We are, secondly, a young community. Although we observed our tercentenary ten years ago, it is only within this century that we have developed significantly as a community. Between the years 1900 and 1910 approximately one million Jewishimmigrants came to the United States. Their arrival here led to the formation of the great instruments and institutions here led to the formation of the great instruments and institutions of American Jewry. The first Jewish federations were formed less than 70 years ago. The Joint Distribution Committee, the overseas relief agency of the Jewish community, is only 50 years old. Our own American Jewish Congress was established in 1918. We are, then — as an organized Jewish community — little more than two generations old.

We are also, generally, an economically secure community. We are an educated community. This year, it is estimated, nearly 80 percent of all Jewish high school graduates will be entering college,

graduates will be entering college, a far higher percentage than that of any other racial, religious or ethnic group in the country. The emphasis we as Jews put on education is one of the "Jewish values" that many of us keeptalking about and constitute that

cation is one of the Jewish values" that many of us keeptalking about and sometimes have trouble defining.

How have we measured up to the special responsibilities imposed upon us by our freedom, our economic well-being, our education?

Carl Sandburg has a beautiful line on this: "Who paid for my freedom, and what the price, and am I somehow beholden?" How have we used these blessings as Americans and as Jews? When Julian Huxley visited this country almost 100 years ago, he asked a similar question when he beheld our bounty: "What are you going to do with all these things?" he asked. "What is to be the end to which these things are to be the means?"

The goals and values of Jewish

The goals and values of Jewish life do not really change. They remain fairly constant; to live creatively as Jews, to fulfill our obligations to our fellow-jews at home and abroad and to our fellow home and abroad and to our fellow men everywhere; to make our maximum contribution to Ameri-can democracy; to maintain our religious and cultural integrity. In short, to keep faith with the American idea, to be true to the faith of our fathers and to live by the ethical mandates of our faith.

In this we have done pretty well on the whole. American Jews have made magnificent contributions to art and music and literature, to commerce, industry, and science. We have deepened America's passion for human freedom and personal dignity. We have achieved a higher degree of integration into American life and society than was ever dreamed possible — with fully reciprocal benefits. We have not been niggardly either in our giving or in our dedication to everything which contributes to the welfare of the Jewish people and of all mankind. We have contributed vast sums of money, about In this we have done pretty well and of all mankind. We have con-tributed vast sums of money, about two and a half billion dollars since World War II, through our federa-tions alone. We have begun to recognize increasingly the im-portance of Jewish education and of Jewish cultural development and are giving greater support or jewish cultural overlopment and are giving greater support than ever before to our religious institutions. The scoffers — the prophets of doom, of assimila-tion, of Jewish apathy — have been

tion, of Jewish apathy — have been proved wrong.

The question posed so frequently a generation ago: "Will Jewish life continue under conditions of freedom?" has been answered decisively for our generation, at least, Jews want to remain Jews. Indeed, considering that we are now overwhelmingly a native-born Jewish community, I doubt that we have ever witnessed so great a degree of Jewish consciousness, or a greater readiness to support or a greater readiness to support every worthwhile Jewish endeavor, to say nothing of our readiness to save lives and feed the hungry and to resettle those to whom Israel is the only alternative to privation and indignity.

Indignity.

I do not share the defeatist view, the negative appraisal of some observers. American Jewry is neither decadent, nor doomed to a sterile assimilation, nor in a state of chaos. It is true that we suffer at times from a state of ideological disarray. But this is caused not so much by clearly defined disagreement as by concusion, the result of too many speeches and not enough conversations, too much exhortation and too little personal confrontation. What tions, too much exhortation and too little personal confrontation. What is desperately needed, I sometimes think, is an orderly statement — not of a Jewish consensus, which is unattainable and probably unnecessary — but of genuine disagreement, which, by the way, is not an easy thing to reach.

Perhaps we are seeking a modern American Jewish creed; seeking a way to express ourselves

Perhaps we are seeking a modern American Jewish creed; seeking a way to express ourselves as American Jews; seeking an accommodation between being the same as everybody else and being different. The president of the American Jewish Congress, Dr. Joachim Prinz, described this search in his book, which he entitled, "The Dilemma of the Modern Jew." We have many dilemmas as American Jews.

Are we a religious community? It is the religious community that is most consistent with the American pattern. I believe that, at least in America, Jews will ultimately survive as a religious community or not at all — that is, as a community that takes its place along-side the Protestant and Catholic communities as one of America's "three great religious faiths." The equality we enjoy with the two major Christian communities, despite our smaller numbers, is. I say, typical of the American the two major Christian communi-ties, despite our smaller numbers, is, I say, typical of the American pattern. We can, I believe, con-tinue to enjoy this equality so long as we continue as a religious com-munity — and so long as we are free to define "religious" in our way.

religious faith is not only Our religious faith is not only our highest credential in a non-jewish world; it is this that vali-dates all that we do as Jews. And it is this that has enabled our people to survive against all out-rageous fortume.

And what are sometimes re-ferred to as secular activities,

Judaism as a religion has always been a social force as well as a faith; it is deed as well as creed; it is the application of timeless principles to timely problems.

But are we a community at all?

We hear much about how "over-

We hear much about how "over-organized" or "disorganized" we We hear much about how "overorganized" or "disorganized" we are as a Jewish community. Yet the fact is that we have achieved a far higher degree of unity and effectiveness than is generally realized. In religion, there is the Synagogue Council of America, comprising Orthodox, Conservative and Reform rabbis and congregations. For community centers and services to the armed forces, there is the National Jewish Welfare Board. For fundraising in behalf of overseas causes, there is the United Jewish Appeal. For American-Israel relations, the President's Conference; for our local federations and welfare funds, there is the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. Even in the field of community relations, the National Community Relations Advisory Council has grown to include nearly 70 local communities as well as six national agencies.

I am not concerned so much about the so-called over-organization or disorganization of Jewish community life. My concernis with

zation or disorganization of Jewish community life My concern is with the unconcerned. Those of us active in Tewish life tend to lose sight of in Jewish life tend to lose sight of how vastly outnumbered we are. Outnumbered, I mean, by Jews who have only the most primitive understanding and little, if any, interest in Jewish communal life: in how the community works, how it goes about its business, what are its major problems. We have our Jewish community organizations, but are we really a Jewish community?

We know that geographical

we know that geographical boundaries alone do not make a boundaries alone do not make a community; that a community is a feeling, a sense of belonging, a sense of identification, of comfeeling, a sense of belonging, a sense of identification, of common destiny, of sharing responsibilities and sharing benefits. But for hundreds of thousands of Jews in America this sense of community has not yet been achieved. We must find these people and we must claim them. For in their indifference, their immunity from Jewish responsibility, lies a great danger and a great weakness that drags at our feet.

Here, to my mind, is the real problem of unity. Those of us actively engaged in Jewish communal life and just as actively engaged in arguing about it, in controversy over its many facets — we are, in an important sense, already united: in that we may react separately and differently to problems that claim our united interest. But the great unorganized, uninformed, non-reacting group — how

But the great unorganized, uninformed, ne formed, non-reacting group - how can we achieve unity with them?

can we achieve unity with them?

The answer, I believe, lies at the very least in strengthening the work of organizations like the American Jewish Congress.

As I look at the programs of the American Jewish Congress, they can be described, I suggest, as inward-looking and outward-looking — concerned with our role as Americans and our responsibilities as Jews; our obligations as citizens of a young country and as members of an ancient people.

Looking outward, I think it is fair to say that the Jewish community — at least that part of it we call the organized community—

fair to say that the Jewish community — at least that part of it we call the organized community—has accepted the principle that Jewish security requires a healthy society; that there is a close connection between the general conditions of the country in which we live and the treatment accorded us as Jews.

Our Jewish experience teaches us that Jewish group interest is inextricably bound up with our interest in strengthening freedoms for all citizens. Our Jewish heriforntinued on Following Page)

(Continued from Preceding Page) tage commits us to the struggle for equality, for justice, for democracy. Together, these form the basis and the rationale for our concern with such issues as church-state separation, with liberal causes generally. But I suggest to you that these liberal sentiments, which all of us here doubtless share, will be put to the test — already are being put to the test — already are being put to the test — in some of the places where the largest numbers of our Jewish people live.

Civil rights in Birmingham, Alabama, is the easlest thing to support in Brooklyn, New York, But how is the Jewish community of Brooklyn to act when Negroes demand an end to racial segregation in labor unions? What is the proper role of the Jewish community in my own city of Cleveland when Negroes in a new-found spirit of militancy take to the streets to demand an end to racial imbalance in the city's schools, and where a brave young white minister has just lost his life?

How should a Congress chapter in Boston react when local Negro (Continued from Preceding Page)

How should a Congress chapter in Boston react when local Negro groups ask for help in staging a school boycott? What is the proper stance for the Congress chapter in San Francisco when the local CORE group sits-in and lies-in at the Palace Hotel?

What position should AJCongress take on bussing as a technique of school integration that will be true to its own principles and, at the same time, reflect the sentiments and understanding of its own members—especially of its own members — especially since bussing may interfere, it is now argued, with the effective op-eration of Jewish afternoon on ols?

These questions are crucial to the future of the American Jewish Congress, as well as the com-munity as a whole. Ours is an ormunity as a whole. Ours is an organization that has been in the forefront of the civil rights movement for twenty years — an organization that sent busloads of its members to the great March on Washington, and whose president pronounced some of the most eloquent words that were uttered from the steps of Lincoln Memorial that day.

the steps of Lincoln Memorial that day.

There is — or should be, it seems to me — great concern about the gap between the national headquarters of Jewish organizations and their members in the field on the burning issue of civil rights. I suggest to you that this gap is widening every day. And I urge you to consider what steps you should take to bridge this gap, to close this distance between leadership and membership — between principles and practice. readership and membership — between principles and practice.
There can be, I think, no more important work for the American Jewish Congress on the domestic scene during the period ahead — nor anything more difficult.

We have been telling ourselves for so many generations now that

We have been telling ourselves for so many generations now that "It is hard to be a Jew," that we overlook the fact it is even harder to be a Jewish organization. An individual Jew can do just about as he pleases and deal with his conscience in his own way. But a Jewish organization must walk that tightest of all ropes — between giving leadership — in the only way that leadership can be given:

Jewish organization must walk that tightest of all ropes — between giving leadership — in the only way that leadership can be given: to lead! — and at the same time not getting so far ahead of its constituents that it is out of hearing distance — and loses them!

Looking inward, what of our responsibilities toward ourselves, our community, our future as American Jews? We are such a people and we have such a history as to require that when we look at ourselves we must also look beyond our borders; to Israel, where our fellow-Jews remain surrounded by Arab nations still determined to drive them into the sea; to Soviet Russia, where a Jewish community second only to ours in numbers is subjected to a campaign of cultural and spiritual genocide that marks a new and ominous kind of anti-Semitism.

The Jewish Community In America

But while we are deeply concerned about our fellow-jews in every corner of the globe, while we must not relax for a moment our efforts for Israel, while we must intensify the campaign we have launched on behalf of Soviet Jewry, we must also look to the future of American Jewry — the most populous, the most prosperous; the most favored, most fortunate Jewish community in our people's history.

The American Jewish Congress has always been concerned with the creative survival of the American Jewish community. The fact that we Jews are always talking and writing about our survival

can jewish community. The fact that we Jews are always talking and writing about our survival is to my mind the surest sign that we shall survive; it is even in itself a means of creative survival. No religious or ethnic group in history has said so much and written so much about its own survival. This is only natural in light of the tragedies of our past.

I believe we shall survive. The record of American Jewry speaks for our chances. No one who views that record can fall to be impressed by the prodigious quality of its achievements — from the relief and rescue and rehabilitation of our brothers in other lands to the development of a distinguished network of institutions of welfare and worship—at home. Of course, we must always ask ourselves: while our achievements have been extensive, have they been too shallow — disproportionate, perhaps, to the advantages we have enjoyed? extensive, have they been too shal-low — disproportionate, perhaps, to the advantages we have enjoyed? I hope we shall always be moved by a creative discontent; that we shall always be on guard against a creeping decreptude in Jewish life. We must rid ourselves of that new malaise in the Jewish com-munity — the terrible desire for social status that afflicts so many. Of course there is the danger of

social status that afflicts so many.

Of course there is the danger of assimilation. But this danger has always existed, in every era of Jewish history and wherever Jews have lived. It exists today not only in America but also in Israel where thoughtful citizens are concerned that the younger generation will grow up as Israelis but not necesarily as Iews.

grow up as Israelis but not necesarily as Jews.
Of course there is the danger of intermarriage. That, too, has long existed. And that, too, is a threat. But if we value America's political and social freedom, part of freedom's price is an intelligent adaptation and a patient understanding. I have the feeling that the approach to this problem has been somewhat distingenuous.

the approach to this problem has been somewhat disingenuous.

One wonders about some of the past prescriptions that have been offered to meet this problem. It remains to be seen whether the refusal of rabbis to perform the wedding ceremony will discourage any couple from going through with

any couple from going through with an interreligious marriage. It is worth noting, by the way, that marriages between Protestants and Catholics are at a higher rate than our own intermarriages.

What is most surprising is that we are surprised at all by the possibility of intermarriage. It is a natural — almost an inevitable — concomitant of all of our teachings and preachings of a free and open and egalitarian society. Never before have we spoken so fervently and acted so vigorously for the equality of all people. We speak it at home and we hear it from our pulpits and our convention platforms; we holst it on our banners and parade it in it on our banners and parade it in the streets; we hear it in the halls of our legislatures, on radio and television, in all of our mass media. And then we are surprised that our children don't all marry the kids in their car pool to Sun-

School! Now; I am not suggesting a Now; I am not suggesting a complete surrender to inevitability — although I am inclined to the view that a degree of intermarriage is here to stay. We need not accept this fact of life with glee. But does the risk of intermarriage mean we should not send our children to colleges where

LOUIS LIPSKY Rare Phenomenon

On American Scene CHARLES E. SHULMAN

Louis Lipsky, who died at the age of 86, was a rare phenomenon on the American scene. He was a man totally committed to the peoplehood of Israel and to the Zionist plehood of Israel and to the Zionist idea from his earliest years even though he was born and raised in Rochester, New York, in an age and in an environment which had scant sympathy for Jewish nationalism. In a long, rich and colorful life he made his name synonymous with Zionism and proved that the intensity of the Jewish tradition knows no locale.

The Zionist leaders of Lipsky's generation were men who drew their inspiration from the European Jewish experience — Weiz-

their inspiration from the Euro-pean Jewish experience — Weiz-mann, Jabotinsky, Schmarya Levin, Ben Zvi, Ben-Gurion. They had known at first hand the dis-abilities of Jewish life in Eastern Europe and had reacted by seeking to reconstitute their oppressed and scattered people as a nation in its own homeland. But Lipsky's Zionism derived from no such hos-Zionism derived from no such hos-Zionism derived from no such nos-tile atmosphere as that which en-gulfed European Jews. There were no crushing forces in Ameri-ca to shock him into the type of reaction which characterized his fellow-Zionists abroad. American Jews were, by and large, contented with their lot and considered the with their lot and considered the Jewish problem solved so far as they were concerned; America was their answer to European anti-Semitism. They generally thought of themselves as a community separate from their brethren in other parts of the world. Nor did they consider valid the dramatic dictum which Theodor Herzl pronounced at the First Zionist Congress at Basle that Jews are one people everywhere. They tended to look at Herzl as a visionary and on Zionism as achimerical notion. It was Lipsky's destiny to effect a change in their thinking on this score. He was among the first American Jews to grasp the significance of the common fate of his people and he, more than any (Continued on Following Page) lewish problem solved so far as

(Continued from Preceding Page) they will meet non-jewish boys and girls? Does it mean we should surrender our activities in the struggle against racial and religious discrimination? Of course not. Neither does it mean that we should abandon our responsibilities to our children or our responsibility to the ideal of Jewish continuity. As parents we have a right and a duty to point out as forcefully as we can the hazards of intermarriage; that the odds are against them for a sound and happy marriage. As Jews, we have a (Continued from Preceding Page)

of intermarriage; that the odds are against them for a sound and happy marriage. As Jews, we have a responsibility to make Judaism so vital and so important to our children that they will not want to leave it.

This, then, is the unfinished business of American Jewry: to make sure our children will want to be Jews. I can offer no easy formula for doing the job. But I believe this: Our children will embrace Judaism only as we make it the noble faith it truly is; only as we embrace it in all its grandeur, its beauty of spirit and strength of character and loftiness of ideal; only as we demonstrate to our children that Judaism is truly a many-splendored thing.

Our young people — our college youth in particular — will find little reason to identify themselves with a Jewish community that acts with fear or timidity on the issues of our times. On the contrary, we will attract and hold our best

of our times. On the contrary, we will attract and hold our best young minds by continuing to fight the good fight, as Jews, with the courage and compassion our prophets enjoined upon us, fired by their divine discontent.

(Continued from Preceding Page) other individual, nurtured and propagated the Zionist idea until it became dominant in American it became dominant in American Jewish thought. For more than half a century he was the architect and the authoritative exponent of the Zionist movement in the United States and a prime force in gaining American support for the Balfour Declaration, the British Mandate over Palestine and, finally, the establishment of the independent Jewish State.

Lipsky's early career was linked to the theater. For more than a decade he was the drama critic for the New York Telegraph, contributing a weekly theater column

for the New York Telegraph, contributing a weekly theater column while writing for many other publications. It was during this period that he came to know well the Yiddish Rialto, perhaps the most glowing tribute to Second Avenue in the English language. No other writer has penetrated so thoroughly the history of the Yiddish theater and none has presented more lucidly its role in the cultural life of the American Jewish community. Lipsky knew the people — Jacob Adler, Bertha Kalich, Kenia Lipzin, David Kessler, Jacob Gordin, Morris Moscowich — and with sure strokes of his pen recorded the

David Kessler, Jacob Gordin, Morris Moscowich — and with sure strokes of his pen recorded the flavor and excitement of an era that has now completely vanished.

Louis Lipsky's complete involvement with Zionism took him away from the theater. He became the managing editor of the American Hebrew, editor of the Mercabean, founder and editor of the New Palestine, vice president of the American Jewish Congress, co-founder of the World Jewish Congress, chairman of the executive committee of the Federation of American Zionists, and later president of the Zionist Organization of America The man of letters found himself involved in the political arena. Always, his passion was democracy in Jewishlife. Like Stephen S, Wise, with whom he was closely associated, he warred incessantly against the privileged classes in Jewish life who looked with disdain on Zionism and on the participation of the "humbler folk" in Jewish life. To this end he fought to establish a kehilla in New York, helped to found the American Jewish Congress, labored to extend Zionism found the American Jewish Congress, labored to extend Zionism

found the American Jewish Congress, labored to extend Zionism as a galvanizing force among the masses of Jews, and participated in the effort to make the American Jewish Conference truly representative of all shades of Jewish opinion in this country.

In his book A Gallery of Zionist Profiles he took note of the paradox in his makeup. He said that if he were to write the memoirs of his Zionist life they would be chiefly concerned with what he remembered of the gifted and dedicated men who made the Jewish rebirth a reality, It did not serve his purpose, he said, to tell 'how he was diverted to Zionism, how purpose, he said, to tell "how he was diverted to Zionism, how

purpose, he said, to tell "how he was diverted to Zionism, how it shaped and guided his life, how it made him feel a pulsating kinship with all things Jewish; good and bad." It was enough for him to know that he was a contemporary of Zionism's pioneers in the United States and followed the movement's development with interest and concern he could not explain until the Jewish State was finally clothed in sovereignty.

But Lipsky did reveal far more of himself than he thought, Although by nature a modest person bordering on shyness he had no hesitancy in contributing his full share to any cause which won his allegiance. When he supported an undertaking he did so completely. When he declared war against vulgarity, shoddiness, ignorance and cravenness in Jewish life he lent to the battles his total involvement of personality andvigor of mind. This we know from his earlier writings collected in three volumes and published in his honor on his fiftieth birthday. The first of these, called Thirty Years of American Zionism, demonstrates to a remarkable degree the manner in which are American-born Jew could feel so intensely and interpret so passionately the sentiments of the shtet! 

(Continued from Preceding Page) ern Europe. Lipsky established a vital and enduring kinship with the Weizmanns, the Schmarya Levins and the others who were

Levins and the others who were conditioned by an environment so alien to his.

He relates how from his youth he was drawn to Zionism because of his feeling of humiliation of the galut, not through personal experience but through a feeling of sympathy for the people among whom he was born. He felt love commingled with pity for the underprivileged of the galut and every reference to Jewish greatness in the past, every allusion to Jewish hope stirred him profoundly. His early life was spent in an Americalier. the past, every allusion to Jewish hope stirred him profoundly. His early life was spent in an American provincial city where there were two distinct communities. One was the community in which he lived, consisting of Russian immigrants, intense advocates of the Jewish tradition. The other was the world of the earlier Jewish settlers who had formulated what he called a version of Teutonic-Reform-pragmatic religion which they termed American Judaism. Lipsky never forgot this distinction which impressed him in his boyhood. He saw this type of Judaism protected by the privileged class by a kind of Monroe Doctrine. It did not carry with it the pangs of the weltschmertz which afflicted the Orthodox. He described it as a comfortable, easy-going, self-satisfied mode of Jewish life.

Lipsky was always deprecating his capacity to relate himself to the

Lipsky was always deprecating his capacity to relate himself to the movement that absorbed his time, energy and efforts throughout his life, but the moving account of his reservations about himself were groundless. It is doubtful whether any single American lew editored groundless. It is doubtful whether any single American Jew eclipsed him in devotion to the Jewish ideal. He was loved by the masses of Jews because they saw in him the personification of their own hopes and yearnings. He himself came from the masses and was sustained in all the affects. from the masses and was sus-tained in all his efforts not only tained in all his efforts not only by an extraordinary understanding of the purpose of the Zionist move-ment, but by the great talent he had for expressing the motives and purposes of Jewish living in the contemporary world.

His remarkably lucid writings contributed to no small degree toward the education of the Ameri-can Jewis in a greater comprehen-

toward the education of the American Jews in a greater comprehension of the meaning of the Jewish heritage and the urgency of the solution of Jewish problems created by changing world orders. He not only pointed the way to more dignifiled and satisfying Jewish living, but also served as a powerful scalpel in ferreting out and disclosing the confusion in Jewish life which were hampering the growth of the democratic spirit and blocking the establishment of a homogeneous American Jewish and blocking the establishment of a homogeneous American Jewish community. There was hardly a vital issue on which he did not touch in the articles he wrote for the Maccabean, the New Palestine, Congress Weekly and other journals. His Galley of Zionist Profiles is not only a brilliant delineation of such unusual personalities as Wise, Brandels, Weizmann, Magnes, Sokolow and others, but also a sharply etched critique of their strength and weakness. Lipsky served the Zionist organization but he was not an organization man. His own love of freedom would not permit him to hold

zation but he was not an organization man. His own love of freedom would not permit him to hold his tongue or shackle his energies when conditions inimical to adequate Jewish living stood in need of correction.

Lipsky's trenchant observations on many aspects of Jewish life were unfortunately not preserved in print. These were often uttered in table conversations beyond the midnight hours at the Tip Toe Inn on New York's upper Broadway, a restaurant he helped make a favorite rendezvous for Jewish intellectuals. Those who shared his company were invariably the beneficiaries of his rich experience and mature wisdom. His directness was proverbial. When, for example, he spoke of anti-Semitism in America he noted that it was the disease of small minds and he counselled disdain toward it, recalling that we are an (Continued on Following Page) (Continued on Following Page)

Mordecai Chaim Rumkowski was a selfmade man. A poor workingman, his education limited to a Cheder and a smattering of a Russian primary school, he worked his way up to being a partner in a Lodz textile manufactory. The firm went backrupt but, because of his honest attempt to pay off all his debts, he had no difficulty in reestablishing himself as a manufacturer in Russian Poland andwas again on the road to riches. The Russian Revolution put an end to his hopes of becoming wealthy; its entire fortune lost he returned his hopes of becoming wealthy; his entire fortune lost, he returned to Lodz at the end of the war, or, a widower twice over child-

less.

There Rumkowski became an insurance agent, diverting his energy and ambition to Jewish communal affairs. In 1920 the Joint Distribution Committee chose him as co-director of the children's summer camps, in recognition of his zeal and integrity. This post led to his appointment as general supervisor of several orphan asylums in Lodz. An indefatigable fund-raiser, he was the prime mover in the building of a modern orphan asylum and a special school for agricultural work to train young people for emigration to Palestine.

Rumkowski, an ardent General Zionist, was looked down on by the professional Zionists because of his lace of education; he was There Rumkowski became

of his lace of education; he was never considered fit for any imnever considered fit for any im-portant position. His election to the Kehillah was at the very bot-tom of the Zionist list, but his skin was thick enough to with-stand the slights of his co-workers. He was aggressive and vocal, He was aggressive and vocal, never hesitating to fight for his two pet projects: subsidies for the two pet projects; subsidies for the Keren Kayemeth and for his orphan asylum. His very "folkishness," the direct and artless way he pushed his opinions, won him many supporters; he became a leader of the "decision remediation to the Ortho Zionist opposition to the Orth (Continued on Following Page)

(Continued from Preceding Page) ancient people with a proud heriage and we should not form our attitudes on the basis of what our enemies say but on our own ideals. He saw Zionism as something more than the effort to acquire a Jewish homeland. To him it represented the enlargement of Jewish interests. It was something that could open the souls of the Jewish cause, the means of building Jewish dignity and strength. Since Zionism was his chief concern it is natural that he gave it cern it is natural that he gave it

irn it is natural that he gave it equalities of religion.
Lipsky perhaps best summed this philosophy in an address called "The All-in-all," which delivered in Buffalo at the time his election to the presidency of a Zionist Organization of merica:

the Zionist Organization of America:

"There was a time when I dreamed of writing plays for the theater. But what is the value of contrived drama by comparison with the great scene? We have been working out in terms of actual life a drama which had been dragging and had become monotonous, and into it we put the element of struggle and creation. We have given to the Jewish people the possibility of enacting the hero in this living drama instead of the victim of blind, historic forces. We have given color and point to this drama. He did not follow the party line completely, however. The increasing official anti-Semitism of the Polish government had stepped up the trend among influential Jewish leaders toward a policy of accommodation: to live and work with the regime, while trying to mitigate the severity of the discriminatory laws by evasion, bribery, and other methods. Rumkowski agreed with this view. When the Zionists left the Kehillah en masse over a particularly glaring

the Zionists left the Kehillah en masse over a particularly glaring question of such accommodation, Rumkowski stayed behind.

When the Germans invaded Poland, the president of the Kehillah and many other members fled the city. The vice-president became president; Rumkowski was chosen vice-president Hefelt the came president; Rumkowski was chosen vice-president. He felt the opportunity had come for him to show what kind of man he was. He was filled with a sense of mis-sion—he was to be the leader who would bring "Peace to all Israel." In the name of national (Jewish) danger, he succeeded in rallying danger, he succeeded in rallying to his side the remaining wealthy financiers and industrialists for the support of communal activi-

the support of communal activities.

The Germans dissolved the Kehillah in October, 1939. Impressed by his appearance and evident ability, the German City-President appointed him "Eldest of the Jews," and ordered him to set up an advisory council, formed arbitrarily, a sign of things to come. Rumkowski, as "Eldest of the Jews," sent notices, "Herr Rumkowski, by authority of the (German) Commission for Lodz, orders, you to join the Judenrat." His council was to be strictly advisory; he alone would decide what to do and how to do it.

His first official act was one

His first official act was one of bravery; he categorically refused to open a brothel for the Germans. His second act was in keeping with his past; he convinced the Germans that order among the youth could be maintained only by allowing the schools to be re-opened. Given full authority over the educational system and allowed to levy a tax for the support of the schools, he set up a school commission consisting of Jewish cultural leaders, among them the poet Yitzhak Katzenelson. For the next two weeks he went about puffed up with pride at his easy early success in dealing with the Germans. His first official act was one

the Germans.

The bubble soon burst. On November 1, the Gestapo raided the Astoria coffee house, the chief gathering-place for the intellectuals and communal workers of Lodz. Rumkowski promptly went to Gestapo headquarters to ask for their release. He was badly beaten and thrown out. Worse was to follow. His advisory, council.

for their release. He was badly beaten and thrown out. Worse was to follow. His advisory council was convened by order of the Germans. Twenty-eight members were taken away, and twenty-four killed a few days later, after they had been tortured by the Gestapo. On the very same day, a new forty-man council was organized. The news of the arrests did not help Rumkowski to recruit the best elements of the community, who felt the honor was but a pre-liminary to the grave. Special messengers, however, brought all the rabbis and a sufficient number of other leaders to make an imposing audience for the Nazi colonel who addressed the gathering. Rumkowski was re-confirmed as the "Eldest of the Jews." All parties were dissolved; administration was to be systematized; Jewish cultural and religious activities were permitted. Rumkowski asked for the freedom of those arrested; the colonel said seven or eight would be released. A debate arose over who was to be chosen but Rumkowski refused to be a party to such a compromise. He wanted all, to go free. The Nazi colonel made no concessions and kept no promises. colonel made no concessions and

The arrests of the councilmen and the raid on the Astoria led to a mass exodus of intellectuals and party functionaries to the supposed safety of the General-Government (the remainder of Nazi-(Continued on Following Page)

(Continued from Preceding Page) occupied Poland, as opposed to that part incorporated into the Reich). Rumkowski made no attempt to flee. He was sure that the barbarism of the Germans was only temporary. He proceeded to launch the school system as the first step in the rebuilding of Jewish life in Lodz. A syllabus similar to that used before the war was adopted, hot meals were provided for the students, even a special school for deaf-mutes was started. He levide a heavy tax on

special school for deaf-mutes was started. He levied a heavy tax on merchants and factory owners for the support of the institutions. He used his title and authority with the Germans as well as with the Jews. He asked the Germans for funds to establish hospitals, old-age homes, and orphan asylums. He asked for repayment for confiscated buildings. He asked for unblocking of the frozen accounts in the local banks. Not all his requests were answered, but that made no difference to Rumkowski. He persisted and perhaps by his He persisted and perhaps by his very persistence gained the con-fidence of the Germans as a force-

He pushed too hard and too fast, however. On December 16, the members of the Judenrat were the members of the Judenrat were called in, one by one, to be interviewed by a German official; Rumkowski sat silently by his side. They were informed that the Judenrat's sole function was to execute the orders of their rulers and nothing else. The Judenrat was to be enlarged to a total of sixty-seven persons, with a presidium of ten, including a Gestapo representative.

ten, including a Gestapo repre-sentative.

Most of the new nominees, overwhelmed by this distinction, fled to Warsaw. Along with them went more intellectuals, industri-alists, doctors, and school execu-tives, even two men Rumkowski had saved from execution. Left to rebuild his council from people rebuild his council from people previously inexperienced in communal affairs, he did the best he could. He gladly took more responsibility on his own shoulders, applying his unquestioned organizational ability to the task of restoring a semblance of powerly storing a semblance of normal life to the Jewish community. At life to the Jewish community. At the same time, he did not neglect the need to appease the Germans. With speed and diligence he carried out their command to register all the Jews, to him a harmless and meaningless procedure. He did not resist the establishment of the Ghetto; nor did the great mass of Jews, who believed that a Ghetto would isolate them from the poorous Rumkowskiwas.

from the pogroms, Rumkowski was tireless in his efforts to make easy the transition to the sewerless Balut slum district on the outskirts of the city, to make the Ghetto mirror—distortedly, it is true, but that was not his fault the Gnetto mirror—distortedly, it is true, but that was not his fault—the past Jewish community. The Ghetto Police, "to maintain law and order," was in charge of Leon Rosenblatt, a bank clerk who had once been an officer in the Austrian army.

Rumkowski's title developed new meaning. He became the transmitter of the orders of the German overlords to the inhabitants of the Ghetto. He fancied himself as a Court Jew, the mediator between the Germans and his people.

Rumkowski. His crass vulgarity Rumkowski. His crass vulgarity in the way he spoke of "my Jews" offended the former political leaders whose organizations had disappeared underground. Rumkowski felt he needed this support. Expressing a readiness to make concessions, he called a conference with the Bund. He allocated a ence with the bund. He allocated a quantity of sugar for its co-opera-tives; he refused, however to per-mit it to set up its own children's kitchens—"the classic disunity of the Jews must be stopped at some point," he said. He asked the Bund for help in strengthening the Jewish Police; the leadership turned him down but many of the rank and file joined the police. He met with other parties, as well, including the Communists. He offered them supplies for their cooperatives; he asked the Zionists to organize youth groups; he encouraged Poale Zion, Agudah, and the Bund to enlarge their farm work in the outlying areas of the Ghetto.

Around him grew an everincreasing circle of bureaucrats whose continued favored position depended on his good will. These were exceptions, however. For the most part, his heads of departments were people previously inactive in Jewish communal life. On the principle of "set a thief to catch a thief," he gave important posts in the Police to several underworld figures.

The immediate terror of the removal to the Ghetto quieted down. Everyone approved the system of the "block-Elders" he organized the Jews must be stopped at some point," he said. He asked the Bund

Everyone approved the system of the "block-Elders" he organized to administer the "block-fund," made up of more or less voluntary contributions from the wealther inhabitants to insure that no Jew went hungry. All applauded his Special Relief Bureau and the Control Commission to put down corruption. The working class groups, angered by his sale of the "better" dwellings to those Jews who had managed to bring their fortunes into the Ghetto, were placated by his special taxes on the "rich."

Rumkowski felt secure enough to try his hand with the Germans. to try his hand with the Germans. He took over the goods and machinery held by German "trustees"; when they protested to higher authorities, he said they were too inefficient in their production of goods for the German Army and he had to keep up his commitments, else the Jews would suffer in the long run. Flushed by this success, he asked Hans Biebow, the Ghetto overlord, for more doctors and for soap for the communal institutions. At the bottom of his letter he wrote, "The preservation of health is my chief duty." Biebow did not bother to answer.

The Germans announced that the Ghetto would be cut off from communication with the rest of Lodz as well as with the rest of the world. Without special permission no one would be allowed to leave. In the hermetically closed Ghetto, Rumkowski's power expanded. To him, the means of saving the Jews was simple. All they had to do was to prove that their work was necessary for the Reich. They had to become so closely enmeshed in the fabric of German war economy that to do away with the Jews would be disastrous to the Nazi plans for conquest. Rumkowski was not oblivious to the German aim of a Judenrein Europe. He hoped, however, to convince the anti-Semites that co-existence was possible, that deportation was not called for; the thought of extermination never entered his mind.

Every phase of life in the Ghetto was bent upon the furtherance of this goal. With unbonded egotistical faith that he alone knew what was the best for the Jews, he became the Fuhrer of the Ghetto of Litzmannstadt (the new name for Lodz). offended. A former businessman, he advocated "nationalization" and a vulgar socialism. A friend of the helpless, he was ready to sacrifice them that the employables could survive. Above all he stressed, "Workl—From work will come quiet in the Ghetto. The Nazis will let us alone if we co-operate with them."

Rumkowski pleaded with the Nazis to send in raw materials for the Ghetto workshops; he made contracts with private German firms; he encouraged inventiveness and gave awards (of food and privilege) to those who set up new factories. The latter were communal institutions, their directors part of the Ghetto bureaucracy, their products barterable for food. Private enterprise did not exist; "no Jew should take advantage of his starving brothers;" Rumkowski said. Everything went into the common fund, including the money for relief sentinto the Ghetto from the Bund, the Joint Distribution Committee, and other sources (after the Germans had discounted a sizable and other sources (after the Ger-mans had discounted a sizable amount in "clerical charges").

He rigorously suppressed smuggling, so vital for the circum-vention of the Nazi starvation plan and so successful in that direction and so successful in that direction elsewhere. Smuggling introduced an incalculable variable into the Ghetto economy; smugglers, not dependent on Rumkowski for jobs or support, were a threat to his power. His police were efficient; smuggling decreased. His courts were efficient; smugglers were sent outside the Ghetto to the German slave labor camps, where

were efficient; smugglers were sent outside the Ghetto to the German slave labor camps, where few survived the inhamane treatment. The Ghetto currency was most efficient of all; it put the final quietus to all smuggling. To eliminate the bloody searchers and seizures of the Kripo (German Criminal Police), Rumkowski opened an office for the purchase of foreign currency, jewels, crystal ware, and porcelain; their value was assessed by experts; the owners were recompensed in Ghetto currency, "Rumkes;" the articles so paid for were turned over to the Germans in exchange for food. No German currency was valid in the Ghetto; all Reichsmarks were converted into Ghetto money. The "Rumkes" were beautiful banknotes, ornamented with the Shield of David, Rumkowski's portrait, and emblems of Ghetto industry. They Rumkowski's portrait, and em-blems of Ghetto industry. They were valueless outside the Ghetto. Unwittingly, in the interest of peace in the Ghetto, Rumkowski had effectively cut off the possibility of getting food or other supplies from any source other than the German rulers.

Rumkowski tried to alleviate

Rumkowski tried to alleviate the distress of "his Jews." The amount of food allotted to the Ghetto amount of food allotted to the Chette was proportionate to its population; the Germans ordered a census. Rumkowski dilly-dallied and then gave the figure of 160,000, undoubtedly exaggerated. The Germans wanted to know how much food came in parcels from abroad. wanted to know how much tood came in parcels from abroad; Rumkowski promised a prompt reply and as promptly forgot his promise. Biebow ordered that the Jews make special hats for the Ghetto officials; Rumkowski ignored the command because such production was unecompute—the production was unecomonic—the hats could not be traded for food.

production was unecomonic—the hats could not be traded for food.

All his maneuverings could not stem the hunger nor the cold nor the mortality from dysentery, typhoid, typhus, and tuberculosis. The Germans supplied food in insufficient quantity, at irregular intervals, of bad quality. They forbade the importation of fuel into the Ghetto. They forced Rumkowski to barter the produce grown in the Marysin section for staple food items by not sending in the latter. Conditions in the Ghetto became intolerable. The tailors called a strike, the shtarke (fish dealers, butchers, draymen) led demonstrations, the honest intellectuals resigned their official posts—all in protest at Rumkowski's manifest inadequacy.

He divided the shtarke, taking their leaders into the Police, making of others a kind of Pretorian Guard to put down future demonstrations, and sending others out of the Ghetto to forced labor. He denounced those who did not support him as "irresponsible elements, creating disorder in the Ghetto, attracting concessions to the workers, allow-

responsible elements, creating disorder in the Ghetto, attracting the attention of the Germans."
He used the labor unrest as an argument in dealing with the Germans. He convinced them, especially Blebow, who got a rakeoff from all Ghetto industry, that it was to their advantage that all Ghetto workers be fully employed because of their phenomenal productivity. New contracts were given; more raw materials were sent in; unemployment diminished ductivity. New contracts were given; more raw materials were sent in; unemployment diminished rapidly. Again he tried to hoodwink the Germans, He told Biebow he found it impossible to collect debts owed to Poles and Germans by individual debtors in the Ghetto. Ordered to turn over goods left behind by Volksdeutsche (ethnic Germans) in various places in the Ghetto, he didn't know the addresses, didn't have the keys, had no staff to take inventory, had no trucks to move materials. His high-handedness in the Ghetto increased. He had a ready weapon at hand to dispose of his few opponents. All he had to do was to take away their ration cards, a veritable death sentence. He liquidated the workers' groups, withdrew the concessions he had previously made, closed the organizational some, kitchens.

withdrew the concessions he had previously made, closed the organizational soup-kitchens, expropriated the agricultural kibbutzim in the Marysin section, and set up a Summary Court for quick sentencing of offenders against his orders. He ordered house searches for the detection of thefts from the Chepto steals from the Chepto steals from the Chepto steals from the communal factories—"Who steals from the Ghetto steals from all Israel (in Lodz)." Twenty-four Poale Zionists were imprisoned for holding a private meeting, prima facie proof of subversive activity against the "Eldest of the Jews." In response to a delegation of rabbis who had paraded with Sefer-Torahs, asking for more food for the people, Rumkowski called a conference of all the rabbis, condemned the "sacr'lege," took away the ration cards of some demonstrators, and co-opted some into his administration. The factories were like prisons, with rigid norms and strict discipline. Punishment was extreme; the "soup," the only hot meal a Ghetto worker could count on, was taken away, Rumkowski broke the sporadic strikes with force.

force.

The food question was paramount in the Ghetto. Rumkowski, in his role of Court Jew, argued constantly with the Germans about the provisions sold to the Ghetto. He politely refused, on more than one occasion, to buy

bout the provisions sold to the Ghetto. He politely refused, on more than one occasion, to buy "great bargains" in spoiled canned goods. He prevailed on Biebow to protest to Berlin that the mainutrition amongst the Jews was impairing their productive efficiency, He lied to the Germans about the number of employed and about the health situation, in order to get more food sent in.

Providing enough food was not in Rumkowski's power. He tried to make up for this deficiency by "normalizing" Ghetto life. He established a new school system, with instruction in Yiddish, Hebrew, the Bible, and Jewish history; unfortunately so few of the teachers knew Yiddish, the official language, that the opening of the schools was delayed. A school health service as instituted; the general medical services were reorganized and expanded. Theaters were opened; concerts and lectures were given.

(Continued from Preceding Page) publication of the Ghetto-Zeitung, a newspaper in which he was lauded to the skdes as a True Judge, a Lamed-Vovnik, the Savior of the Jews of Litzmannstadt. His incredibly vainglorious speeches were quoted in detail: "I am smarter than anyone else and the Jews in the Ghetto should follow only me . . . I know that I am looked on with hatred because I threw a few people out of jobs. That's really a pity for those agitators, but what else could I do? I have a greater duty—to uphold our collective existence. I tell you frankly—you have it well and good, once you have a work card . . . I'll have no truck with politicians or delegations . . . My eyes are always open and my head thinks clearly about every detail in the Ghetto . . "Paintings and posters abounded showing Rumkowski spreading his mantle around the hungry and the children. Parades were held in his honor and complimentary albums presented to him. His vanity was limitless; the oath in the courts was taken "before God, man, and the Eldest of the Jews." His feelings were hurt, however, when the Germans forbade the use of the postage stamps he had printed, bearing his likeness and the Shield of David.

Rumkowski's "planned economy" was disturbed by the influx of Jews deported from the small towns in the Lodz area. Most of them were men broken in spirit; their wives and children had been sent "elsewhere." Places had to be sent "elsewhere." Places had to be found for them in the workshops to get them off relief. A further influx came with the twenty thou-sand Jews sent in from Prague, Luxemburg, Vienna, Berlin, and other German cities. These West-ern European lews were a thorn

Luxemburg, Vienna, Berlin, and other German cities. These Western European Jews were a thorn in Rumkowski's side. On the one hand, he respected their greater "culture"; on the other, he resented their traditional denigration of the Polish Jews and their critical attitude toward the Ghetto administration.

The fresh importations were hailed by Rumkowski and the Ghetto Jews as an omen that their Ghetto was to be permanent, not temporary, as in other parts of Poland. It was inconceivable to them that the Germans would use transportation so desperately needed for the war effort merely to shuttle Jews back and forth. Alasi They were wrong. The first forboding sign was the deportation of the insane and the cripples, obviously only to death. Then came the order in December, 1941, to select twenty thousand Jews for deportation from the Ghetto for "re-settlement elsewhere." Rumkowski pleaded to have the number reduced to tentousand; he persuaded himself where." Rumkowski pleaded to the humber reduced to ten thousand; he persuaded himself that the deportations were fresh proof that the Ghetto was to be a permanent workplace for Jews, that the unemployables were to be discarded as a drain on the economy.

In announcing the new decrees, Rumkowski blustered:

In announcing the new decrees, Rumkowski blustered:

The Ghetto is autonomous...
The Eldest of the Jews alone can decide who will be sent out...
On high authority, they will be re-settled in the provinces...
This is the fault of the loafers, the politicians, the refugees who have changed the character of our formerly safe Ghetto... Whose the control of the character of our formerly safe Ghetto... This action must be carried out. If I don't do it, another will but I am sure I will remain...

The ranting concealed his fear of taking the onus for the selections. He sought advice. Some said that the old and the sick should be sent out; others said the young and strong because they were probably going to be sent far away to a hard existence (death was not even thought of); still others said that whole families

far away to a hard existence (death was not even thought of); still others said that whole families should go so that the strong could help the weak. The Rabbinical Council refused to give an opinion; "It was not their responsibility." 

mane" plan was finally evolved: the deported were to consist of two thousand refugees from the provinces who would be happler in more familiar surroundings, the families of those men sent outside the Ghetto for slave labor who would have a better chance to be re-united with their men-fold, the families on relief whose going would enable productive workers to ge more food, the "criminals" whose names appeared in the Central Card-index as having been arrested for any reason whatsoever, from knocking over a garbage can to stealing a piece of wood for fuel, and finally, anyone who had ever been an "enemy" of Rumkowski's.

of Rumkowski's.

Evasion was impossible: the house-watchmen were ordered, under penalty of deportation, to report any strangers in their houses; the inhabitants were threatened with the same fate for feeding or keeping anyone overnight. Everyone co-operated. The slogan of the Ghetto was "Nit mir maint mon." (They don't mean me.) Bribes were given and favoritism was shown; the political parties had their clerk-members in the Ghetto offices switch names on the list. Only the luckless sans "protection" were taken. The doctors examined the selectees to determine their fitness for the journey; the rabbis gave quick divorces; the employment office checked registration cards; the Jewish Police kept order in the ranks of the deportees along the march to the railway, station, where the Germans took over. At the loading platforms there were no such bloody scenes as in Warsaw; all went smoothly. From January 15 to January 29, 1942, 10,103 were sent out for "re-settlement."

That was only a beginning. Be-

That was only a beginning. Between February 22 and April 2, 34,073 more had been "re-settled." On April 18, Rumkowski ordered all the unemployed over ten years of age to report for examination by a German medical commission to determine their fitness for work.

ordered all the unemployed over ten years of age to report for examination by a German medical commission to determine their fitness for work.

This time Rumkowski managed to get rid of "disturbing elements in his Ghetto." Between May 4 and May 15 only 753 Lodz Jews ("criminals" and volunteers) were deported. The rest of the transports were made up of 10,161 Western European Jews, the bulk of those left after the deaths from typhus and starvation. Exempted were doctors and nurses, Ghetto of the Iron Cross, and those wounded in World War 1. The last two categories were meaningless; documents necessary for proof had long ago been lost or confiscated. Many German Jews volunteered; they wanted to die in their Fatherland (where they had been told they were going) rather than in the Ghetto hell. The Germans paid their Jewish compatriots an honor; every deportee had a reserved seat in a third-class carriage.

On September 1, the Germans cleaned out the hospitals, taking away almost one thousand patents, including three hundred children. Then came the edict of horror. Runkowski had convinced the Germans that the Ghetto warworkers were necessary for them; they concluded that no other Jews were. Twenty thousand more were to be deported; all children under ten and all adults over sixty, 17,000 in all, plus 3,000 unemployed or unemployable; exempted were the children of administrative personnel. Rumkowski's speech announcing the decree was heart-rending but ended on a stern note. He pointed out that the sacrifice of the children was necessary to save the working adults, that his whole life had been bound up with the care of children, but a greater need was now present—the survival of the Jews of the Ghetto. The Jews themselves had to carry out the action; the Germans would be too brutal and too rough with the children. To all objections he answered, "I have no strength to carry on discussions with you. If

Rumkowski was correct in his estimate of the Germans. The Jewish Police were too slow in the rounding-up process; the Germans took charge. With typical Nazi bestiality, they seized children and old people, and others at random-for a gray beard, for too many wrinkles, for too short a stature. The noise of gunfire resounded in the Chetto. From September 5 to September 12, 15,859 were deported, and about 600 shot on the spot.

Rumkowski was saddened by the loss of the children but lost no faith in the rightness of his path. He blamed the Chetto Jews for not believing him when he preached that work was their only salvation. He protected the remaining children by making them

for not believing him when he preached that work was their only salvation. He protected the remaining children by making them work in the shops; twenty percent of the labor force was made up of minors up to the age of seventeen. Work—only work—would keep the Jews of Lodz from the same fate as those of Warsaw, Vilna, Bialystok, and Cracow. By the end of 1943, eighty-five percent of the Ghetto Jews were working for the Germans. A work card meant life, meant the hope of surviving the war.

The Jews worked at a pace that more than satisfied the Germans. Provisioning of the Ghetto improved a little. Rumkowski's efforts were now directed to propitiating the Nazis so that they would let his Ghetto alone. For example, instead of taking the personal property left behind by the deportees, he had it carefully inventoried and stored for the Germans.

More than once, Rumkowski

mans.

More than once, Rumkowski thundered at the slackers who jeopardized the safety of the Ghetto, at the rumor-mongers who spread false hopes of an early German collapse.

erman collapse. His influence His influence was waning. When, early in 1944, he transmitted the German order to close down some of the shops and turn the workers over to the Germans. the workers over to the Germans, he found no ready compliance. He cut off all rations and had his Police search for those who did not show up for deportation; if they were not found, their wives were taken in their stead.

Rumkowski tried to persuade the workers that deportation did not mean death. He was helped by the classic German perfidiv post-

classic German perfidy: post ds from the "resettled," adcards from the vice on what to take, careful labelrice on what to take, careful labeling of baggage to avoid misdirection. Rumkowski organized a special department to buy the household goods of those scheduled for deportation; the price was paid in Reichsmarks, some was paid in Reichsmarks, some given immediately so that spending money would be available when the workers reached Germany (the supposed destination), the rest placed on deposit "to their account when they would return." He urged workers to volunteer for the transthem to replace Germans taken for the Army; the Russians, if they reached Lodz, would not be merciful to the Jews, who had worked so faithfully for the Nazis for five years.

so faithfully for the five years.
Slowly, slowly the Chetto was emptled out. In August came the final command: liquidate the factories, deport the workers "elsewhere." Rumkowski's habitual obedience continued. He told the Jews to go peacefully, otherwise the Germans would use brute force.
Rumkowski, with his brother

Runkowski, with his brother and his family, were among the last to leave the Chetto for the common terminus of the fianl contingents—Auschwitz.

Ironically enough, Runkowski's policy might have succeeded.

Already in the summer of 1944, the Soviet Army was rolling the Nazis back through Poland. Had the Red Army kept up the initial momentum of its summer offensive, thousands of Jews in Lodz would have been rescued.

Such was not the case. Rum-kowski's name has survived to be a hissing and a by-word.

The Lavon Affair

Israel's 'Nasty Thing'

by Shaddai Benami
For ten years two short Hebrew words have poisoned Israel's political atmosphere, causing the downfall of four government coalitions and bringing personal ruin to seven prominent statesmen and senior army officers. Reverberating even now with a thunderous echo, these words are "Haparasha" (The Affair) and "Essek-Bish" (The Nasty Thing). For reasons of national security, it is still not possible to go into details or to give an accurate interpretation of the "Nasty Thing" which caused "The Affair." (This article was received by the Jewish Digest with some evidence of having been censored in Israel—THE EDITOR).

The ten-year old affair, still the better where its poisoned in Israel—

The ten-year old affair, still the hottest thing in Israel, had its origin in 1954 when Israel faced an extremely critical situation. Angered by incursions of Arab guerrillas and armed bands of Fedayeen killers, the Israelis struck back indiscriminately, razing enemy villages and wining out. struck back indiscriminately, razing enemy villages and wiping out their military strongholds in a series of bloody punitive raids. This policy of "active retaliation" was not only resented by the Western powers but generated grave misgivings in Israel.

The West, led by the U.S., maintained that Israel's hit- and-smash raids were driving the leading Arab states into the Soviet Union's outstretched arms. Within Israel, a large and influential school of public opinion maintained that the raids and counter-raids

that the raids and counter-raids and the retaliatory expeditions served the cause of extremism on served the cause of extremism on both sides. If Israel did not trust the United Nations to do anything about it, then Israel should go to war and wipe out the danger to

existence once and for all, the critics argued. They felt that pin-prick incursions across the frontiers brought more harm than advantage to Israel. Against this background of tension and crisis, reports of American aid to Egypt strengthened the hand of the "activists."

This was also the time when the Arab states had backed out of the American sponsored Jordan River project, threatening war if Israel diverted its share of the waters unilaterally. The Israeli Armed Forces were short of jet aircraft, modern tanks, long-range artillery, armored personnel carriers, warships and air transport. The U.S. refused to sell military equipment; Britain sold only obsolete material, and France was cool.

Ben-Gurion, then Premier and Minister of Defense, advocated military action against the Arabs. At that stage he was opposed to all-out war because the UN would brand Israel an aggressor and the Western Powers would stifle it with an embargo, freeze of funds and economic blockade. But in Ben-Gurion's opinion, Israel could be saved only by military victories in the undeclared border war. The avowed purpose of the Arab guerrilla campaign was to weaken Israel from within and make it ripe for a full-scale Arab inen Israel from within and make it ripe for a full-scale Arab in-vasion.

vasion.

Ben-Gurion's plan was to kill ten Arabs for each Jew murdered by the guerrillas, blast enemy forts, attack its military camps, blow up its ammunition dumps and destroy its communications along Israel's frontiers. For the first (but not the last) time in his political career, the Israeli leader found himself outvoted in the coalition Government. Eleven of the 16 ministers present voted against Ben-Gurion's plan; three supported it and two abstained.

against Ben-Gurion's plan; three supported it and two abstained.
Ben-Gurion then resigned in a huff and went into retirement at Kibbutz Sde-Boker in the Negev Desert. Foreign Minister Moshe Sharett was chosen Prime Minister, and Pinhas Lavon, secretary-general of Mapai (the Labor Party), was named Min-

If these means failed and no satisfaction was forthcoming, either because of a Soviet veto or Western unwillingness to anger the Arabs, then Sharett was willing to mount a then Sharett was willing to mount a limited objective retaliatory raid, to punish the enemy across the border, but only in the sector in which the original outrage had been committed. This meant that if an Arab bomb was tossed near the Jerusalem "corridor," Israeli forces would attack only there, not in the Dead Sea area, the Samaria "triangle" or other sectors of their choice.

Sharett was confident that such policy of moderation would lead

Sharett was confident that such a policy of moderation would lead to increased American supportfor Israel. Whether this policy would have succeeded can never be known because he was given no oppor-tunity to test it. From the moment Sharett took over the leadership of Israel from Ben-Gurfon, Sharett became involved in the Lavon affair.

Pinhas Lavon was no military Pinhas Lavon was no military expert, but he was one of Israel's most brilliant organizers and acute-minded politicians. He had been Minister of Agriculture, secretary-general of Histadruth (Labor federation), and Mapai party chief before stepping into Ben-Gurlon's shoes as Minister of Defense. If Sharett found the going tough, for Lavon it was impossible. impossible.

The Army Command, most of the generals and the Defense Ministry coterie resented him from the outset. The Army brass adored Ben-Gurion and would have resented anyone who replaced him against his will. Lavon's arrogant against his will. Lavon's arrogant approach to military affairs, his insistence that a Minister of insistence that a Minister Defense did not have to be military expert but primarily administrator and efficier expert, brought matters to boiling point.

Under Israel

Under Israeli law, the Min-ister of Defense is the peace-time commander-in-chief. (In time commander-in-chief. (In war-time, the Prime Minister takes over as supreme commander. Under Ben-Gurion's and Eshkol's administration, this division of authority was avoided by uniting the posts of Prime Minister and Minister of Defense.)
But ton Army officers rearred. Minister and Minister of Defense.) But top Army officers regarded Lavon as a political choice. They rarely, if ever, consulted with him. Whenever major decisions of national security had to be made, the Army brass and Defense Ministry officials went to Sde Boker to consult the "Old Man." When Lavon learned of this, his vanity and pressing were sting, and he

Lavon learned of this, his vanity and prestige were stung and he tried to crack down on the generals by forcing them to resign and putting others in their place.

While this intrigue was being spun by, around and against Lavon, a senior Israeli officer decided to launch an operation. Had it succeeded as planned, it might have brought immense benefits to Israel. The risk of failure was great and the price of failure was national catastrophe. This is the operation now known as the "Nasty Thing."

The officer took his operational plans for final approval to a person whose name cannot be mentioned.

whose name cannot be mentioned. What followed has been the subject What followed has been the subject of countless investigations by commissions of inquiry and forms the core of "The Affair." Under standing regulations, the Commanding General had to inform the Chief of the General Staff, request his approval and get the signature of the Commander-in-Chief, i.e., the Minister of Defense. The Chief of the General Staff, Moshe Dayan, was then out of the country, so he is in the clear. But six conflicting versions of what happened next still poison the atmosphere and turn friends into bitter enemies.

Lavon claims that the whole business was a plot to frame him on charges of security negligence, (Continued on Following Page)

(Continued from Preceding Page) to get rid of him as Minister of Defense and to ruin his political future so that he could never challenge Ben-Gurion as Mapai party boss and possible successor. Which is exactly what happened. The question is WHY? Lavon claims he was not informed of the "Nasty Thing" operation when it was projected and insists he would never have approved such a crazy and dangerous scheme. Further, he says, he never heard of it until it backfired, and he charges that his enemies forged documents to pin the blame on him insisting that he is innocent, unjustly accused and wronged. Lavon still waits for his rehabilitation, despite the fact that a Government-appointed inquiry committee headed by then Minister of Justice, Pinhas Rosen, cleared him of all charges and reestablished his innocence. Levi Eshkol's

of Justice, Pinhas Rosen, cleared him of all charges and reestablished his innocence. Levi Eshkol's vote to rehabilitate Lavon caused Ben-Gurion's "final" resignation towards the end of 1962.

Ben-Gurion claims, on the basis of documents and knowledge available to him, that Lavon had in fact approved the "Nasty Thing" operation. It was his view that if Lavon evidenced lack of understanding of its particulars, it was only because he was unsuitable as Minister of Defense and knew next to nothing of security matters. Ben-Gurion's position is that by his approval of the operation, Lavon brought Israel to the brink of ruin.

Moshe Dayan says that Lavon did not know of the "Nasty Thing" operation when it was planned or launched, but that he was informed immediately upon Dayan's return to Israel, that is, some four weeks after the operation began. Had Lavon wanted to, Dayan believes he could have halted the operation before it got out of hand, but he did nothing and let it run its calamitous course. Whatever Lavon's motives, perhaps he was afraid to interfere with an operation of such importance and scope, but his inaction and lack of clear-cut decision showed him to be unsuitable for the Ministry to be unsuitable for the Ministry of Defense post, says Dayan. Nevertheless, he agrees that Lavon is innocent of the "Nasty Thing"

itself.

Senior Officer Number One, whose name cannot be mentioned even today, says he showed the documents pertaining to the "Nasty Thing" operation to Lavon and that Lavon himself signed the necessary operational orders. Lavon denies this, insisting his signatures are crude forgeries, the work of the Senior Officer who wanted to clear himself and pin the blame on Lavon. A commission of inquiry ordered the Senior inquiry ordered the Senior icer's resignation from the

officer's resignation from the military service. The commission also found that Lavon's signatures were indeed forgeries but turned up no evidence to link the Senior Officer with having perpetrated the forgery himself.

Senior Officer Number Two, also nameless for security reasons, says Lavon was shown the operational plans, did not sign them but approved them verbally. This officer, too, was forced to resign by the commission of inquiry which held he was negligent of duty because he had not insisted on Lavon's signature and gave the green light for the operation on the alleged verbal OK of the minister.

minister.

Officer Number Three, also known as "The Third Man," is now in prison. He was originally sentenced to 12 years on charges of treason. This was later reduced by the Supreme Court to 10 years and the charge of treason altered to the lesser offense of "unauthorized possession of top-secret documents." Both trials—by a military tribunal and the Supreme Court—were held behind closed doors. The "Third Man" was in actual charge of the operation. actual charge of the operation. When the "Nasty Thing" failed, he saved his own skin. He had never betrayed Israel.

The Supreme Court did not go into this because enough evidence was presented to convict the "Third Man" on the charge of possessing top-secret documents. (Continued on Following Page)

Who Was Right? The Zealots Or The Moderates

The intractable resistance of the Zealots to the Roman power resulted in the four-year siege of Jerusalem, one of the most heroic and hopeless struggles ever recorded in history. Josephus has described in several horrifying chapters the sufferings of the doomed people, dying from famine and internecine strife as well as from the weapons of the Roman legions. People fought like animals for scraps of food; one demented mother even ate her own child. Ultimately, the entire city was destroyed and many thousands were stroyed and many thousands were executed with a barbarity rare

stroyed and many thousands were executed with a barbarity rare even in those savage times.

The Moderates opposed the policy of the Zealots, urging that it was possible to make a temporal peace with Rome, while concentrating on the glories of Israel's spiritual heritage. Yohanan Ben-Zakkai established his famous academy at the very time that the State was being destroyed. It took Jewry many centuries to recover from the agony sustained in this effort to defy imperial Rome, There was, tragically, almost a measure of truth in Titus' claim: "Judah has been destroyed."

Were the Moderates or the Zealots right in the crucial dispute as to the attitude Jewry should adopt towards imperial Rome?

Dr. David Flusser is recognized throughout the world as one of the greatest living authorities on his subject. Scholars, rabbis and Christian prelates come to his home in Jerusalem and debate with him vexed questions of the past. Edmund Wilson, the eminent author and critic, devoted several pages of his study on The Scrolls from the Dead Sea to a description of Flusser in action.

"The love of the Zealots seems to me to spring from that strange love of tragedy which we find among the Jews," comments Dr. Flusser. "For example, we have

To clear himself of treason charges, he kept a batch of secret documents in his home, and this proved his undoing. He is due to be released from prison next year. He claims Lavon knew nothing of the operation and swears that Lavon was informed of the "Nasty Thing" only after its failure when a scanegoat was needed.

Perhaps future historians will be able to determine who is right and who is wrong. The dismal failure of the "Nasty Thing" brought about Lavon's dismissal as Minister of Defense. Sharett was forced to offer the post to Ben-Gurion who then tossed Sharett out of the cabinet, running his political career, too.

was forced to offer the post to Sen-Gurion who then tossed Sharett out of the cabinet, ruining his political career, too.

When Ben-Gurion again took over Israel's destiny and military muscle, things got moving again in the right direction. Although the losses sustained in the "Nasty Thing" operation were staggering, Ben-Gurion acted quickly and resolutely to minimize their impact. In the end, he evened out the losses by some political-strategic gains. It is to his credit that he knew how to extricate Israel from the morass of the "Nasty Thing."

But if Ben-Gurion was right does that mean that Pinhas Lavon was wrong. Not at all, on the basis of available testimony from the principal heroes and villiains of Israel's greates and still most secret drama. Ben-Gurion was simply more quickwitted and capable of taking historic decisions under stress than Lavon. Was simply more quickwitted and capable of taking historic decisions under stress than Lavon, the complexity by the pro-Ben-Gurion coteries of Army generals? Not really. They did not know that the "Nasty Thing" would boomerang or they would not have launched it. Perhaps they even consulted Lavon, verbally. But they certainly framed him afterwards.

in Israel an insurance company
called 'Massada.' Now Massada
was a fortress which collapsed
completely after a long siege. The
defense was heroic, but the defeat
was absolute. It is hardly a name
to inspire confidence in impregnable security, giving an impression such as insurance companies like to create. I have never pression such as insurance com-panies like to create. I have never heard of an English insurance com-pany called 'Hastings,' or a French company called 'Waterloo.' Yet we Jews seem to glory in our suf-

company called 'Waterloo.' Yet we Jews seem to glory in our sufferings.

"Practically considered, it is clear that the Zealots could not succeed. When we study them, we tend, because of our new nationalist feeling, to think that they are not nearly as bad as Josephus makes them out to be, because, we say, Josephus must have been influenced by his own position as a servant of the Romans. But this kindly interpretation of the Zealots is not correct, since Josephus' negative opinion is found also in rabbinical sources. We have critical comments of the Zealots in the Babylonian Talmud and in the Midrash."

He interrupts himself to search for the appropriate references in his library and we pore over them for some considerable time.

"So you see, we cannot dismiss Josephus simply because we don't like his sentiments about the Romans. I don't think that the Zealots were any more lovable than Josephus. This killing of the High Priest and the assassination of fellow-Jews who opposed their policy are not really beautiful acts to be admired.

"The basic question to consider

"The basic question to consider is whether there was ever any possibility of the insurrection suc-ceeding. It is quite clear that it was doomed from the very beginning and that it was undertaken without regard to the consewithout regard to the consequences. The Zealots' only hope was that they might find allies in the Parthian Empire, but this was so forlorn a chance that it can be dismissed. In fact, there were many hopeless insurrections against the Roman Empire at the time, and the Jewish Messianic movements, considered from the practical point of view, were only manifestations of this resistance. "The central opinion of the Zealots was that God had given the Jews two yokes — that of the Torah and that of Rome. They maintained that the acceptance of the Torah depended upon the abolition of foreign domination. The rabbis, on the other hand, believed that the cause of the Torah was not served by undertaking a foredoomed revolution.

"The attitude that Rome had to be overcome to establish the Torah, created a situation favorable to pseudo-Messiahs claiming that they would lead the nation to freedom. One particular family from thout regard to the conse-ences. The Zealots only hope

One particular family from Galilee, that of Judah, became the leading claimants to the title of Messiah, as well as the leaders of the Zealots. Judah was killed and then Menachem, who was either his son or his grandson — I think his grandson — became the leader, but he was also killed. This Messianic character of the insurrection blurred its political aims, which were, in fact, as I have said, utterly without chance of fulfillment. of fulfillment

Yohanan Ben-Zakkai and other rabbis were against the war be-cause it was futile. This does not make them opportunists, but merely means that they believed in the possibility of peaceful co-exis-tence."



"We can say that the first of the Zealots was Mattiyahu the Maccabee, whose last testimony was a call to the Jews: Be zealous for the Law, and give your lives for the Covenant of your fathers. There is another reference to 'Pinhas, our father, for that he was zealous exceedingly, obtained the covenant of an everlasting priesthood."

"The later Hasmoneans, the descendants of Mattityahu, who ruled in subsequent years, deserted the rigid path set for them by him and came to terms with Hellenism. But the spirit which inspired the early Maccabees is clearly the same as that of the subsequent Zealots of the first century of his era — they were opposed to Hellenism because it endangered the Torah. Remember that the first act of the Maccabees was to clean out the Temple.

"Greece was replaced by Rome, but Hellenism remained

that the first act of the Mac-cabees was to clean out the Temple.
"Greece was replaced by Rome, but Hellenism remained the enemy. Now who were the Jews who were attracted to Hellenism? They were the rich merchants and the landowners, the people who came into contact with the great world through commerce. They admired Roman institutions because they were familiar with admired Roman institutions be-cause they were familiar with them. Their ideal was the polis, the great city with its markets and culture.

"That is probably the reason why the center of the Zealots was in Galiles, because that was a

why the center of the Zealots was in Galilee, because that was a region remote from the metropolis in Jerusalem. It was natural that these peasants in Galilee should disapprove of the wealthy class coming to terms with the Romans and making Jerusalem a Romanstyle metropolis. style metropolis.

style metropolis.

"Together with this economic and social motivation, there was also the belief that it was not enough to wait for the Messiah, but that it was essential to take action to facilitate his arrival by driving out the Romans.

"It is dangerous to use modern terms about the past, because the conditions were so different, but

conditions were so different, but we might call the Zealots the ac-tivists as compared to the more passive Moderates.

passive Moderates.
"I don't agree that the Zealots
knew that their cause was hopeless
and yet proceeded with the doomknew that their cause was hopeless and yet proceeded with the doomed insurrection purely from a love of martyrdom. They believed that Parthia would be on their side — as anxious as they were to drive Rome westward. There were many Jews in Babylon, and the Zealots though these Jews could gain powerful support for their cause. Josephus tells us that Titus, when urging the Zealots to surrender, kept assuring them that Parthia was not going to help them. Now, we know that the Zealots erred in their political calculations, but it was an intelligent and realistic political estimate of possibilities which might have occurred.

"Now the Zealots faced aproblem which all poor people face when they start a revolution. How were they to finance a war against a great power?

(Continued from Preceding Page) were accused. They attacked the rich Jews, both because these Jews wanted peace, and because they had to obtain from them the means to fight the Romans. It is true that this involved theft and even murder which we see often in history. Again I want to warn against drawing paraillels with modern nationalism, since conditions then were quite unlike conditions then were quite unlike conditions then our century, and ideals were different, but we do see the same type of action in our own day. In Yugoslavia, the partisans robbed the rich and fought their opponents among their own people as well as the Germans. In Russia, the Bolsheviks robbed trains. Here we had the Irgun Idealists who stole money from banks. So I would say that the Zealots would be correctly described as activists; it is not fair to dismiss them as crazed fanatics or criminals. They were living in a situation where they had to fight their own wealthy class as well as the foreign enemy.

"It is true that they failed, but

"It is true that they failed, but failure does not automatically make their cause invalid.
"Even Josephus, the Jew who went over to the Romans, has one passage which indicates an opinion of the Zealots quite different from that expressed in other chapters of his book. See The Jewish Wars Book 7, Chapter 10."

He finds the passage and reads: "Everybody was amazed at their courage, or whether we ought to call it madness or hardiness in their opinions. For when all sorts of torments and vexations of their

of torments and vexations of their bodies that could not be devised were made use of to them, they could not get any one of them to comply so far as to confess that Caesar was their lord; but they preserved their own opinion, in spite of all the distress they were brought to, as if they received these torments and the fire itself with bodies insensible of pain, and with a soul that in a manner rejoiced under them. So far does the strength of the courage of the soul prevail over the weakness of the body. of torments and vexations of their

the strength of the courage of the soul prevail over the weakness of the body.

"It's always easy to commend the social motives of men who burn tax records, as the Zealots did," concedes Dr. Flusser. "But I don't think you can really describe the actions of the Zealots as a social and economic movement by the oppressed peasants against the decadent merchants in love with Hellenism. There were movements of poor people among the Jews of that era, such as the Essenes and the Christians. Idon't necessarily approve of these social Essenes and the Christians. Idon't necessarily approve of these social movements, but they were at least clearly defined in their social aims. I don't see any social philosophy among the Zealots.

"It is very important to remember that they opposed the Temple aristocracy and the responsible leaders as well as the merchants.— they virtually force-

sponsible leaders as well as the merchants — they virtually forced the entire nation to come in with them in a hopeless revolt. I find it very difficult to love them any more because they fought internal battles, robbed and murdered other lews.

dered other Jews.
"I will concede that the position "I will concede that the position is very complex and that after a certain time it does seem that the whole nation decided to collaborate with them. But even then they went on attacking their fellow-Jews. We have the descriptions in Josephus of their excesses, which are borne out by the rabbinical sources.

sources.

"I approve of the revolt of Bar-Kochba, even though it too was doomed to fail, while I dislike the Zealots. There were many differences. Ber-Kochba was supported wholeheartedly by most of the rabbis, among them the great Rabbi Akiva. He made a genuine effort to estimate the political situation correctly and he prepared a careful and well-planned campaign. He did not attack his fellow-Jews but fought against Rome for religious liberty. Bar-Kochba was a very religious pious Kochba was a very religious plous man who did not claim to be the Messiah, but signed his docu-ments Nast, President of the Jews. have that terrible character which we find in hopeless enterprises: men engaged in atrocities against their own brothers, when they know that the cause is lost. Look at the French Revolution or the Spanish Civil War. I wonder how the lovers of the activism of the Zealots can approve the killing of the High Priest?

the High Priest?

"I much prefer the way chosen by Yohanan Ben-Zakkai, with his love of peace and his more mature and rational approach. He was a true disciple of Hillel.

"It is interesting to reflect how different our history would have been, if the Zealots had succeeded in their activism. At the time of the Antonines it was not so difficult to live at peace with the Romans, although ideologically the Jews were always in opposition to the pagan world. Yet peaceful coexistence between Rome and Judaism was already indicated as desirable in many passages in the sirable in many passages in the rabbinical writings.

rabbinical writings.

"In my opinion, the true strength of Judaism is that it can live in the world, despite difficulties, with a constant hope for political, social and metaphysical salvation. I think that the way of Yohanan Ben-Zakkai was more in tune with this underlying truth."

Moshe Beer understands why the Zealots came under the censure of some of the rabbis of the day.

"The situation is confused —
not all the rabbis were against them," he says, "but many were critical of the methods they used. I myself do not approve of such methods as robbery and murder, but I understand how the Zealots felt that they had to use them to engage in the war. The issue can be put simply — can a man use immoral means to attain a noble end? Some rabbis said no, but it is not a simple matter."

The young lecturer at Bar Ilan University is very reluctant to play the fascinating game of "What would have happened if...?" believing that a historian must deal with what happened rather than with what might have happened. But, pushed to express an opinion, he asserts: "I very much doubt if Jewry would still exist if it had not been for the Zealots, who became the prototypes for Jewish resistance. Bar-Kochba's resistance in 135 CE seems to be exactly the same as the Zealots' revolt of 70 CE, In his case, also, the rabbis were divided in their attitudes. Yet Bar-Kochba fought Rome for four years. We must ask ourselves how the Jews were able to defy great Rome for so long—like a fly nearly bringing an elephant to its knees. It was because of the Zealots, who taught the Jews to fight, and if necessary to die, for Kiddush Hashem."

(Continued from Preceding Page) different from other Americans, his answer is simple. "We have a different religion," he says. If we press him, then, to explain the Jewish religion to us, he is at a loss. But if we insist, he ultimately tells us that "It is just like other religions. You know, the Golden Rule. Do not do unto others what you would not have them do unto you."

His tendency is to speak of Judaism as a kind of generalized humanistic ethics. He is often totally ignorant of the vast buld of the sacred law and lore of Judaism. And he has at best a limited knowledge of "Bible stories"—rather than afamiliarity with the Bible. Only the exception has any faith in a supreme being or a conviction that his life should be ordered in accordance with God's will.

Thus, while most American Jews lack any deep religious feeling, we find that they act out a certain number and kind of religion—associated modes of conduct. A majority now "belong" to a temple or synagogue, but on any given week—end only about a quarter of these affiliated persons attend weekly services. An overwhelming majority do mark the Kabbith in some way at home. Almost all send young children to a religious school. But these forms of conduct are only superficially religious and ten often to be social rather than devotional in character.

Because the individual congregant lacks the knowledge, or impulse, the rabbi leads the prayers and in so doing is often praying for the congregation. The congregants seem to see themselves as an "audience" and discuss the rabbi's sermon in the same terms the decays a performer in the

an audience and discuss the rabbi's sermon in the same terms they discuss a performer in the theater. Individual prayer is rare.

If we pursue this examination of the behavior of American Jews to discoer what being a Jew really means to them, we find other elements which our "average" Jew has not voiced. He tends to associate socially almost exclusively with other Jews. He is a joiner of organization. (Nine out of every ten American Jews belong to at least one organization, whereas this is ture of only one of every two Americans as a whole.) But he is much more likely to belong to Jewish than to non-sectarian organizations.

Before we look further, let us go back and see what has happened here. For most of the Jewish im-migrants who came to this country, there were two major drives; the achievement of economic security, for their children if not for themselves; and Americanization. Their children, like the children of

most immigrant groups, rejected that in their parents which seemed alien to America; and for Jewish immigrants, Judaism and Jewish-ness were included in the "alien."

But there was another factor at work. The long history of discrimination (and the prejudice and discrimination they found in America, too) produced an effect common to all minority groups—the sense that one's own group and background are of lesser worth than that of the majority. Thus, for American Jews, both the pressures of daily convenience and the impulse to be "like" Christians have led by and large to the dropping of traditional daily habits and the weakening of group mores. On the other hand, "likeness" in America seemed to demand a religious association. Hence the definition that Jewish distinctiveness consists of no more (as in Laura Hobson's Gentleman's Agreement) than a difference in the manner of worship—even if, indeed, the group belong-ingness is more important to us

even if, indeed, the group belong-ingness is more important to us than the faith or its demands. This matter of majority group status is related to other di-lemmas of today's American Jews. In a number of community surveys of Jews, we asked the parents of (Continued on Following Page)



(Continued from Preceding Page) young children what kind of mixture they would like to see in the public schools which their children attend. In every instance, a majority fxpressed the hope for a school population "about evenly divided" between Jews and non-Jews. But when we asked them, then, to estimate the proportion of Jewish children in the schools their children now attend, a majority said it was over 75%, and a large proportion that it was over 90%. Thus we see the workings of a social process, whereby Jewish parents, each seeking a school where their children would not feel themselves part of a minority, produced a situation in which their children formed the vast majority of the pupils.

minority, produced a situation in which their children formed the vast majority of the pupils.

In the latest survey we directed, in a city in which Jews are approximately ten percent of the total population, the interviewers said: "I want you to stop and think for a minute and decide who are your three best friends. (Pause.) Now tell me how many of these are Jewish." It turned out that over 70% of our sample said that all three of their best friends are Jewish. The tendency for the social circles of Jews to be wholly Jewish is too obvious to need additional comment.

Of course, this phenomenon is related to the fear of rejection and hurt. We must ask ourselves though, whether this fear is commensurate with the realities. Certainly, there have been predicted.

mensurate with the realities. Certainly there has been prejudice against Jews, and there are still areas in which such prejudice—and its consequence, discrimination—continue to exist. But on the other hand, examination of surveys conducted over the last 25 years reveals that there has been a consistent and marked trend toward the reduction of expressions of hostle feelings toward Jews by Americans as a whole. There has been a notable reduction of discrimination against Jews in housing, employment, education mensurate with the realities. Cerhousing, employment, education and many other areas of our

society.

We must wonder, then, whether the abstention of Jews from relationships with others is in truth an accurate estimate of the immediate situation with any given non-Jew, or whether it is a reflection of "group memory" of discrimination and its lingering psychological effects. Joseph H. Douglass, writing on The Effects of Minority Status on Children, said, "it appears that minority children and youth tend to approach relationships with other humans on an unsure psychological footing with lowered call. accurate estimate of the imhumans on an unsure psychological footing, with lowered self-esteem, mistrust, and hostility, and with anxiety concerning anticipated responses. . The individual is unable to give and receive from others spontageously.

dividual is unable to give and receive from others spontaneously and unreservedly." This seems to be true, as well, for many American Jewish adults.

Now we have come full circle. For Mr. Douglass' "lowered self-esteem" surely brings us back to the Jew's view of his Jewishness. To esteem one's self requires that one should know what he is, understand its meaning and regard it as having walls.

quires that one should know what he is, understand its meaning and regard it as having value, even if—or perhaps for the very reason that—it means being different.

A couple of years ago, Commentary magazine published a symposium of "younger Jewish intellectuals," persons of Jewish origin with a record of some achievement in the fields of scholarship, art and literature. The symposium aroused a furor in the "jewish community" because many of these young people in the "jewish community" be-cause many of these young people said that they found no value in their Jewish background. One of the criticisms they expressed was that as they looked at the Jews around them, it seemed to them that being Jewish meant only a kind of tribal cohesiveness and the worship of middle-class stan-dards, that is, to seek to be like all other middle-class white Americans.

America, of the Ben Gurion thesis, and of their own future as a group, and as individuals.

Much of the struggle of Jewish organizations in America to overcome anti-Semitism here was based on the premise that America is a new kind of society, in which it is possible for a group to achieve both full civic equality and the maintenance of its distinctive character. It would be one of the great ironies of history if for the Jews in America this opportunity led to neither: not a sense of equality and not a meaningful Jewish heritage.

For what we seem to be wit-

ingful Jewish heritage.

For what we seem to be witnessing is both a thinning out of the Jewish heritage and its values (divorce rate going up, alcoholism increasing) and simultaneously a psychological incapacity to feel like equals. If this tendency should continue, we would be failing not only ourselves, but America as well. For what the American future demands of the groups whose existence it encourages is that they should pour into the stream of American life their heritage and the values of their particular outlook.

look.

We must ask ourselves whether we are judging correctly the nature of American society and of own acceptance in it. A Catholic editor, reporting in 1962 on his participation in a Jewish-Catholic all-day conference, said:

"The Jews, it seems to me, are still gravely disturbed and troubled over the question of their acceptance in the American society, and their actions manifest that unease."

Is he right? Writing recently

Is he right? Writing recently on the question of Jewish identity in America, Dr. John Slawson, of the American Jewish Committee, expressed the view that "never, perhaps, in American history, has the prevailing social framework afforded as great an opportunity for the development of lewish self-regard as exists today.

opportunity for the development of Jewish self-regard as exists today. Pluralism, with all its implications for group identity, is no longer a theory in America; it is a fact."

Will American Jews, with this opportunity, bear out Mr. Ben Gurion's prediction? It is in this connection that the multiple Jewish 'debating societies," both group and individual, seem to this writer a good and necessary augury for the future, For it appears to us that we stand on the threshold of what may be a great renascence, and the 'debating societies' can be the means toward such a rebirth, depending upon the decisions they reach.

With the end of large-scale

birth, depending upon the decisions they reach.

With the end of large-scale Jewish immigration from other countries, with almost all American Jews now native-born here, we can be at the beginning of an evolution of a way of being Jewish attuned to the American scene, as at earlier times there evolved a Spanish Judaism, a German Judaism, a Polish Judaism—and now there is evolving an Israeli Judaism.

All these others, however, have had in common a consistent central element embodied in the vast sacred literature—and in the

central element embodied in the vast sacred literature—and in the historical experience of the Jewish people. I am often asked whether I can recommend a single book which will summarize the essence of what it means to be a Jew. No, I can't. There is no instant Jewish identity. But for us to express and expand that core of Jewish values, we must know what the nucleus itself has been.

American Jews, then, must make some decisions. They must decide whether they are prepared to delve into the Jewish background and arrive at a level of Knowledge and arrive at a level of knowledge and arrive at a level of knowledge about Jewish matters commensurate with their knowledge of, day, modern painting, or child psychology. 

He had done this, he said, in order to cast his lot with those determined to fight against the subjugation of the Negro in the United States. In those days one found prejudice and sanctimonious justification for the submerging of the Negro population of the country on all sides. He could recall the time when a Southern politician ran for the office of United States Senator on a platform advocating the observance of the "golden rule" and the subjugation of the Negro.

They will be converted into an army of hirelings bought and bribed from time to time to break down the strength and dignity and self-respect of the American toiler. Make the Negro a Cossak and the end will be tragic, but no less tragic will be the consequences to the American industrial democracy which will have wrought this deadly evil and terrible injustice to the two races.

The current controversial play "The Deputy" by Rolf Hochhuth, which focuses attention on the failure of Pope Pius Xii to speak out in protest against the Nazi destruction of six million Jews, painfully recalls the struggle which Stephen Wise waged unremittingly against Hitlerism in the tragic years of Jewish suffering under the Nazis. There were others beside the Pope who could stand accused of washing their hands of the most monstrous crime in history. Wise recorded the cynical indifference of the American State Department officials as well as officials of the British Foreign Office at a time when action could have saved Jewish lives.

In his autobiography Challenging Years, Wise told of a visit he made to the White House at a time when Jews were being killed in Poland at the rate of six thousand

In his autobiography Challenging Years, Wise told of a visit he made to the White House at a time when Jews were being killed in Poland at the rate of six thousand a day. He informed President Roosevelt that he had had word from World Jewish Congress head-quarters in Geneva that a group of Nazi functionaries were prepared to let a number of Polish Jews go on condition that American sums of money be placed in escrow with American legation in Berne as ranson, the sums not to be payable until after the declaration of peace. Roosevelt authorized the Treasury Department to issue a license for the transfer of the money. Wise then related the shocking account of the delay and sabotage by State Department bureaucrats abetted by the British Foreign Office. (The details were later revealed by Treasury Secretary Henry Morgenthau.) It was not until December that instructions were finally issued — five full months after the same license had been approved by the President of the United States, the Secretary of State and the Secretary of the Treasury. He added: "Let history, therefore, recordfor all time that if it were not for the State Department and Foreign Office bureaucratic bungling and callousness, thousands of lives might have been saved."

With regard to the question of guilt for the Jewish holocaust Wise pointed out clearly that Christian Germany did not stand alone in its a basement. Most of Christian Europe was little, if at all, better. Nor was the Christian population of America without fault. Occasionally voices of protest were heard — Cadman, Holmes, Atkinson, McConnell and Mundelein. But

But the dominant purpose of America was not to help save the victims of Nazism whose lives hung by a thread, but was limited mostly to keeping America out of war. Wise noted that the Jews were not the only victims of American lack of concern and its isolationism; the French and British democracies were endangered by these attitudes. He knew, while he was struggling against insuperable odds to save the Jews, that it was melancholy testimony to the Christian conscience that had it not been for the Pearl Harbor the Christian conscience that had it not been for the Pearl Harbor disaster the Jews of many more lands would have perished. It was because of his deep disappointment over the failure of American Christendom to publicly condemn the Nazi massacres of Jews that his interest in interreligious good-will movements waned

will movements waned. Wise's concern about American Wise's concern about American Christianity extended beyond its lack of indignation over the Nazi destruction of Jewish life. It also embraced the problem of peace in the atomic age. Already aware of the terrible implications of the Hiroshima bomb he wrote in 1948;

(Continued from Preceding Page) destruction. . . . This is the pro-test that lies today before mankind. At such times have men not the right to expect that Christianity, right to expect that Christianity, the greatest religious force in the Western world should make itself deeply and decisively felt? Is there not reason to believe, or even hope that this might become Christianity's finest hour? . . . I believe that the churches of Christendom are not for the most part intent. are not for the most part intent upon averting the war of wars... One understands that religionists one understands that religionists cannot be sympathetic to a nation that exalts atheism and denies its people freedom of religion. But shall the churches of God and their peoples in the Western world find atheism in Communist lands more imperiling than the most godless of all things — the infinite wrongs, destructions and defilements of

war?

One of the great difficulties confronting American Jews today is to find a united Jewish voice. It stems from the failure of, recognizing the importance of the idea of the peoplehood of Israel adumbrated by Theodor Herzl in his famous work The Jewish State. Wise, a faithful disciple of Herzl, advanced this concept in Diaspora life through the Congress movement, His conception of the American Jewish Congress and the World Jewish Congress was that of the lewish Congress was that of the jewish Congress was that of the common ties and interests that undergird all Jewish life and activity everywhere. Where Zionism was concerned with a Jewish homeland radiating inspiration to Jews abroad, the Jewish Congress was conceived as a greater wifeling. conceived as a greater unifying force because it would not be inforce because it would not be in-hibited by nationality per se and because it could the more readily speak for all the Jews of the world through duly elected representa-tives from all lands. Wise had to tives from all lands, wise had to fight against strong opposition in his advocacy of democratically elected leaders whose mandate came from masses of Jews. "With the passing of the years," he said, I have come more clearly to un-derstand the bitterness, the almost fanatical opposition to the Con-gress of certain primarily assimi-lationist Jewish groups. From

fanatical opposition to the Congress of certain primarily assimilationist Jewish groups. From these there had long come not only a fantastic denial of the existence of a world Jewish problem, but the declaration or implication that Jews in all lands were united, if at all, solely on religious or theological grounds. True it is that religion is one of the elements in the life of the Jew, the chief element. But being a religious people does not alter the fact that we are a people. Subconsciously it was are a people. Subconsciously it was felt by the enemies of the concept of Jewish peoplehood that the position of the Jew would be less hazardous and insecure if Jews in England and America alike insisted that anti-Semitism was merely a fortuitous and fugitive anti-Jewish phenomenon and not aworldwide problem related to the conditions of Jewish existence, and particularly the homelessness of the Jewish people. are a people. Subconsciously it was felt by the enemies of the concept of

Stephen Wise saw Jewish life
whole. He was a liberal rabbi by
choice, but he took in the totality
of Jewish thinks article in the outlook. He revealed this attitude in an interesting fashion in his contribution to the New Palestine issue celebrating the founding of the Hebrew University in Jerusalem forty years ago. He expressed the thought that this Jewish center of learning could have a unifying effect on the diverse camps in Jewish life. "Who knows," he asked, "but that liberal Judaism may be rejudaized and that Orthodox rather than historic Judaism may be liberated through the impact of the Hebrew university on Jewish life in its entirety?" He believed that every manner of learning ought to have its own idiom and setting and background. He revealed this attitude in an in-

background.

Referring to the famous Juedische Wissenschaft school of
learning in Germany, he declared
that it had often been more German than Jewish, and that East
European Jewish life, whether Orthodox of the strictest type or reflection of the radicalism of an
unroused intelligence was for the uprooted intelligence, was for the most part more East European than Jewish. With regard to Ameri-

(Continued from Page 28-A) ther being Jewish shall mean having only Jewish friends, or wether it shall also mean a set of values and a particular outlook upon God, man and the world. They must clarify whether their "religion" is to mean only the erection of resplendent temples and synagogues which they visit only on the High Holy Days and for an occasional organization meeting. They must decide whether they hire the rabbit to represent their Jewishness or to help them reach new insights and to help arouse and amplify their consciences. They must decide, finally, whether being Jewish has true meaning and value to themselves and to their children, and what that meaning is.

true meaning and value to themselves and to their children, and what that meaning is.

American Jews, in short, must decide between being merely a social group in the guise of a religious group and being a group of Americans moved by a particular and distinctive religious and cultural heritage. If we choose the latter, we must work at knowing understanding and being motivated by the vast body of Jewish law and lore. We must close the gap between our high level of general education and our virtual illiteracy in Jewish matters. As we cannot deputize the Judaizing of our children to others, so can we not assign to others the expression of our own Jewish identity and commitment.

Only in this way can the Jewish heritage come to life as a guide for today's problems and as a source of self-esteem for ourselves as Jews. If this occurs, the hesitancies and uncertainties about our relationships to other

the hesitancies and uncertainties about our relationships to other Americans will be reduced. Seeing ourselves as an American Jewish group, in some ways different from other but not inferior to other Americans, contributing a valuable strand to American life, we will achieve the sense of equality as well as its forms. The pluralist society will both assure the survival of and derive value from a group imbued with the Judaic vision, maintaining and expanding its heritage. heritage.

These are the lines of the debate. How will we decide?

He himself furnished us the answers by his vision and his courage.
