## First Annual Meeting Of Schechter Day School

The first annual meeting of the Solomon Schechter Day School of Rhode Island will be held on Tuesday evening, June 26, at 8 p.m. in the foyer of the meeting house of Temple Emanu-El. At that time, the new officers and board of directors for 1979-82 will be presented.

Daniel Kaplan will be installed as the second president of the Solomon Schechter Day School. An attorney with the law firm of Pollack, Adler, and Sheehan, Mr. Kaplan is a graduate of Vanderbilt University and the University of Texas Law School. He has lived in Rhode Island only two years, yet in that time he has become firmly committed to the Rhode Island Jewish community and especially to improving its Jewish education. Dan, his wife Cindy, and their four-year-old daughter, Hyla, live in Barrington.

Mr. Kaplan succeeds Sanford I. Kroll as president. As president of Lincoln Controls, vice president of Temple Emanu-El, and a former president of the Bureau of Jewish Education of Rhode Island, Mr. Kroll's main interest has always been the pursuit of excellence in Jewish education. This concern has made him a moving force behind the organization and in the realization of the Solomon Schechter Day School.

## Israel Protests To UN

UNITED NATIONS (JTA): Israel protested "vigorously and emphatically" to the United Nations over the attempt by a Nigerian army officer serving with the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL) to smuggle weapons and explosives to Palestine Liberation Organization agents in Israel.

In a letter to UN Secretary General Kurt Waldheim, Israel's Ambassador to the UN, Yehuda Blum requested that "action be taken forthwith to prevent once and for all any recurrence of such acts which, you will surely agree, are in flagrant violation of UNIFIL's peace-keeping mandate." Blum stated in his letter, "As you are aware, this is not the first time that a soldier serving with UNIFIL has been caught red-handed while attempting to smuggle into Israel arms and explosives for the terrorist PLO. I am instructed to protest vigorously and emphatically against this repeated criminal abuse of a UN peace-keeping force to serve as a cover for cooperation with PLO terrorists despite assurances received from the UN to take action to prevent the recurrence of activities of this kind. The acts of terror carried out by PLO criminals against innocent civilians in Israel, whether successful or not, demonstrate the special gravity of such actions."

Blum observed that "Anyone aiding and abetting the PLO in its activities aimed at indiscriminate mass murder of civilians bears a heavy responsibility, particularly if he happens to be a member and a high ranking officer at that, of a UN force."

Boleslavs Maikovskis, who is suspected of being a Nazi war criminal. The attack took place in Mr. Maikovskis' yard, and the victims were house guests.

According to the Nassau County police, Vladislav Civezelis was stabbed in the back and cut on the head, and his wife, Marta, was knocked to the ground and suffered a fractured wrist and nose injury.

The assailant, who had gained admittance by saying he was a newspaper reporter, fled. He had tried vainly to get Mr. Civezelis to identify himself as Mr. Maikovskis.

Later in the day WINS, the New York City news radio station, reported that a man who identified himself as a member of the Jewish Executioners With Silence had called the station to accept responsibility for the attack and to say that he thought he had wounded Mr. Maikovskis.

Mr. Maikovskis is a 74-year-old native of Latvia who has been accused by World War II survivors of atrocities against Jews. In 1965 he was sentenced to death in absentia by a court in Riga, the capital of Soviet Latvia, on charges of murder. The United States Immigration and Naturalization Service has moved to deport Mr. Maikovskis, accusing him of hiding his personal history when he entered this country.

Yesterday a police spokesman said that the attacker appeared to be in his late 30's or early 40's and had a gray streak in his hair. He requested an interview with the man he thought was Mr. Maikovskis, was asked to leave, started to go but then drew a gun, which misfired after he had pulled the trigger.

He then attacked Mr. Civezelis with a knife.

Mr. and Mrs. Civezelis were taken to Nassau Hospital, a few blocks from the Maikovskis' home, where Mr. Civezelis underwent three hours of surgery to repair wounds in his diaphragm, lungs and liver. Mrs. Civezelis was treated and released.

## Accused By Israeli Minister

## U.S. Charged With Jeopardizing Pact

JERUSALEM: Agriculture Minister Ariel Sharon, the foremost hard-line member of Israel's government, recently charged the United States with desiring to establish a Palestinian state in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. He added that such action was "gravely imperiling the peace achievements in the Middle East."

The accusation by Mr. Sharon, made in interviews with the newspaper Maariv and with Israel's broadcasting network, was immediately denied by Washington. The Voice of Israel quoted Thomas Reston, a State Department spokesman, as having reminded an Israeli questioner about President Carter's statement in a White House news conference on May 29 that "we've never espoused an independent Palestinian State."

The President also remarked on that occasion that a Palestinian state in the West Bank of the Jordan River and in Gaza "would be a destabilizing factor."

Mr. Sharon, in the interview with Maariv, was said to have expressed a conviction "that we cannot, under any circumstances, reach understanding with the Americans" on the issue of autonomy for the more than one million Arabs who live in the West Bank and Gaza.

### "U.S. More Extreme Than Egypt"

The newspaper quoted Mr. Sharon as having added: "On this matter the United States is far more extreme than Egypt because of its interests in the Middle East, as it sees them." He was also reported to have asserted that the United States was carrying out "unceasing activity" among the Arabs in the Israeli-occupied areas.

According to the radio, Mr. Sharon accused the United States of making "two-faced statements when speaking to Israel and the Arabs." He reportedly declared that the United States wanted to create "the background and infrastructure" for a future Palestinian state.

American diplomats here have repeatedly

explained in formal statements that they were in touch with Arab leaders in the West Bank and Gaza in an effort to involve them in the peace process.

### "We Must Act Now"

Maariv quoted Mr. Sharon as conceding that President Carter, Secretary of State Cyrus R. Vance and other Americans had made "an important contribution to the attainment of peace between Israel and Egypt." However, the Minister reportedly declared, "We can now expect a hard struggle between Israel and the United States."

Mr. Sharon, who as a reserve general was a hero of the 1973 war, is chairman of a Government committee in charge of settlement activities. Asked about the speed and secrecy with which a new Jewish outpost was established last week on a hilltop near Nablus, the largest Arab city in the West Bank, the Agriculture Minister said, according to Maariv: "In another year, settlement activity might be impossible. So we must act now — to settle vigorously, quickly. First of all to establish facts of foothold, and then to beautify the settlements, plan them, expand them."

Maariv also quoted Mr. Sharon as declaring that the West Bank, Gaza and the Golan Heights of Syria were indispensable for Israel's security and survival. "Against us are arrayed the United States, the Arabs, the worst of Israel's leftists," he was said to have remarked. He also charged that Israel's television network and press had induced "quite a few good and loyal" Israelis to side with the country's enemies.

Israel's high court, in a decision today related to the Nablus settlement, denied a request by 17 Arab landowners for a temporary injunction against the military government's requisition of land for the new outpost. The court instead appointed a three-member panel to consider the landowners' appeals at a date yet to be set.

## Public's Support Of Israel Eroding, Says NJCRAC Head

NEW YORK (JTA): Albert Chernin, executive director of the National Jewish Community Relations Advisory Council (NJCRAC), warned editors and publishers of American Jewish newspapers that 1979 will probably see "eroding public support for Israel" in the United States.

Addressing the 37th annual meeting of the American Jewish Press Association (AJPA) at Stern College here, Chernin explained that since American public opinion on foreign policy is shaped by the President it is inevitable that support for Israel will erode. He said the reason is that the Carter Administration's proposals for the Mideast include such points as Israeli withdrawal from the West Bank, which Israel will not accept.

But Chernin warned that the "biggest problem" may be "erosion" of support within the American Jewish community. He said American Jewry must be united behind Israel through a consensus which supports a united Jerusalem and opposes the Palestine Liberation Organization and a Palestinian state without letting the "zig zag" of daily events interfere.

### Wundohl Re-Elected President

The AJPA, which re-elected Frank Wundohl, editor of the Jewish Exponent of Philadelphia, to a second one-year term as president, adopted a resolution praising Canada's new Prime Minister Joe Clark for

his promise to move the Canadian Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem and urging the United States to follow this example. Other resolutions expressed outrage over the execution of Habib Elkhanian, the Iranian Jewish leader and concern for the Iranian Jewish community, Jews in the Soviet Union and other areas of oppression.

In addition to Wundohl, also elected were: Albert Bloom, editor of the Pittsburgh Jewish Chronicle, first vice president; Jerry Barach, editor of the Cleveland Jewish News, second vice president; Anne Hammerman, editor of the Dayton Jewish Chronicle, third vice president; Jean Samuels of the Jewish Herald-Voice of Houston, Texas, treasurer; Miriam Goldberg, editor and publisher of the Intermountain Jewish News of Denver, recording secretary; and Milton Firestone, editor of the Kansas City Jewish Chronicle, corresponding secretary.

# Vienna: Nothing New On Mideast, Soviet Jews

WASHINGTON (JTA): President Carter and Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev agreed on SALT II but on little else at their recent summit meetings in Vienna, including the Middle East and Soviet emigration policy, according to information received here. While no movement of significance towards agreement between the superpowers was expected on the Middle East in view of Soviet opposition to the Egyptian-Israeli treaty and the Camp David accords, the Soviets were seen as having rejected even the proposal that the United Nations monitor the Sinai when Israeli military

forces withdraw in accordance with the Camp David framework. If the UN does not supply the force, the U.S. is committed to arrange for military units to patrol the area.

Embittered by the Egyptian, Israeli and American activities in the peace process, the Soviet Union is supportive of Arab "rejectionists" including the Palestine Liberation Organization, that seek to undermine the accords and thwart Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's peace efforts. Whether President Carter was successful in obtaining "assurances" from President Brezhnev on improved emigration policy also seemed negative.

He was a deputy scout commissioner, and a member of the executive committee of Narragansett Boy Scout Council. He also was involved with the Jewish Home for the Aged and other civic organizations.



## Your Money's Worth

### Are You a Member of the Middleclass?

Do you know anybody who doesn't consider himself (or herself) a member of the middleclass? With few exceptions, I don't. And I've counted the people I know who are carpenters, plumbers and postmen as well as those who practice law, sell securities, teach.

Just about everyone identifies with the middleclass, whether it's uppermiddle or lowermiddle.

To illustrate, a friend recently told me of passing a bum on the Boston Commons. The man was wrapped in layers of filthy rags, and my friend worried to himself that the man wouldn't survive the winter. Just a few days ago, he saw the bum again. He looked no worse than months earlier, rags and all. A sign of recognition must have passed over my friend's face, for the bum stopped him, pointed to my friend's blue work shirt and khaki pants and asked,

"You going camping?"

"No," said my friend who is a writer. "To the office."

The bum recoiled. "Dressed like that?" He shook his head and shuffled off.

Even in our widely diverse society, membership in the middleclass is the great common denominator. Yet, the term "middleclass" clouds the vast differences in life styles, working conditions, expectations, spending habits, etc. These are hidden when the \$11,000 a year telephone operator calls herself lower middleclass while the \$60,000 a year dentist refers to himself as uppermiddle.

Vividly dramatizing the distance between these and other income groups is a recently produced poster, "Social Stratification in the U.S." The large (35" x 45") multicolored chart transforms the percentages and median figures you frequently read and hear into a form you can see and drawings you can grasp fairly easily.

In addition to household income, the poster uses drawings of men and women to show how the non-dependent adult population live—as husband/wife couples, singles, single heads of households. Different colors denote the occupation each person holds or whether the individual is retired, a housewife, househusband, or unemployed. The distribution of wealth (in contrast to income) and race also are documented.

"We've tried to combine five or six pieces of information into one chart to give a comprehensive picture of the nature of America," says Stephen J. Rose, an economist, who along with graphic artist, Dennis Livingston, spent two years developing the poster.

Available in addition to the poster is a small booklet, which contains the information on which the poster is based, suggestions for using both in classroom discussions and a short bibliography of reference material.

For individuals, the poster costs \$5 and the booklet, \$2 plus \$1 for postage and handling; for institutions, the fees are \$12 per poster, \$3 per booklet, \$1 for postage and mailing. Bulk rates also are offered. (If you want the documents, write Social Graphics Co., 1120 Riverside Ave., Baltimore, Md. 21230.)

Since the poster was made available a few months ago, about 1,500 have been sold—mostly to high schools, socially-minded church groups, and the education divisions of some labor unions.

"Our purpose is to stimulate discussion rather than provide answers," Rose told my associate, Brooke Shearer. Nevertheless, these provocative conclusions, among others, leap out of the data the two men have compiled and updated to represent conditions in late '78.

\* Practically all households with incomes above \$15,000 a year are husband/wife couples.

\* The number of single individuals and single heads of households earning more than \$50,000 is so small that it doesn't even represent one figure on the poster. (Each figure is equivalent to 123,000 people.)

\* Large numbers of retired persons, particularly single women, have incomes of less than \$5,000 a year.

\* About the same number of blue collar households as professional and managerial households earn between \$20,000 and \$25,-

000 annually. However, the \$25,000 mark is about half of what the latter expect to make, while most blue collar workers in this income range have nearly reached the top of earning potential.

\* Less than one percent of the non-dependent adult population earns more than \$75,000 a year.

What, then, is "middle class?" In the U.S. as the 1980s near, all of these exceedingly divergent groups lower, upper, whatever—living their own lifestyles, working under widely different circumstances, and dreaming their own individual dreams of a "better" standard of living.

### Using Private Annuities

**Q—Would you please write something about private annuities? Who is the person to set one up besides an insurance man? T.J. New Jersey**

**A—**Private annuities are not sold by insurance companies but are arranged privately between individuals. An attorney and an accountant would be the persons to help you in this. In order for the annuity to withstand the scrutiny of the Internal Revenue Service and for you to reap the built-in tax benefits, the transaction must meet the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. Thus, having professional guidance in drawing up an annuity agreement is a must.

Private annuities are usually arranged between older and younger family members as a way of transferring assets between generations without incurring estate taxes. Since the tax advantage implies an unsecured obligation, private annuities are usually confined to families or well-trusted friends.

Assets owned by the annuitant are transferred to the obligor in exchange for lifetime payments. The amount of the payment is based on the fair market value of the transferred asset and the life expectancy of the annuitant as set forth in Treasury Department tables. These payments consist of at least two parts—taxable ordinary income and non-taxable return of capital. Frequently, however, appreciated property is transferred and then part of the annuity payment consists of partially taxable capital gains. The tax liability is generally lower on these items combined than it would be on the income generated had the asset been retained. The retiree often reaches that age and finds himself locked into appreciated growth stocks. If he sells them to reinvest in income issues, he will incur a large capital gains tax. He can, instead, transfer them to his son using a private annuity and his son may sell with no immediate tax consequence. Should the father predecease his life expectancy, the son would be liable for a short-term capital gain tax on the unpaid balance of the annuity. By waiting one year after the transfer before selling the appreciated property, this gain is treated as long term. But for the annuitant, having capital gains tax obligations spread out over his lifetime rather than all in one year is a significant tax advantage.

As long as the present value of the annuity and the fair market value of the property transferred are the same, there is no gift involved. Because the obligor has not incurred a true debt, the payments he makes to the annuitant are not deductible to him even though he is taxed on the income earned by the property.

As you can see, the subject is a complex one and though the private annuity has advantages, it also has drawbacks. If you envision using this device, you should get professional counsel. Unless the assets being transferred are readily valued (stocks, savings, etc.), have them professionally appraised. To avoid scuttling your agreement

Flowers from Israel

We are tied to Israel by many strands.

To some of us the land is the cradle of our religion. To others Israel is our national home and the land of our poets and prophets and sages. To still others the ties have no names. We just know that everything that happens in Israel happens to us too. In the morning we scan the newspapers: What happened in Israel during the night? An attack by the PLO on a village is like an attack on our own house. Good tidings from Israel is a delight to our soul.

The other day we were sitting around the table and our daughter asked: Do you know where these flowers come from? They are from Israel. They sell them on the avenue.

Flowers from Israel. Think of it. Yesterday they were growing in the sun of the land and today they adorn our Sabbath table.

I remembered when I was a youngster in my little town on the Ukraine that a local merchant came from the Big City and brought with him a few oranges from Israel. I was among the lucky ones to see the great wonder. I smelled the orange. I held it with two fingers and caressed it and felt every ridge, every depression on the surface of the fruit. When the orange was peeled and sectioned I repeated with all that were assembled the blessing and the Shechyanu, a prayer pronounced over something that happens once in a great while.

Oranges from Israel.

But now this Land of Our Fathers is asking for something more than wonder and awe. It is asking for our help. It is seeking financial help to develop the land, to enlarge the capacity of the land so that more people may come and live in it.

**Tip-Off On Tornadoes**

A weather radar system, originally designed for use on ships, has become a landlubber as well. Because of it, a lot of folks sleep better at night.

Tornadoes can happen anywhere, any time. There are people around who have personal knowledge of those whirlwinds of destruction.

Fortunately, preparedness paid off for Monticello, Miss., on April 17, 1978. In nearby Columbia, a radar system installed at the Civil Defense Emergency Operation Center picked up signals of a fast-approaching tornado. Its warning came 20 minutes before the National Weather Service spotted the approaching whirlwind on its own radar screens.

Columbia immediately sounded the alert. Result: Most of Monticello's 4,500 residents were able to take cover well before the tornado arrived.

The system that made this possible? The MK-16AX, manufactured by the Sperry Division of Sperry Rand Corp., which designs and builds marine systems.

Originally designed for use on ships, the system has proved to be an ideal tornado-spotting device for use on land. It is now doing a good twister-detecting job for other Civil Defense Units in Mississippi and Illinois.

According to James A. Thornhill, director of the Columbia-Marion County Civil Defense Council, this radar system "undoubtedly" saved many lives when the tornado struck Monticello in 1978. Because tornadoes, unlike hurricanes, are short-lived local phenomena that strike with little warning, researchers have long sought techniques to forecast them as early as possible. Sperry radar seems to be doing the job.

"We are disappointed that the ad, in English, Arabic and Hebrew, which salutes the peoples of Egypt and Israel for their courageous, creative commitment to wage peace, is rejected because Forbes magazine

considers peace to be 'political,'" Abraham H. Foxman, ADL's associate national director, declared. He added, "We even offered to remove the Hebrew wording from the ad if that would make it acceptable."

Foxman said he personally wrote Malcolm Forbes, owner of the magazine on May 31 and also tried to reach Forbes by phone but the publisher has neither responded to the phone calls nor the letter. Forbes is reported to have left for an extended stay in France.



# Anti-Nazis Deny Mail Bombs Are Theirs

NEW YORK (JTA): Manny Beck, chairman of the International Committee Against Nazism (ICAN), flatly denied that the organization had or was mailing parcel bombs to neo-Nazi groups and former Nazi war criminals living in the United States.

Beck told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that some group might have been motivated to organize the package bomb mailing campaign by the ICAN's extensive mailing of anti-Nazi literature.

He said, "This is going to hurt us." He described ICAN as being made up of roughly 500 members but that it had been forced to delay implementation of a planned program for lack of funds. He said the committee has an office in Manhattan and one in Toronto.

There were widespread reports that parcel bombs had been discovered in New Jersey, Illinois, Nebraska and Virginia.

One of the news agencies receiving a call affirming the mailings was the JTA. The caller said the ICAN was responsible for the mailings and planned to do more of them. He refused to give his name.

According to police reports, the mail bombs were received by a Nebraska man connected with a neo-Nazi group; a former SS officer in Paterson, N.J. and a branch office of the National Socialist Party in Cicero, a suburb of Chicago where the tiny neo-Nazi Party has its headquarters.

Bombs also were reportedly found in packages at post offices in Chicago and Arlington, Va. The parcel bomb in Chicago was addressed to Frank Collin, head of the Chicago neo-Nazi group who created a major controversy last year with a threat to march in Skokie, home of thousands of survivors of the Holocaust.

Collin dropped the threat when he received court permission to hold a rally in Chicago's Marquette Park, located in a racially mixed area.

Post office officials in Arlington refused to give the name of the person to whom the parcel was addressed but Arlington county sources said it was mailed to the National Socialist White People's Party. A parcel bomb was received by Tschermir Soobzokov, a former SS officer.

The callers also claimed responsibility for a package bomb mailed to a Gerhard Lauck, a member of an American Nazi Party in Lincoln, Neb. None of the explosive devices went off.

Arthur Meister, an FBI agent in the FBI office in Newark, said the FBI was "actively involved" in an investigation, in cooperation with the U.S. Postal Service, and that nationally the probe was being coordinated by the FBI headquarters.

## Motion Criticizing Settlement Defeated

JERUSALEM: After a raucous debate today, Prime Minister Menachem Begin's coalition in Parliament defeated an opposition motion criticizing the latest Jewish settlement in the occupied West Bank region.

"While you're shouting here we lay another foot of pipe, another mile of road and build another house," said Agriculture Minister Ariel Sharon during the debate.

Mr. Sharon, who heads Israel's settlement program in the occupied territories, was responding to opposition charges that the Elon Moreh settlement started last week near Nablus endangered peace efforts.

By a vote of 39 to 31, Parliament defeated the motion of the Labor Party.

"The Elon Moreh settlement is the biggest danger to peace," asserted Yossi Sari of Labor, charging that the Government had submitted to pressure from the ultra-Zionist Gush Emunim, or Faith Block, in deciding to build the settlement near the Arab city of Nablus.

Mr. Sharon countered that the hilltop set-

tlement guaranteed security of the West Bank's main north-south road and said the surrounding hills would remain under Israeli control during the five-year transition period of Palestinian autonomy envisaged in the Israel-Egypt peace pact.

### U.S. and Egypt Criticize Move

As Israeli-Egyptian talks on Palestinian autonomy in the West Bank and Gaza Strip opened in Egypt, the United States and Egypt criticized Israel for continuing to establish settlements in territory occupied since the 1967 war.

In the debate today, Tewfik Toubi, and Arab Communist, called Mr. Sharon an "expert in driving Arabs from their homes." He condemned the confiscation of privately owned Arab land near Elon Moreh, saying: "You promised that you wouldn't take private land, and here you have taken a field."

Mr. Sharon rejected the charge, saying the Defense Ministry decided several years ago to confiscate the land for military purposes. Such confiscation is legal under Israeli law.

"No fifth column can sabotage Zionism," said Mr. Sharon. "It's our right to settle in the whole land of Israel. It's a question of survival."

Defense Minister Ezer Weizman told the Foreign Affairs and Security Committee that he opposed building Jewish settlements in sectors of the West Bank with dense Arab populations. Mr. Weizman had resisted plans for the settlement near Nablus, but agreed to sign the confiscation orders when outvoted in the Cabinet.

Meanwhile, former Labor Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin wrote in the newspaper Yediot Aharonot that it was a "serious mistake" to establish Jewish settlements in areas of dense Arab population. But he said he did not believe Israel should halt all settlement in the West Bank.

It would be a mistake for Israel to relinquish its right of settlement during the autonomy negotiations, Mr. Rabin continued. "For Israel to forego the right of settlement would deprive it of an important card," he said.

### ISRAEL-CHINA

TEL AVIV — The authoritative morning Hebrew daily, Ha'aretz has reported that in late March an Israeli delegation made a secret visit to China to discuss the possibilities of economic cooperation between the two countries. The visit, which took place under strict security, did not apparently produce any immediate results.

## Calls Settlements "Illegal"

### U.S. Seen Causing Friction In West Bank Issue

NEW YORK (JTA): Howard M. Squadron, president of the American Jewish Congress, criticized the State Department for insisting that Israel's West Bank settlements were "illegal," and said Washington's position "creates an unnecessary cause of friction between the United States and Israel." Squadron told a national conference of the organization's Women's Division in the Roosevelt Hotel here that "It is not illegal as a matter of international law for Jews to settle on the West Bank and it is unfortunate that the

State Department continues to argue that it is."

He also said it was "counterproductive to continue to urge participation in the autonomy discussions by Jordan, Saudi Arabia and resident Palestinians." He predicted that Jordan, Saudi Arabia and the West Bank Palestinians would not participate in discussions over Prime Minister Begin's autonomy plan for another four years, despite an open invitation to join the talks at any time.


Miss Sherman was awarded the Robert Jay Silver Prize in Psychology for original research showing exceptional promise.

## Letter from Israel

## Here in Ashkelon

I drive down to the sea, here in Ashkelon, at least two or three times a week. It is very picturesque all along the route and if one should care to walk a bit where cars usually don't travel, it is possible to see history still standing. I refer to the Crusader ruins—what is left of them. I marvel now and then that I am living in a town that is so old in time that one can find its name written by the ancient historian Josephus Flavius in his works. Ashkelon had won its place long before Josephus was born, by a thousand years or more and so this Rhode Islander looks in awe at everything around him and he wonders why many an Iranian Jew didn't pack up his family and come here when he was able to, and leave what may be soon another holocaust country. All the warnings were there—for a long time.

Jews, as I have learned, are a strange people in that they remain complacent even when every sign points to a coming disaster. If you were disturbed by the execution of the Zionist leader in Iran—I too was upset and from the reports we have received in Israel there are over a hundred more Jews who have been put into Iranian prisons, for one reason or another. There are at least a thousand Jews in prison in Argentina today. My Argentinian friends have told me many stories about Jewish boys and girls who were executed by "death squads" or simply disappeared—these aside from adults. One can survive best in Argentina if one is a fascist or a nazi. God only knows how many nazis were able to get into Argentina before and after World War II. The signs of disaster have been flashing for ever so long but our Jewish people have not been moved to make any great Aliyah to Israel where we want and need them.

Why didn't the Iranian Jew leave in total when he could and why doesn't the Argentinian Jew do it today? The answer I got to that question was from some newcomers—relatives of my Iranian neighbor. These people came to Israel with their clothes and not much of anything else. When I asked why all the Iranian Jews weren't coming (this was when the Shah was having problems) the head of this family replied, "Don't you know how our people hate to leave their wealth behind? To me, my wife and my children are my greatest possessions but many of my friends have decided to gamble with the lives of their families. They will sit in their shops and hope for better days but those days will not come. It is all over for us in Iran." I got much the same answer from a man who came to Ashkelon from Argentina and I fear that this kind of thinking on the part of the people who gamble with lives out of respect to their material possessions they own is an illness of our foolish brethren all over the world. They are sitting on their pots of gold but the bullets that killed the Zionist leader in Iran, recently, probably cost no more than twenty-five cents apiece. Strange isn't it?

## Nazis in Action

The attitude of the Arabs toward Zionism and yes, against Jews in general, has spurred nazi groups into action all over the world. The idea of having an ally with oil wealth and a similar destructive attitude towards a people is increasing the ranks of what was considered minor neo-nazi splinter groups. Don't think that there aren't nazi activities going on in your back yard. They are there even if some of them take the form of action by individuals dressed in bed sheets. They are there, even if you choose to minimize their efforts. If these groups aren't making headlines—wait until the oil squeeze begins to hurt the economy in the USA and elsewhere.

## A Saudi Arabian Agent

Every country has its agents. A former US vice president, who had to resign, not too many years ago, from his government job, did not wait very long to jump on the Arab "money wagon" and became a land agent for the Arabs. By now, I am sure that he has made millions of dollars. Even though his work has been very distasteful to

people like me, he is not breaking any law.

There are other kinds of agents who deal in "hate" for a price, so let me introduce you to a Saudi Arabian agent, a Mr. William Grimstead, the author of a hate book called *Six Million Reconsidered*. It is believed that the Saudis paid him twenty thousand dollars for his account that the holocaust never happened. Who is this man Grimstead? He is the former editor of *White Paper*, a hate rag newspaper published by a nazi group in the USA. Who is publishing Grimstead's book? The National Rights Party, based in Marietta, Georgia. The Saudi Arabians have spent a small fortune to have printed and distributed, in many languages, *The Protocols of The Elders of Zion*. This writing had caused many a pogrom in old Czarist Russia. I understand that this book is being sold in large quantities in South America.

There is a Jew-hating nazi who lives in Lincoln, Nebraska, and he publishes hate material — then exports it to West Germany. It is forbidden to publish Nazi material in West Germany but it is perfectly okay to import it. One can wonder, indeed, at the logic of such a two-faced law. This reasoning is the same as not allowing guns to be manufactured but it is okay to buy an imported one. For shame.

## Zaire in Central Africa

Ever hear of Zaire? It is located in Central Africa. What is unusual about that? When Hitler was in power, a man whose skin was black was considered to be a form of subhuman animal to Adolph and his followers. So it is a surprise to find ex-nazi rocket scientists in Zaire—controlling a large land area and experimenting and developing rockets there. These rocket scientists are, in the main, the same ones who were working and helping Egypt in the 1960s to develop missiles for the war and against Israel. No, World War II did not end the nightmare of nazi philosophy. These hellmakers not only control a good size area of Zaire, under the name of OTRAG, but are allowed to control the population there as well—for the price of fifty million dollars a year, and get this—payable when there is a first satellite in orbit. One can wonder if President Sese Seko Mobutu of Zaire ever read any literature about his bedfellows' past, or their philosophy. It is frightening to learn of the takeover of a country by scientific butchers. I see many dark surprises in store for this world of ours.

## Arabs in the United States

Did you know that there are millions of Arabs, many Palestinians, who have come to settle in the United States? They are very involved in trade unions and from what we have learned here they are making their influence known by attempting to sway the unions toward an anti-Israeli stance. At the rate Arabs multiply and Jews in America assimilate or convert (or simply don't give a damn about their heritage), I'll make a wager that one day there will be mosques in every US city and the few remaining Jews will be hard put to support what will be left of our temples and synagogues.

## Mr. Sadat and Hitler

Anwar Sadat was and still is an anti-Semite. It was only seven years ago when he spoke in an Arab mosque at a celebration of Mohammed's birthday and at that time he described the expulsion of the Jews from the Arabian peninsula as the prophet's greatest achievement. He said, "The Jews are a people of plotters, deceivers and traitors. They were born to lie and to betray . . . I promise you that we shall restore them to their previous state. As it is written in the Koran: They are fated to be oppressed and downtrodden." Would you believe this character won a Nobel Peace Prize?

Sadat has always been an admirer of Hitler. He even plans to build a museum in honor of the late General Rommel. Let him try to deny that it was he, Anwar Sadat, who sent a letter to Hitler, telling him how much he agreed with his policy relative to the Jews. Or—let him try to deny that he also helped a nazi general escape from the British.

Anwar Sadat's admiration for German militarism has never faltered. Since when did the Egyptian army dress in World War II German uniforms—coal scuttle iron helmets as well as the rest of the trimmings? As the president of Egypt. This was the "slap in the face" that greeted Mr. Begin when he landed in Egypt. Had Mr. Menachem Begin had one ounce of courage he would have refused to review the honor guard that must have brought back to him memories of horror—an Egyptian honor guard in nazi uniforms. I wrote to Menachem Begin some time ago and I told him what a foolish man he was in his giveaway dealings with Sadat. I haven't changed my mind to this day. As far as I am concerned, the Israeli politician is the most stupid I have seen yet. Sadly, we do not have a "clever Sadat" to work for Israel.

## Sadat and Mohammed

The Prophet Mohammed is said to have written a document called, in Arabic, *Kitab al-Umma*—translated it means *Charter of the Community*. It was supposed to ease the tension between the Arabs and Jewish tribes by bringing law and order to them. It was a kind of treaty. Sadat mentioned this document in a recent speech. He attempted to show that the Prophet Mohammed was a fair and just man and Moslems and Jews could live as peacefully together today as they did when this document came into being. The only thing that is wrong with Sadat's reasoning is that he failed to tell the whole story. The good prophet expected the Jewish tribes to join his religious movement and when they didn't he expelled them—with the exception of one particular tribe, Banu Qurayza. Alfred Guillaume, a famous Islamic scholar who translated into English the biography of the prophet described what happened to this Jewish tribe.

"The execution of some 800 men occupied the whole day and went on far into the night. Only one Jew abjured his religion to save his life. The rest, after prayers and reading of the scriptures, went calmly to their death." As for the women and children—they were sold into slavery. It is said that all this happened because of one of the prophet's companions who was a dying man. This man Sa'd, chief of the Aws, and Arab tribe in Medina, "not daring to cross the prophet's wishes, decreed that all males who had reached puberty should be slain and all the women and children should be sold as slaves."

Now if Sa'd could get away with murder, why does Mr. Sadat promise the Jews of today more of his prophet's wisdom. It's a joke, but Mr. Sadat is a master of deceit. Just as Sa'd found a loophole in Mohammed's document in order to destroy a Jewish tribe so will another Egyptian find a loophole in the Egyptian, Israel peace treaty that Sadat agreed to. This is all in Sadat's scheme for what should happen later in time. Anyone taken in by Sadat will learn a bitter lesson.

## Sadat and the Nazis

I believe that the Mr. Citizen in Egypt wants peace as much as the Mr. Citizen who lives in Israel. I do not believe that the leadership who represents Egypt have the same thought in mind. After that, Carter insisted that we lose more.

I am not fearful of the Egyptian. I am very afraid of what can happen to the people of Israel if the planning of Mr. Sadat and his nazi friends succeeds. This is a chess game between a shrewd master (Sadat) and a poor soul of a believer (Begin). God help us all.

## Air Of Aloofness Underlies Power Struggle In Crown Heights

CROWN HEIGHTS, New York: Dr. Vernal G. Cave, a black community leader who remembers Crown Heights more than 20 years ago, made an observation which pretty well sums up the relationship between the blacks and the Lubavitcher Hasidim who reside in this community in Brooklyn.

"The Hasidim act as if they did not even know us," he said. "Years ago, the Jews who lived here were friendly and we conversed regularly, but now, only two houses separate my house from some Hasidim property and they don't even nod toward me."

Indeed, the air in Crown Heights is one of aloofness, between the two ethnic factions that reside there; not the aloofness of people who are enemies, but rather of strangers who wish to remain uninvolved. Blacks and bearded, dark-suited Lubavitcher Hasidim stroll or hurry past one another, rarely sharing a word or gesture of acknowledgement. This passing parade exemplifies the ways of the larger community, where people of diverse backgrounds share the same turf but live in different worlds.

The calm that exists in Crown Heights is basically a front, beneath which is a grass-roots struggle for power by activists on both sides. Animosity sparked by the struggle — which centers on the control of the community and the nature and direction of the resources that flow into it — has created an undercurrent of tension in the neighborhood. Both sides have established security patrols to protect their streets.

For the Lubavitcher Hasidim, many of whom have blood ties to survivors of European ghettos and the pogroms of World War II, Crown Heights represents a religious and economic commitment. Members of the sect are much in evidence in this neighborhood in central Brooklyn, working or shopping at stores owned by Hasidic Jews along Kingston Avenue or walking to synagogue.

Rabbi Elye L. Gross, a member of the orthodox Lubavitcher group, who has lived in the Crown Heights area about 40 years, said the Hasidim "just want everyone to understand the patterns, roots and interests of others and not try to change them."

"We feel a responsibility of being an example to others," he said.

### Blacks Are Also Survivors

Many of the Hasidim are middle class, but they say their numbers also include sizable pockets of poor and underemployed residents. Their lives, a mixture of strict orthodox practice and intense prayer, revolve around the world headquarters of the Lubavitcher sect at 770 Eastern Parkway. The Hasidim generally avoid contact with outsiders, except for occasional across-the-fence chitchat.

The blacks in Crown Heights are also survivors. For thousands of them, the community is their reward at the end of a struggle to transcend racial oppression and to achieve a comfortable existence. They are among the ranks of the city's civil servants and professionals, including judges, doctors, lawyers and ministers.

They enjoy the strong middle-class character of the area and nurture it through attentiveness to their large, one-family houses on President Street and comfortable brownstones on side streets, their involvement in block associations and their concern about city services.

### 'Strong, Decent People'

Living in the area in graphic contrast with them are thousands of other blacks who are unemployed and poor, and who reside in deteriorated and graffiti-ridden apartment buildings.

"Strong, decent people live in Crown Heights," said Sgt. Anthony Quatrone, a community-affairs officer in the 71st Precinct, which includes much of Crown Heights.

"They ignore each other, except for isolated incidents," he added, saying that some past violence had been caused by outsiders. "But both groups work to have a solid neighborhood. We have a lot of middle-class people here. Sure, there is some deterioration and some burned-out buildings, but there are a lot of one- and two-family homes and solid apartment houses. I'm happy with the situation."

Blacks contend that the Hasidim exert influence far out of proportion to their numbers, a situation that they say is underscored at primary-election time when Democrats actively court the highly organized bloc of Hasidic votes.

Among other things, Dr. Cave and other blacks cite what they view as disproportionate police concern and service to the Hasidic community, a disproportionate flow of funds to the Hasidim and the cash purchase and use of many houses by Hasidim on attractive streets as poorly maintained dormitories.

The Hasidim concede that they have accumulated influence, but they say it benefits all their neighbors.

People now speak of Crown Heights in terms of two places, not only because of the neighborhood's racial groups, but also because of its division along Eastern Parkway, in 1976, into two community planning districts: the so-called Crown Heights South, the newer community district south of Eastern Parkway that has the bulk of the Lubavitcher Hasidim, and Crown Heights North, which is north of Eastern Parkway.

The entire Crown Heights community is considered to be roughly bounded by Atlantic Avenue to the north, Empire Boulevard to the south, Bedford Avenue to the west and Utica Avenue to the east, according to city analysts.

### Bitterness Among Blacks

Some blacks are still bitter about the way Crown Heights was divided into two districts after the Hasidic community complained to political leaders that they wanted to have a bigger voice in the affairs of their immediate neighborhood. But Edward S. Hightower, chairman of Community Board 9, which represents the district born in controversy, believes that blacks should attempt to copy the political cohesiveness of the Hasidim.

"While we are fighting, they are building," said Mr. Hightower, a black man, stressing that both sides must work together for the betterment of the community. He defeated the then incumbent board chairman, Rabbi Samuel Fogelman, in an election earlier this year.

A constant theme sounded by some black activists is that the Hasidim have a "master plan" to force blacks out of Crown Heights. As examples, they point to the sect's sizable amount of property purchases and to what they characterize as immoral tactics to get blacks to relocate.

Even the Rev. Heron A. Sam, one of the architects of a new coalition of some black and Hasidic leaders, told a recent meeting of residents that he had "misjudged" the extent to which some of the Hasidim owned property and to which they were responsible for the "wide-spread abuses of black and Hispanic tenants." He said he believed the Hasidim now owned more than a third of the property in the area.

### Some Tenants on Strike

Tenants are striking in buildings owned by some of the newly formed coalition's Hasidic principals, who own the property

under a social agency called Chevra Machazikei Hashcunah Inc. Some tenants living in a building at 349 Crown Street showed a visitor their apartments, which were being completely renovated while they continued to live in them.

The tenants charged that they had had no toilet facilities, heat or hot water during the winter and no advance warning that their building was to be completely renovated. The city is investigating the agency for alleged improper use of public funds.

The Hasidim argue that they have done nothing wrong and are simply solidifying their place in the community. "We are here many years — it is our home," said one Hasidic man, standing in the shadow of the sect's headquarters. "These last years we have built, not taken away."

The Hasidim proudly admit that more members of their sect, fleeing from religious repression in other countries, have been flocking to the neighborhood. Some predict that the 1980 census will show an increase in their numbers. About 30,000 now live in a 60-block area between Buffalo and Nostrand Avenues, and Eastern Parkway and Midwood Street. In the same area, there are at least 55,000 blacks, many of them from Jamaica, Trinidad and Haiti.

"More Russians are now coming here," said Rabbi Gross, executive director of the Crown Heights Jewish Community Council, "and over the last three weeks, more than 100 families have come. Plus we have over 700 Iranian children and we are increasing our population with young Jewish adults who have been through the 60's and are looking for direction."

The determination of each group to remain in Crown Heights is tied to their pride in the neighborhood, which is a short ride from Manhattan on the subway. Members of both races voice deep concern over the accelerating deterioration, housing abandonment, burned-out buildings and poverty that mar the streets of multistory brick homes set back from the street by manicured lawns.

Many residents cite housing as the area's biggest problem, and some blacks say the Hasidim are encouraging housing abandonment. Both also worry about crime.

Some Crown Heights residents are skeptical about the potential effectiveness of the new biracial coalition, made up of business and civic leaders and headed by Mr. Sam, the rector of the St. Mark's Episcopal Church, and Rabbi Mendel Shemtov, chairman of the Jewish Community Council's board.

They wonder if these leaders can keep the tensions of a decade from boiling over as tensions did last year. Last summer, nearly 2,000 blacks demonstrated in front of the Lubavitcher headquarters after a black contractor and civic leader, Arthur Miller, was killed in a struggle with policemen when he apparently intervened in the arrest of his brother for a driving violation. In another incident, a black youth was allegedly beaten by a group of Hasidic youths.

"A lot of leaders shaking hands will do nothing," said Myrtle Thompson, a resident of the area for about 15 years. "Any change depends on whether some minds in the community can be turned around."

Shalom Horowitz was more optimistic. "Sure it will work," he said of the coalition, standing outside the Brooklyn Jewish Center on Eastern Parkway, between New York and Brooklyn Avenues. "There is no problem, but if they want to make a peace, let them. It will make things even better."

**Secret Files Reveal****PLO—Major Role in Amin's Uganda**

KAMPALA: A perusal of the "secret" and "confidential" files of Idi Amin, which had been spilled into the streets of Kampala by the Ugandan and Tanzanian forces, reveals that the Palestine Liberation Organization played a major role in forming Amin's Uganda into a slaughterhouse.

The files tell of how the PLO helped to train and equip the sadistic killers that Amin let loose in his reign of terror to torture and kill countless thousands of people. The roles of others, including a mysterious American, were also elicited from the files, as well as from horror stories of the past eight years from individual Ugandans.

Washington Post correspondents report that several different countries and organizations helped Amin to keep his bloody regime alive, ranging from the Israelis and British in the early days of his rule to the PLO, the Russians, and the East Germans towards the end of his career.

Israel's role in Uganda was an early one and was similar to that in the other African states to whom it offered agricultural, health, educational and industrial knowhow without political strings.

These ties were broken by the African states on the insistence of the Arabs after the Six-Day and Yom Kippur wars. Amin himself, before he seized power in a coup, trained as a parachutist in Israel, and the wings he wore on his chest throughout his dictatorship in Uganda were those awarded to him by Israel for his successful jumps. In recent years, he was a bitter enemy of Israel and called for its annihilation.

Israel, it can be said categorically, had no hand in the Ugandan terror, and did not hesitate to violate Amin's territorial sovereignty with its rescue of the Israelis aboard a hi-jacked aircraft at Entebbe airfield.

The Amin records show, according to the Washington Post's correspondents in Kam-

pala, that the PLO was one of Amin's leading foreign allies. In spite of the PLO's repeated denials of involvement in the State Research Bureau's murder squads, there is solid proof that it trained and organized bodyguards for Amin and provided advisors who participated directly in the arrest and even the murder of prisoners, according to Ugandans "who watched it happen and survived to tell about it."

Palestinians even tried to save Amin from the invading Tanzanian and Ugandan liberation forces. They joined Libyan troops in a futile effort to stop the invasion, and Tanzanian officers report that some 200 Palestinians and 400 to 600 Libyans were killed in the fighting. Amin later was reported to have received asylum in Libya but has gone on to other places and is now reported in Baghdad, Iraq.

The brains and brawn behind the murderous secret police organization, euphemistically called the State Research Bureau, was the PLO which supplied the expertise to its murder squads, according to Apollo Lawoko, a prisoner who escaped from the Bureau.

He said that six to 10 Palestinians helped to train raw recruits for the squads and "personally took part in the interrogations and killings."

Lawoko was quoted by the correspondents as saying that the raw recruits were usually Rwandans and Sudanese in tattered clothing, and that these newcomers "would be given prisoners to practice on by cutting their throats."

"The old members of the staff would stand by with guns," Lawoko went on. "On the first occasion they (the recruits) often balked and tried to run away. But they would be brought back to finish up the prisoners."

"In these training exercises, the Palestinians were there to give instructions. One

famous one was called 'Faisal of the Nile.' He used to boast that he would do everything possible to protect Amin and his government."

Three members of a single family also cited three instances in which they saw Palestinians taking part in the arrest of civilians.

Said one of the family, Lydia Sembeguya, "In January of this year, we were drinking in a club in Kololo when we were rounded up by three Palestinians and four State Research Bureau hooligans. They were led by Hassan, the fat Palestinian from Liberia."

"I've seen Hassan on two occasions actually picking up people and putting them in the boot (trunk) of a car," said her brother, Hudson.

The PLO, as recently as March, "assured the world" that the PLO was not involved in any way in fighting alongside Ugandan forces. However, as PLO spokesmen acknowledged at a press conference in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, the PLO had a "training mission" in Uganda, but that this was the major Arab presence in that country. Tanzanian army officers, however, reported finding PLO credentials on Palestinians killed in the fighting.

The mysterious American linked to the State Research Bureau is Frank Terpil, whose Paris-based company supplied a wide variety of explosives, weapons and surveillance equipment to Amin, and trained the State Research Bureau "in the art of intelligence sabotage," according to the documents obtained in Kampala by the Washington Post correspondents.

Terpil boasts that he used to work for the CIA, but Washington sources say that he hasn't worked for that agency for more than eight years. The CIA itself refused to comment on any connection it might have had with Terpil.

**U.S. Supports Egypt's Opposition To West Bank Settlements**

WASHINGTON (JTA): Egyptian Vice President Hosni Mubarak received personal assurances from President Carter that the U.S. will assist Egypt with its "legitimate defense needs." At the same time, Secretary of State Cyrus Vance supported the Egyptian government's bitter opposition to Jewish settlements on the West Bank.

Mubarak, in Washington for a four-day visit shortly before President Carter and Soviet President Leonid Brezhnev meet in Vienna where the Middle East will be on their agenda, also met with Ambassador Robert Strauss, Carter's special envoy to the Israeli-Egyptian negotiations on autonomy, Defense Secretary Harold Brown, Vice President Walter Mondale and other American officials involved in Middle East diplomatic and military discussions. The White House said Carter and Mubarak reviewed the status of American-Egyptian cooperation "in a number of fields." The President expressed "great interest in Egypt's priority efforts to expand its economic and social development," the White House statement said. Mubarak brought a special message for Carter from President Anwar Sadat but its contents were not disclosed.

After his meeting with Mubarak, Vance told reporters that Israel's "continuation of the building" of Jewish settlements in occupied territory "is a hindrance to the peace process." With the Egyptian official at his side, the Secretary of State said the new Israeli settlements are "particularly inappropriate at this time" when Israel and Egypt are engaged in the initial phases of negotiations for autonomy on the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Mubarak told the reporters that the Egyptian government feels the statements by Premier Menachem Begin of Israel about the right to establish Jewish settlements are "going to hinder the peace process." He said that Egypt is "doing" the "maximum to reach full peace in the area but we are sorry to say that every now and then . . . we hear statements which are going to put obstacles in the peace process."

**Blum Defends Right Of Jews On West Bank**

At the State Department today, chief spokesman Hodding Carter said the issue

of Saudi Arabia's pledge to pay for 55 U.S.-built warplanes for Egypt is "not resolved." The first payment on the \$520 million bill is due July 1 but there is no indication that the Saudis will pay it.

Meanwhile, Yehuda Blum, Israel's Ambassador to the United Nations, passionately defended Israel's right to settle

the West Bank. Addressing a dinner here last night of the Louis D. Brandeis District of the Zionist Organization of America, Blum declared that the Jewish people have "the inalienable right" to its land and "the right to live in any part of Eretz Israel, including Judaea and Samaria which are an integral part of Eretz Israel."

**Israel Happy With U.S. Role In Autonomy Talks**

JERUSALEM (JTA): The "clarifications" between Israel and the U.S. over Washington's role in the autonomy talks appear to have had a happy outcome. The U.S. reply to Israel's queries on this issue was transmitted to Premier Menachem Begin over the weekend. High Israeli sources said Jerusalem was thoroughly satisfied with it.

"The U.S. endorses our position entirely," one Cabinet source told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency tonight. A U.S. Embassy spokesman in Tel Aviv said that if Israel saw the U.S. reply as endorsing its own position he was delighted. American sources appear to feel that the American reply, drafted by Secretary of State Cyrus Vance, should be acceptable to both Israel and Egypt. Israel's position has been that the U.S. role should be that of "full participation" or "partners" in the negotiations but not a "party" to the eventual agreement or to its subsequent implementation.

The issue came up during the first working session of the autonomy talks in Alexandria last week. Egypt's Minister of State for Foreign Affairs, Butros Ghali, seemed to suggest that the U.S. would be a party to the negotiations and also involved closely in the implementation of the eventual agreement. Ghali built his thesis on the phrase "participate fully in all stages of the negotiations" in the "joint letter" that accompanied the peace treaty.

But Israeli negotiators Yosef Burg, Moshe Dayan and Shmuel Tamir immediately rejected this reading, pointing out that the Camp David framework implies a role of participation but not of party, for the U.S. What would happen, Dayan asked the

Egyptians, if Israel and Egypt agreed over some point and the U.S., as a "party," imposed a "veto?" Dayan demanded that the U.S. clarify its position before the talks proceed further.

**West Germany Donates \$10,000 To Holocaust Memorial In NYC**

NEW YORK (JTA): The Federal Republic of Germany presented a \$10,000 check yesterday, for the construction of a "Garden of Remembrance" for Jews murdered in Nazi concentration camps at the Brotherhood Synagogue in Manhattan.

The West German Ambassador to the United States, Berndt von Staden, in presenting the check to members of the synagogue, spoke about the excellent relations between the Bonn government and Israel and noted that a government sponsored Jewish theological seminary will open in Heidelberg at the end of this year.

Commenting on the significance of the German gift to the synagogue, the Ambassador said, "We are every bit as indebted to the Jews as to all our intellectual forefathers. We ought to be aware of the expulsion of the Jews and that the murder of innumerable Jewish citizens robbed our nation of creative minds who to this day have not been replaced and who remain irreplaceable."

Von Staden also paid tribute to the late Roy Blumenthal, the brother of a synagogue member, and long-time public relations consultant to West Germany. Blumenthal was instrumental in arranging the historic meeting between Chancellor Konrad Adenauer and Premier David Ben Gurion

**Haifa Was Target Of Foiled Sea Attack**

TEL AVIV (JTA): Haifa, Israel's largest seaport, was the intended target of a gang of seaborne terrorists from Lebanon whose motorboat was intercepted and sunk by Israeli naval units a week ago, Gen. Yehoshua Saguy, Chief of Intelligence, disclosed. The motorboat carried Katyusha rocket launchers which, Saguy said, were to have been placed on a raft in Haifa Bay with rockets timed to fire on the city after the boat escaped. The four terrorists were killed in the encounter with the Israeli navy. Saguy reported that the terrorists have assembled the nucleus of a naval force at Lebanese ports consisting of speedboats, motor schooners and several small freighters of 500-600 tons. He said the reason is that they have found it relatively easy to penetrate Israel by sea.

## Immigrating To U.S., Elsewhere

# For Many Soviet Jews,

JERUSALEM: There is a sad turn of events occurring in Israel, a turn of events that distresses President Navon, Premier Begin, and many thousands of Israelis. This turn of events was unimaginable a few years ago, but now it is becoming a stark reality.

Soviet Jews, leaving Russia at a very rapid pace, are not immigrating to Israel.

Many are immigrating to the United States. Some are temporarily staying at transit centers in Vienna, deciding where to go.

But, for various reasons, they are not moving in any great numbers to Israel.

A scene which exemplifies this phenomenon happened recently when President Navon pleaded for two hours with a group of Soviet adolescents. These Russian boys and girls, children of Soviet Jews in Vienna transit centers, were in the country for a tour that, it was hoped, might influence their parents' decision whether to migrate to Israel or the United States.

The increasing failure of Soviet Jews to go to Israel has been a bitter disappointment to the Israel establishment and its implication has yet to be fully worked out. President Navon, dapper in his dark suit, told his dutiful audience: "Jews were accused of being non-productive and lazy. But here we have produced one of the best agricultural systems in the world, and our army has gained the respect of our enemies."

The Russians told journalists that their parents in Vienna had been put off mainly by "death, war, and terrorism." Navon tried to cast the dangers of life in Israel in a more romantic light: "The choice is in your hands. You can live a life of drinking Coca Cola and sitting in a villa in America — or you can take part in the building of the Jewish state."

Navon's was the simplest possible formulation of the Israeli myth: the Jew as farmer and soldier, Israel as the Jewish state, and, above all, the contrast between a life of purpose, danger, and dedication against slothful ease and degeneracy ("Coca Cola") elsewhere. One wit summed up the Israeli message to hesitant Soviet Jews as: "We have nothing to offer you except, blood, sweat and tears — and a subsidised flat, and income-tax concessions." The tape of President Navon's impromptu dissertation has meanwhile been sent off to Vienna, but it is unlikely to change the dismal facts and figures.

Since serious migration began in the late sixties, an estimated 200,000 Jews have left the Soviet Union, out of a total Jewish population there of nearly three million — the largest reserve of discontented and disadvantaged Jews left in the world. It is difficult to exaggerate the hope that was pinned, and is still pinned, to Soviet Jewry by many Israelis.

Of the 200,000 so far out, 150,000 have come to Israel. But that healthy proportion conceals two things: one is that the first immigrants came disproportionately from Zionist activists and from peripheral Jewish communities like the Georgian Jews. Now the emigration is of Russian Jews proper, and the painful fact is that they are not coming to Israel.

The proportion of "Vienna Dropouts" — from those that go directly from the transit centres in Austria to the US, rejecting Israel without setting foot in it — has risen from a fifth in 1974 to two thirds in the first three months of 1979. At that rate, Israel will get

only a few score thousand of the quarter of a million Soviet Jews expected to leave in the next few years. The Aliyah-ascent — the grandiose Hebrew word for going to Palestine, might even be overtaken by the Yeridah-descent — the derogatory word for emigration from Israel. Statistics up to 1977 showed a total of 300,000 "yordim" (descenders) since 1948, the people that Rabin once described as "deserters from the field of battle." The net gain to Israel last year, for instance, was only 5,000.

Most of those Russians that do come are "soft." Professor Alexander Voronel, a Soviet immigrant himself, says: "The brutal truth is that most Soviet immigrants are not in the least Zionist and expecting idealism and pioneering sacrifices from them is unrealistic." A young American immigrant, commenting on the Russians and Persians in his Hebrew class, wrote: "The majority of them would like to live anywhere else except Israel."

The vital importance of the faltering Soviet Aliyah is both arithmetical and cultural. It has led to bitter debate in Israel, because it touches on the very foundation of the Jewish state. At the simplest level, the Russians were expected to provide demographic reinforcements in the battle to maintain a workable majority over the Israeli Arabs and, for the Israeli right wing, also over the Arabs of the occupied territory. Then there is the question of military manpower, which since 1973 has been pushed to the absolute limit that the present population can sustain.

Gush Emunim, the extremist settler movement, in its so-called "master plan" for the West Bank, says: "We expect great waves of immigration in the next 25 years bringing the total (Jewish) population up to eight or ten million." But the arithmetic, whether real or imaginary, is in the end less important than what one newspaper described as the blow to "Israel's historic function as an ingathering state" (destined to receive all or most Jews).

The implication of what is happening is thus not accepted by many Israelis, least of all by those that do not want to re-examine their history, in the light of the Russian "defection," as a minority phenomenon. The escape from that conclusion takes ever more fantastic and darker routes.

who is now the Minister of Agriculture, to plant "two million" Jews in a chain of towns, villages and settlements across the territory over the next 20 years. Sharon's plans are dreams not shared or endorsed by most of his Cabinet colleagues. But the idea of the coming "reinforcements" is hard to relinquish for many Israelis, including liberals, who do not want to put aside their picture of Israel as the major event of modern Jewish history.

Israelis who do not share this complex are not lacking. It was most bluntly expressed by a young man in a Tel Aviv bar who told me: "America is the Jewish national home. . . Israel is the Jewish national graveyard." Typically, and understandably, he regretted what he had said immediately afterwards, and used many sentences taking most of it back.

Few would join him in such an abrupt rejection of Israel's "historic function as an ingathering state." There are many that recognise it as a myth. Yehoshua Porath, an academic expert on Arab affairs, said: "People never came en masse from the liberal democracies. . . they came from Eastern Europe, before they were murdered by the Germans. That is the tragedy of Zionism, that the people for whom it was designed are dead."

Another academic said: "Begin still really believes in it and a lot of people can't let it go. . . millions of Jews for the West Bank! Where the hell are they going to come from?" But the recognition that "Israel's right to exist" is not indissolubly tied to its status as "national home," is no longer in coming. For it means that it must be accepted that what the Russian Jews are doing now — choosing the West over Israel — is precisely what their forebears did. The great event of modern Jewish history, it can be argued, was neither the Holocaust nor the creation of Israel, but the massive relocation of the Ashkenazi nation in the West.

As the Jewish community of Eastern Europe, the Yiddish-speaking, Ashkenazi quasi-state that had found its large, if often difficult role, within the framework of three empires, began to collapse in the nineteenth century, the main response of its members was emigration to the West. Like the Russian Jews today, the majority went anywhere but to Palestine. Just as the Jews had solved

## Israel Not The Place To Go

If the Soviet Jews are not coming, refuge is taken in the future, a future in which new outbreaks of anti-Semitism will blast the diaspora. A young and able official, a supporter of the Begin government, knowledgeable and even liberal, said: "There will be another disaster in world Jewry. It could come in South America. It could come in America itself. . . let me put it this way. their problems in the West several centuries before by moving east, so they now retraced their steps.

Another kind of arithmetic proves the point. Of nearly 12 million Ashkenazi Jews, less than an eighth live in Israel. The irony of Israel's history is that it was intended to become an Ashkenazi national home, but instead became the national home of Oriental Jews, of which it now holds more than two thirds. But that development was the result of the chain reaction that ran through the Islamic world after the establishment of Israel, and the resulting Oriental immigration was largely unplanned and not entirely welcome to the Israel leaders.

"Zionism" Porath says, "was nearly dead before 1967. . . it was being replaced by an Israeli identity and an Israeli nationalism. . . for Begin, of course, none of this has happened. Begin does not know any Israelis, he only knows Jews."

MOSCOW: The Vienna meeting between Leonid Brezhnev and Jimmy Carter has evoked great interest among the Soviet Jews. Novosti correspondents took several interviews to ascertain their opinion on the conclusion of the SALT-II Treaty.

Semyon Millerman, 30, engineer of an everyday-services establishment, Khmel'nitsky, Ukraine:

"I am sure SALT-II will strengthen the peace and trust between the Soviet Union and the USA. We in this country understand it and therefore take the talks and their results seriously. Yes, differences do exist between the USSR and the USA: in the way of life, culture and attitude to particular problems. But I believe these differences should not become fatal; they must not grow into an unbridgeable gulf. SALT-II is a fine bridge which has been built painstakingly for a long time. During the last war we fought together with the Americans against a common enemy—nazism—and this means that now too we can come to terms on everything and be friends."

Yakov Fishman, 66, chief rabbi, Moscow Choral Synagogue:

"The meeting in Vienna will have a positive effect on the international climate. Of course, SALT-II is just a beginning, to be followed by a third arms control agreement and so on, down to the full destruction of arsenals. I hope Isaiah's prophecy that there will be a world without wars and that people will not study military art will come true. I have been to the USA and talked with many Americans and know that the majority there stands for the treaty."

"Common sense betrays those who are obstructing SALT-II. This treaty will be a model for settling tensions in various parts of the world, including the Middle East. As cochairmen of the Geneva Conference, the USSR and the USA should reach agreement so that a durable and genuine peace is established both for the Arabs and the Jews. SALT-II sets an example of how nations should be getting along. When it comes to world peace, everyone must find a common language."

Yuri Sherling, 35, manager and chief stage director, Jewish Chamber Music Theater, Birobidzhan:

"The problems between the USSR and

the USA should be solved not on the field of battle, but on that of friendly talks. Therefore I believe the Vienna meeting will favorably influence the destinies of peace. Only in conditions of peace is it possible to undertake the settlement of all the other questions. This is my deep conviction. Finally, SALT-II will help us to organize a brisk mutual introduction in the cultural field, since Americans' knowledge of life in the Soviet Union, including that of Jews, appears to be poor. Through genuine knowledge does the way toward trust and peaceful cooperation lie. I hope that the Jews, both here and in the USA, will do their bit in achieving this urgent task."

Yevgenia Ruza, 21, student of the Moscow Foreign Languages Institute:

"Like my friends, I want to study, work, marry and have children in peace. We don't need war. I have read in the papers that NATO is going to mass-produce new types of arms and that it has gotten the blessing of the U.S. and other Western governments to do this. How can these hasty war preparations be squared with the assurances of the same leaders about their desire for peace? I think SALT-II should not be marred by actions that run counter to it. There must be no double-facedness or inconsistency in matters on which the fate of our planet depends."

Semyon Volkovich, 83, chemical process engineer, member of the USSR Academy of Sciences, Moscow:

"The stand of the U.S. Senate on the treaty is of deep concern to me. I would like to hope that the Senate will, nevertheless, ratify SALT-II without emaciating it. For the treaty is not a trifle; it represents a set of measures that has gone through every expert check. As one who has been actively engaged in research for over 50 years, I know what kind of results can be produced by many years of collective effort, synthesizing the thoughts of leading experts of the two countries. SALT-II may be attributed to these results. Though not ideal, of course, it is a suitable compromise for now. Why, then, say that the treaty benefits the USSR only? The Americans are equally interested in SALT-II. Not to see this is either preposterous or malicious. I would like to add that the Soviet Union has proved its honesty more than once. Indeed, the

Americans have no reasons to doubt our honesty, especially as there is every possibility for verifying the fulfillment of the treaty."

Frida Korunova, 64, pensioner, former seamstress, Mytishchi, Moscow Region:

"It is good that our leaders are meeting at last. I hope that no one ever again experiences the same horrors that I went through in a Nazi concentration camp in the

years of the Second World War. We Soviet Jews numbered 70,000 there. The survivors did not exceed 5,000. These horrors, which still haunt me at night, must not recur. There are probably no people who want war. But it is also true that the desire for peace must be really sincere and strong."

# Remembrances of Anne Frank

AMSTERDAM: Anne Frank.

Her name has become synonymous with the qualities that this remarkable young girl possessed - kindness, courage, and love. Perhaps even more famous than the girl herself is the celebrated "Diary of Anne Frank", which she wrote in the two years that she, her family, and four other hunted Jews were forced to live in an attic in this city to escape Nazi persecution.

The memory of Anne Frank was rekindled last week by the celebration of what would have been her 50th birthday. She has now been dead more than twice the amount of years that she lived, having died of typhus in Bergen-Belsen concentration camp near Hanover at the tender age of 15.

Otto Frank, her 90-year-old father, who was a prosperous businessman in Frankfurt, brought his family here in the early 1930's after Hitler's ascent in Germany made him realize that the future for Jews in that country would be dismal. Although now a Dutch citizen he lives in Switzerland because, he says, the emotional strain of all the memories in the Netherlands is too much.

"Of course I love to come back to the house, but it's painful," he explained.

Around the corner from the museum there is a three-foot bronze statue of her that bears this simple inscription: "Anne Frank, 1929-1945."

The little statue, set back from the sidewalk on a busy street in downtown Amsterdam, does not usually attract much attention. But today, because it was her 50th birthday, someone stopped and left a dozen red roses.

Although the "Diary of Anne Frank" has passages of deep gloom and something close to despair, some who have studied it regard it basically as a document of hope.

To observe her birthday, some of her ad-

mirers, including Queen Juliana and her father, made a special pilgrimage to the narrow red-brick building in which Anne, her family, and the others had lived.

"It's Anne's day, a time to remember the things that Anne stood for," Otto Frank, her father, said after taking the Queen on a tour of the former hideout, which is now a small museum depicting the rise of the Nazis and their occupation of the Netherlands.

"To illustrate," explained the keen and voluble Mr. Frank, the only member of his family to survive the war, "the Queen turned to me in front of one of the exhibits and she said, 'Because of all of this do you hate?' And I told her that if you read Anne's diary, there is no hate in it. We may be sorry about things, but no hate, no recrimination." According to the Anne Frank Foundation, which runs the museum, its purpose is "to function as an unending appeal never to let it happen again." So there are exhibits on what are seen as manifestations of neo-Nazism in other countries, such as Britain's National Front.

Twenty-five thousand visitors a month climb the steep and creaky stairs of the house to see the attic in which the Frank family lived, behind heavy curtains much of the time, until the Gestapo finally found them in August 1944 and took them away.

Until recently, most of the visitors had been from the United States. But in the last year, the Americans have suddenly been overtaken by West Germans, who now make up 40 percent of the total visitors.

Most of them are young, and many of them, like Heinz Kummel, a high school student from Hamburg, are clearly stunned by the experience. He sat in the bright sunshine on the steps of the Anne Frank house this afternoon shaking his head and freely conceding that he "simply had had no idea."

Mr. Cohen, a member of the Advisory Cabinet of B'nai B'rith's Council Israel Committee, is known for his work among Jewish youth groups and his efforts on behalf of Israel. He is a local lawyer and businessman.

## Olmert Criticizes Israeli Police For Ineptitude

The Israeli police have recently faced criticism for allegedly being unable to fight organized crime in the country. Two motions for the agenda demanding re-examination of the police functioning have been filed in the Knesset by Ehud Olmert (Likud), and Mordechai Wirshubski (Shai).

Dr. Yosef Burg, the Interior Minister, responsible for the police, has come under sharp criticism.

The alleged police shortcomings particularly came to light especially with the publication of a document produced by Ehud Olmert who said he had obtained it from the FBI in Washington. Olmert read the document in the Knesset despite a prohibition of its publication by Judge Shulamot Walenstein, who is hearing a libel case against the newspaper *Haaretz*.

The document read by Olmert alleged that a group of Israelis were alleged to have been involved in smuggling drugs in Latin America. He told the Knesset that the FBI document charged that the Israeli group was systematically engaged in smuggling drugs via U.S. diplomatic mail between Israel, Germany and the U.S.

According to Olmert, the group sent girls on cocaine-smuggling missions from Ecuador to Miami. Olmert, continuing his criticism of the police, further alleged that they had received the document but had failed to carry out an investigation to determine the accuracy of the information.

He also said that the failure by the police to investigate organized crime, the existence in Israel of which had been proved by the

conclusions of the Shimron report, had caused the resignation of Commissioner Yaacov Nahmias, one of the heads of the special unit for fighting organized crime.

Olmert alleged that the changes in the organization of the police in the fight against organized crime, recommended by the Shimron report, were only "cosmetic," and were typical of the inaction of the police in the Shimron recommendation.

The Interior and Police Minister, Dr. Burg, NRP, called Olmert's charges "character assassination." He moved that his motion be struck from the agenda because it referred to persons who could not defend themselves in the Knesset and who were now involved in court trials, some even

in a trial involving Olmert himself, who was being sued for libel.

Dr. Burg reiterated that the FBI document was classified and could not be the subject of a debate in the Knesset. Dr. Burg said he was not prepared to say in the Knesset in Committee what the police had done about investigating information contained in the document.

Olmert's disclosures in the Knesset may speed up plans for amending the Knesset Immunity Law by reducing some of the privileges which Members have voted their selves over the years. His disclosure of the FBI document angered many Opposition Members, and some of his own Likud colleagues.

## Israeli Travel Agents Can Now Book Tourists To Egypt

JERUSALEM (JTA): The Foreign Ministry gave the green light to Israeli travel agents today to begin organizing group charter and individual tourist flights to Egypt and to cooperate with their Egyptian counterparts in arranging tourism between the two countries. The Ministry had been considering a proposal by Egyptian Foreign Minister Boutros Ghali to limit the tourist business for the time being to one or two major travel organizations. But the Israel Association of Travel Agents objected strenuously and that idea was dropped.

The first Israeli tourist to Egypt, 19-year-

old Ofra Gamel, returned to Tel Aviv today aboard the yacht Gabriella, after a three-day visit. Although she did not have an Egyptian visa and possessed only an Israeli passport, the Egyptian police and port authorities at Port Said went out of their way to be helpful, she said. Ms. Ofra's Egyptian visa, obtained when she landed at Port Said, was the first ever stamped into an Israeli passport. Other Israeli tourists who arrived with her held foreign passports. Heretofore, Israeli diplomats and journalists visiting Egypt had their visas stamped on separate pieces of paper.

# Egypt Seeks French Arms

PARIS (JTA) — Egyptian Vice President Hosni Mubarak said here that France will continue to supply Egypt with arms and planes and will play an active role in organizing Egyptian defense systems.

Mubarak, who met recently with French President Valery Giscard d'Estaing, is in Paris to continue arms talks with the French and to visit the International Air Show at Le Bourget. France is already supplying Egypt with Alpha jet training and ground support planes, helicopters and electronic equipment. The Egyptians are also planning to start first assembling and then building the new Mirage-2000.

Israeli officials at the air show told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that as far as they can judge from a superficial examination the Mirage-2000 is a powerful and fast combat plane, but far less effective than its American counterparts.

The Israeli delegation to the show includes the Defense Ministry Director General Yosef Maayan and the Commander of the Air Force, Brig. General David Ivry. Both men watched at length the Mirage-4000 prototype as it overflew Le Bourget while performing intricate air figures and steep climbs.

# Reject Claim That Province Is Anti-Zionist

MONTREAL (JTA): Quebec political spokesmen have criticized an editorial in an Amman newspaper which proposed that "the Arab community of nations" should support the Quebec government of Premier Rene Levesque "in its demands for political sovereignty because Quebec has a strong anti-Zionist following." Levesque seeks to achieve independence from Canada for the French-speaking province.

Excerpts from the editorial in the Jordanian newspaper were published in Quebec newspapers and broadcast on Quebec radio stations. The critical comments were made to the Jewish Telegraphic Agency by Harry Blank, a member of the National Assembly, the provincial parliament in Quebec, and by Claude Morin, vice premier of the Quebec provincial government.

### Quebec Faces Dilemma

Blank told the JTA that he interpreted the comments in Al Destour as implying that the Arab countries should resist plans by Canada's new Prime Minister, Joe Clark, to implement a campaign pledge to move the Canadian Embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem. Under sharp criticism from Arab diplomats, Clark's government has publicly watered down the pledge, though it has not withdrawn it. Blank added that "the Quebecers are not anti-Jewish but they do face a dilemma. On the one hand, they look upon Israel as a small country which won its independence and is doing well, and on the other hand, the Quebec government has to deal with small but noisy trade union groups led mostly by leftists who consider Zionism a form of racism and that they are therefore free to assail it."

He recalled that Levesque commented on the issue when Ici Quebec, a French-language publication, condemned Israel and Zionism. The Premier remarked on that occasion that while his government "did not support the line of thought" expressed in Ici Quebec, "Zionism is a political philosophy and people feel free to criticize it." Blank also said that the Arabs have the impression of "popular support in Quebec but that support is minimal." He added that the Quebec government could not come out too strongly against leftists supporting the anti-Zionist view because the trade unions were an important part of the Levesque electoral base.

Morin said he considered the Al Destour editorial a warning to the Clark government, but "not addressed" to the Quebec government. He dismissed the Amman newspaper stand as an editorialist viewpoint "and nothing more." He added that the residents of Quebec are neither anti-Jewish nor anti-Israel.

# One in Five American Law Schools Violate Supreme Court Ban On Illegal Procedures

NEW YORK: Nearly one in five American law schools is in apparent violation of a U.S. Supreme Court ban on admissions procedures based on quotas or blanket racial preference, according to the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith (ADL).

The League says a recent national survey of application forms, catalogs and brochures of professional schools of law, medicine and dentistry disclosed that 23 law schools from a sampling of 128 were found to maintain admissions procedures that were either "clear violations" or "visibly suspect" of violating last year's *Bakke* decision.

In the *Bakke* case, the Supreme Court ruled that it is illegal for a university to exclude a white applicant from a special entrance program by setting fixed quotas for minorities — an argument supported in a friend-of-the-court brief ADL filed with the Court.

"It is ironic," commented Maxwell E. Greenberg, ADL's national chairman, "that the law schools as a group are the worst offenders of a ruling set down by the nation's highest court." He noted that of the 16 "clear" violators, 14 were schools of law and two were medical schools. Of 20 schools found to maintain admissions procedures that are "visibly suspect with respect to the ethnic/racial classifications made illegal by *Bakke*," nine were law schools, another nine medical schools, and two were dental schools.

Mr. Greenberg based his remarks on the study during the 66th annual meeting of ADL's national commission held recently at

the Plaza Hotel. Commenting on the lack of identification of individual schools in the document, he stated the League plans to meet and resolve differences with the individual school administrators. "We feel a keen sense of responsibility in addressing the problem directly to the appropriate admissions officers," he said.

The 14-page document, entitled "A Study of post-Bakke Admissions Policies in Medical, Dental & Law Schools throughout the United States," reported a response rate of over 80%, providing, in Mr. Greenberg's words, "a thoroughly comprehensive data base for action." It was prepared by Ira Gissen, director, and Dr. Martin Schiff, assistant director, of ADL's national discriminations department.

In ordering the University of California Medical School at Davis to admit *Bakke*, said Mr. Greenberg, "the Court put on notice all universities and professional schools with similar set-aside minority quotas or preferences. Such admissions were to be discontinued, and not to be merely adjusted with cosmetic changes."

Nonetheless, he said, the schools found to be in "clear" violation of *Bakke* continue to use the kinds of fixed quotas, two-track systems or separate admissions criteria for minorities ruled out by the Supreme Court; those admissions procedures deemed "suspect" were based on statements indicating blanket preferential treatment for minorities, prohibited in the decision.

The study showed that in all, 29 schools justified their policies to some extent "in terms of past 'societal' discrimination

against minorities even though such a justification was specifically rejected by the Court." Another seven, it said, "attempt to justify their special preference for minorities in terms of their own objective to achieve a diversified student body." The study pointed out that while the Court acknowledged a school's right to have diversity, Justice Powell, speaking for the majority, said it was unconstitutional to rate minority status above other desirable traits, experiences and backgrounds.

Mr. Greenberg stressed that in the months ahead, ADL will seek answers to those questions raised by the materials submitted in response to the survey. "In this way, we will both communicate our concern and alert these schools to the need of scrupulously conforming their admissions policies to the requisites of the Supreme Court's *Bakke* ruling."

## "No" To Peace Ad

NEW YORK: Forbes magazine, which solicited ads for its fifth annual Arabic edition, has refused to carry a "peace ad" that the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith sought to place in the publication, the ADL said today.

"We are disappointed that the ad, in English, Arabic and Hebrew, which salutes the peoples of Egypt and Israel for their courageous, creative commitment to wage peace, is rejected because Forbes magazine considers peace to be 'political,'" Abraham H. Foxman, ADL's associate national director, declared.

He added, "We even offered to remove the Hebrew wording from the ad if that would make it acceptable."

Mr. Foxman said he personally wrote Malcolm Forbes, owner of the magazine, on May 31 and also tried to reach Forbes by phone, but the publisher has neither responded to the phone calls nor the letter. Forbes is reported to have left Tuesday for an extended stay in France.

The text of the ad, in its entirety, is as follows:

"Only nations at peace, ready to live side by side with a willingness to understand each other's needs and problems, can reap the benefits of increased trade and industrial development.

"We salute the peoples of Egypt and Israel for their courageous, creative commitment to wage peace.

"And we are proud of the role played by the United States in helping make this dream a reality."

# Jews In Russia — A Yen To Learn Their Heritage

HAIFA: For any ethnic group to survive, its members must be knowledgeable about the group's history and ethnic culture, and they must pass this vital information on to future generations.

But unless things radically change in the Soviet Union, it seems that the Jews there will be unable to fulfill such an obligation. In its sixty years the Soviet government has managed to eradicate practically all vestiges of Jewish literature, and a generation has arisen which is totally uninformed about matters that Jews of other countries know almost by second nature.

It is true that some Jews have managed, by the use of short wave radios, to stay fairly well informed about current events in Israel, the matters of the day; however, everything before that is a blank.

The desire to break out of this crisis of non-information is evidenced by the response of a recent Jewish immigrant and activist when asked by a reporter what the Jews of Russia wanted or needed most of all. His reply: "Books. Books and pamphlets of any kind on any Jewish subject." The Jews of Russia are uninformed, and they wish to break out of it.

Not long ago an association of Jewish religious scientists and professionals from Russia now in Israel, known as Shamir, invited their colleagues in the Soviet Union to gather questions on subjects about which Jews in that country wanted more information.

In only a few days the stream of questions totalled 176 — and kept coming. Some of the inquiries reveal naivete; but there are others which even in their innocence reveal a hunger to know, and penetrate straight to the heart of many issues that bother Jews elsewhere as well.

From the list of 176, recently received from the Soviet Union, a representative sprinkling of the queries was selected. The Russian Jews want to know. Are we equipped to answer all these questions?

—Is it possible to be a Jew and a Christian at the same time?

—Can a Jew who was baptized return to his religion?

—May Jews take the advice of fortune tellers?

—Why do mercenary and evil people always live better than kind and sympathetic ones?

—Do Jews have "Confession"?

—Is it possible for a Jew to be an occult spiritual healer?

—Why is it necessary to believe in God? People don't believe in the laws of electricity; they prove them.

—Is a Jew permitted to pray to God with an open latrine in his cell?

—Why are animals sacrificed to God? Is it supposed to be pleasant to God?

—Is it true that there are certain problems in Judaism that it is customary not to discuss?

—Are contraceptives permitted for religious Jews?

—The Torah describes what happened after Mt. Sinai. But the Torah was given on Mt. Sinai. How can this be?

—Is it true that Jesus was a Jew?

—Do Jews have their saints?

—Why do only old people believe in God? Maybe the belief in God is the consequence of feebleness or the fear of death.

—How is the status of a rabbi or tsadik consistent with their sometimes negative features of falsity, cunning, hypocrisy and others?

—Can a Jew be a good man, and not religious?

—What do I have to do if I want to believe in God and cannot?

Just a few of the 176 questions for which Russian Jews want answers. Do you have the replies?

## Likud Leaders Angered By Knesset Absentees

JERUSALEM (JTA): An unexpected opposition victory in the Knesset recently because a majority of the coalition MKs were absent has prompted the Likud Knesset faction leadership to ask Premier Menachem Begin for an urgent meeting to discuss the enforcement of party discipline.

Likud's embarrassment was occasioned by an agenda motion presented by Labor Alignment MK Adiel Amorai to debate a costly advertising campaign against the Finance Ministry aimed at igniting inflation. Poor attendance by Likud and the absence of all but one of the 12 National Religious Party MKs, gave the opposition a majority and the motion was carried. One coalition member of the Democratic Move-

ment voted with the opposition.

The ad campaign, for which a large Tel Aviv advertising agency was engaged, raised many eyebrows even within Likud. It culminated with full page "Fight Inflation" ads in most of the country's leading newspapers, calling on the public to cut down on private consumption. Originally, it was expected that the IL 30 million cost of the campaign would be shared by the business community. However, the project

## Holocaust Pondered By Christians And Jews

NEW YORK (JTA): Dr. Franz Von Hammerstein, General Secretary of the International Council of Christians and Jews (ICCJ), indicted the German Protestant middle-class for its role in the Holocaust at an ICCJ sponsored week-long colloquium in New York. The subject of discussions was "Religious Responsibility and Human Rights."

Dr. Hammerstein, who is director of the Evangelische Akademie in Berlin, noted that German Protestantism emphasized "individual piety and obedience to the state." In this way, it completely and easily identified with Nazism and the "superiority" of the "Aryan race," he said. His remedy echoed the theme of the colloquium: early resistance to oppression; political and social responsibility within the Christian faith; and a deep concern for human rights. Hammerstein added his concern that the dialogue between Jews and Christians continue, and that it should include communications with other religions to overcome prejudices.

Catholic 'Indifference' Cited

The Catholic position was presented by Prof. Pierre Pierrard of the Institute Catholique in Paris. He spoke of "ignorance or indifference of the mass of Catholics towards the Jewish problem on the brink of war." He noted, at the same time the problem of maintaining the viability of the church as "the

most inflexible opponent of the (Nazi) regime" and the church's own persecution at the hands of the Nazis. But Pierrard attributed the Catholic reaction and the "silence" of Pope Pius XII towards the Holocaust as originating in the accumulated false notion of the church towards Judaism.

Claire Huchet-Bishop of the Amite Judeo-Chretienne, France, presided over the colloquium. She emphasized the need for reliving and studying the events of the Holocaust. "Jews are the model for whatever happens to other minorities," she said. Prof. Shaul Friedlander of Tel Aviv University, outlined the cultural and political reasons why the Nazis came to power. He took the position that the "Final Solution" was implied as soon as the Nazis came to power — a fact debated by modern historians. "The battle with Jews was the ultimate battle since Hitler gained power," Friedlander emphasized. The Jews, as the most prominent members in post-World War I revolutionary groups, became a symbol of Germany's defeat.

Friedlander, like Hammerstein, wondered how the masses of German people went along with the Nazis. He concluded that "ordinary people in extraordinary circumstances cannot see clearly."

## Israel Criticizes Its Own Troops

JERUSALEM: An official Israeli report recently, for the first time, criticized the conduct of troops during a military operation.

The annual report of the state controller-general said Operation Litani, Israel's March, 1978, incursion into southern Lebanon, had been impaired by breaches of discipline, violations of orders, and petty larceny at the expense of Lebanese civilians.

The Israel Press has called the report the first such indictment of a military operation published in a democratic country during wartime.

The report said poor discipline and disregard of orders were responsible for a large part of the losses suffered during the operation. It said that of 27 tanks damaged, 21 crews have avoided any harm if driven in compliance with orders that called for them to await proper cover before advancing. Six tanks were blown up by mines, even though there had been specific instructions for their paths to be swept clean, the report said.



## Interior Minister Burg Irritated

# Participation of Dayan, Weizman To Be Discussed By Cabinet

By David Landau

JERUSALEM (JTA): The minimal participation by Foreign Minister Moshe Dayan and Defense Minister Ezer Weizman in the work of the six-man ministerial team engaged in autonomy negotiations with Egypt and the U.S. has irritated the delegation's chairman, Interior Minister Yosef Burg, and will be taken up by the full

Cabinet at its next session.

The Cabinet's intervention was promised Burg by Premier Menachem Begin after Weizman walked out of a meeting of the unit yesterday that was chaired by Begin. Weizman has publicly expressed the view that the Israeli negotiating team is much too large. He said two-to-three ministers could conduct the negotiations for Israel and that he

saw no need for his own presence at the sessions. "There is nothing wrong if the Defense Minister will not be a member of the team," he told Maariv in an interview published today. But he promised that his ministry would assist the negotiators whenever necessary.

Weizman asked to be excused from yesterday's meeting. Begin told him "Only the Cabinet which appointed you to this committee can release you of the duty." Weizman said he did not want to attend that specific meeting to which Begin replied, "Sure you can go, we won't keep you here by force, will we?" Weizman left, but has not resigned from the negotiating team.

Dayan has also publicly expressed his desire to stay out of the autonomy talks on grounds that his presence is not necessary. Maariv suggested that the Foreign Minister would like to replace Burg, a member of the National Religious Party, as chairman. Dayan has denied this but according to Maariv, associates of Dayan believe that he should head the unit not only because he is Foreign Minister but because he is the only member capable of conducting the negotiations with the necessary flexibility to avoid a crisis.

The first working session, held recently in Alexandria, produced no substantive progress. The talks will be resumed in Herzliya later this month, possibly on June 25.

## Waldheim Wants To Include Others

DETROIT (JTA): Kurt Waldheim, the United Nations Secretary General, declared at a press conference here that he is working to include the other parties to the Middle East conference in the present peace negotiations between Israel and Egypt, with United States participation.

Waldheim said the Israeli-Egyptian peace treaty had changed the framework of Middle East peace talks. He also told reporters

## Appeal To Carter For Shcharansky

LONDON (JTA): President Carter has been asked by 57 leading Israeli public figures to appeal to President Leonid Brezhnev of the Soviet Union on behalf of imprisoned dissident Anatoly Shcharansky. They expressed concern that he may not survive conditions at the Chistopol prison camp, where he is being held, and that his health has seriously deteriorated.

The letter from the Israelis said that Shcharansky is suffering from constant severe headaches, is rapidly losing weight and shows signs of "internal cerebral inflammation." It asked the President to speed up attempts to obtain Shcharansky's release, "otherwise we fear it may already be too late. Signatories, many of them former Soviet refusniks, include Silva Zalmanson, Leonid Slepak and 16 academicians. The text was released here by the Women's Campaign for Soviet Jewry.

## RESTAURANT RUCKUS

SALERNO, Italy—About 200 West German tourists, some shouting "Long Live Hitler," went on a rampage in a restaurant at nearby Paestum, saying they had been cheated on the amount of wine they were served.

The tourists made off with more than 60 bottles of wine, the police said.

The restaurant owner, Donata Paolillo, was quoted as having said that the damage amounted to more than 2 million lire (\$2,400).

No arrests were made.
