Name Archie Smith Campaign Director

Drive to Extend Through October

Congregation Ahavath Sholom will conduct a building fund campaign during the next seven weeks for \$150,000 to erect a new Synagogue and Hebrew Daily School on its recently purchased land located on Rochambeau avenue, Camp street and Colonial road, it was announced this week by Irwin Priest, president of the Congregation.

"We have long realized," Mr. Priest said, "that our present structure on Howell street has become inadequate to meet the requirements of our members and of the many people who have wished to affiliate themselves with a modern, orthodox Synagogue.

Population Has Shifted

"During the past decade the neighborhood surrounding the Synagogue has deteriorated. In the resultant population shift, the Synagogue was no longer within walking distance for the majority of our members. This same reason applied to their children who were forced to forego a sound foundation in Jewish education because their parents were fearful for their safety for many incidents have occurred recently where students on their way to school have been molested.

Have Responsibility

"We are aware," Mr. Priest continued, "that as the only orthodox Synagogue on the East Side where nearly two thousand Jewish families reside, we have a definite responsibility not only to our members but to the additional hundreds whose hearts are with orthodox Judaism. We hope, through our new Synagogue and Hebrew School, to advance the cause of Judaism."

Named Campaign Director

"We are pleased to announce," Mr. Priest concluded, "that Archie Smith, a former president of the Congregation, and for many years active in the affairs of our community, has been appointed director for the campaign."

Max Charren, treasurer of the building fund committee, believes that the committee, with the co-operation of the designer of the new structure, Ira Rakatansky, has planned a Synagogue and Hebrew School that will be a tribute not only to Ahavath Sholom members but to Jews throughout the city.

Program of Memorials

"The new Synagogue," Mr. Charren said, "has been designed so that our services may be conducted with the dignity associated with orthodox Judaism. The seating capacity is larger than our present structure which will permit us to accept many applications for membership from families who have heard of our building plans and (Continued on page 8)

Chaplain to Advise On Jewish Affairs

FRANKFURT-Am-Main — Major Judah Neiditch, chief Jewish chaplain in the European theatre, has been named special adviser on Jewish problems to General Eisenhower, it was announced here by the headquarters of the United States Armed Forces in the European theatre.

At the same time, Lt. Col. Charles Schottland, chief of the processing section of the Combined Displaced Persons Executive of the USFET, announced that displaced Jews in Germany, exclusive of Soviet citizens, who do not wish to return to their home countries will be housed in special assembly centers until "they decide their futures."

Arabs Receive 12 Million in Lend-Lease

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Saudi Arabia, where U. S. oil interests have tremendous holdings, is receiving lend lease aid from this country totaling nearly \$12,000,000, according to a report by the Senate War Investigating Committee.

The General Jewish Committee of Providence

On May 28, 1945, at a meeting to which every contributor to the United Jewish Appeal was invited and which was attended by a large cross section of our Jewish Community, there was a practically unanimous vote approving the establishment of a permanent central organization—the General Jewish Committee of Providence, Inc.

This was the culmination of many months of planning and work, and marked the birth of a new organization which has excellent potentialities for the betterment of the lot of our people and the advancement of our Jewish community.

The purposes of this organization as stated in the by-laws are as follows:

".....To conduct an annual campaign and to collect, receive and distribute funds for the support, maintenance, and development of such Jewish charitable, cultural, and religious organizations and causes as are willing to participate as beneficiary agencies; to assist in communal activities; and to promote general Jewish welfare."

It is the successor agency to the Providence United Jewish Appeal—an organization that has previously served our community. In a rapidly changing world no institution should remain static, and in the formation of the General Jewish Committee, the community (Continued on page 6)

Editorials

Rosh Hashonah

This Rosh Hashonah calls forth mixed feelings in the heart of every Jew. The new era of peace naturally brings with it sentiments of hope that out of the baptism of fire there will emerge a new world and a better humanity, a world that will know of no bloodshed, hatred and envy, and a humanity that will recognize the fundamentals of religion-love for fellow men. It also induces thoughts of sadness and sorrow, of losses which we Jews have suffered, during the tragic years of war. The trials and tribulations which the memories of the past bring forth blend with the optimism and hopefulness which the New Year and era of peace present.

As we enter the New Year let us enter it with a sense of duty to our faith, upholding its great ideals of justice, of mercy and of peace. Let us enter it with a sense of our obligations to help our people still in distress. For numbers of our people liberated from concentration camps, are still homeless, wandering aimlessly, hungry and in rags, over the countryside. The only hope that animates these martyred Jews and enables them to survive the misery is the possibility of their settlement in Palestine. Let us dedicate the Rosh Hashonah to our suffering people whose hope for a new year and a new life is bound up with colonization in Eretz Yisrael.

It is with these thoughts that we, the Rabbis of Rhode Island, greet the Jewish community of our state, and to them we add the traditional benediction "L'shonah Tovo Tikoseivoo."

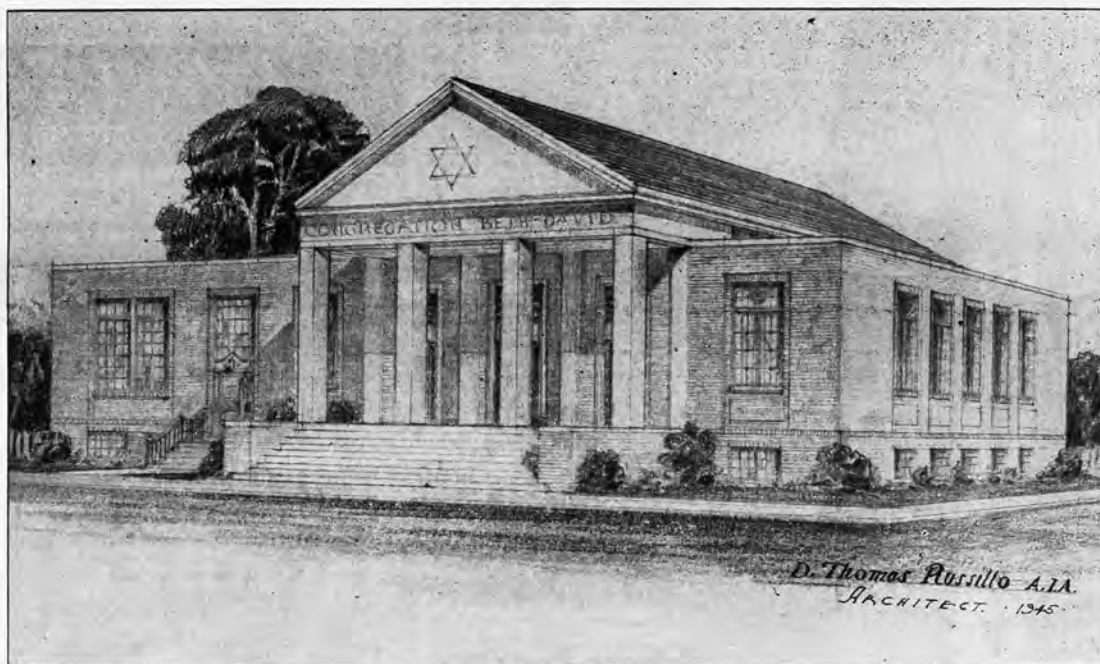

Since there are many families in the area unable to furnish religious education for their children we are planning a goodly proportion of free scholarships. We intend to build one of the finest Hebrew schools in the State.

Otherwise, Mr. Krug warned the country may experience "A serious problem as the aftermath of the war".

is attempting to develop a democratic instrument prepared to intelligently and effectively meet the weighty problems of our Jewish people in the postwar period.

The test of an alert community organization is its ability to change to meet the needs of the times; the test of real leadership is their ability to be reasonably flexible and responsive to the diversity of community opinion. A Jewish community is made up of individuals and groups with various interests, religious affiliations, ideologies, and opinions, and each person is entitled to his or her own point of view. This is as it should be in a democracy.

In the General Jewish Committee we have a democratically organized body representing a cross section of community leadership that can meet regularly throughout the year to give careful thought to matters of general concern to the entire Jewish community. The membership in the General Jewish Committee Corporation is broad, consisting of every contributor to the annual campaign who is over eighteen years of age. The officers and board of directors are duly elected by the total body and represent a true cross section of our Jewish community.

The common ground upon which the community can unite immediately is in the raising of funds in an Annual Campaign for national and overseas Jewish causes. Preparation for this is an all-year round job, both from the point of view of interpretation and organization, so that everybody will be more familiar with the needs of the agencies for which they are contributing funds, and to be sure that everybody in the city is reached and gives his maximum possible contribution. The needs of our people in the postwar period are greater than ever because now help can get to them—lives have to be rebuilt, Jewish communities reconstructed, families reunited, and people given an opportunity to start anew in our Jewish homeland. To sustain the Jewish survivors of Hitlerism and to build a new life of hope for them in the world, American Jews this year must make an extraordinary effort in behalf of the nation-wide campaign of the United Jewish Appeal for refugees' overseas needs and Palestine. The United Jewish Appeal is the major beneficiary in our own General Jewish Committee campaign, and this organization supports the Joint Distribution Committee's program for overseas relief and rehabilitation, the United Palestine's Appeal program for mass settlement and upbuilding of the Jewish National Home Palestine, and the program of the National Refugee Service for the adjustment of newcomers in the United States.

Our annual campaign in Providence has become more and more inclusive so that now by making one gift, a person is contributing to 46 vital Jewish national and overseas causes at one time. I am

Accomplishments, Omissions
The Status of Jewish Education
By ALTER BOYMAN

The approach of the New Year 5706 demands of us a spiritual reckoning of last year's achievements, particularly of our errors and omissions in our community.

We may look back with gratification of last year's accomplishments in regard to fund-raising with such successful campaigns as the United Jewish Appeal which raised \$220,000 (more than \$100,000 over the previous year); the Miriam Hospital New Building Fund Campaign which entered the year \$150,000 short of its goal and during the next three months, the full amount of \$750,000 was over-subscribed; Temple Beth-El raised about \$50,000 for the payment of land for the new Temple and Hebrew School; Temple Emanuel obtained \$100,000 for a new Hebrew School; smaller campaigns like the Nachlath Roger Williams, the HIAS, the Histadruth were also successful in their fund-raising.

Also during the past year there occurred the reorganization of the United Jewish Appeal to a permanent organization under the name of the General Jewish Committee of Providence Inc., (which we hope will live up to its promises).

But one problem, and a chief one, which has been severely neglected, is Jewish education for children. Now, let us see, what are the facts?

How many children have passed over the threshold of a Jewish and Religious School in our community. (We have about 3500 children of school age.)

Temple Emanuel Sunday School—519 children of which 120 have also attended the Hebrew Day School.

Temple Beth-El Sunday School—239 children, of which 33 have also attended the Hebrew Day School.

Temple Beth-Israel Sunday School—175 children, of which 45 have also attended the Hebrew Day School.

Jewish Community Center Sunday School—175 children.

Sons of Abraham Sunday School—140 children, of which 65 attended the Hebrew Day School.

Congregation Sons of Jacob Day School—70 children.

Sons of Zion Hebrew Day School—55 children.

South Providence Hebrew School—54 children.

Ahavath Shalom Hebrew School—40 children.

The Parochial School—40 children.

The above figures are "tops", at the peak of registration, for at closing, the attendance was much, much lower. From the figures we learn that the largest number of children have attended only a Sunday School and I sincerely believe that no one may call a Sunday School attendance a real Jewish education.

And so we find among our Temples a creation of a so-called Sunday School Judaism; but conditions among the Orthodox is much, much worse. We may also truthfully say that the job is so tremendous that it is unbelievable that one group, or another, could

solve the problem as it deserves to be solved. It must be and should be a community undertaking.

It is the duty of our Jewish community, just as it is necessary to have campaigns for fund-raising, so it is equally necessary for an educational campaign among Jewish parents to urge them to give their children a real Jewish education and for our leaders to provide the facilities and the means for such a program. Only by community planning can the problem of education for our Jewish children be solved.

pleased to announce that HIAS has just agreed to become a participating agency in our General Jewish Committee Campaign, and will not conduct an independent campaign in Providence this year nor make solicitations in the Synagogues. Since our last campaign Ort and Jewish Labor Committee, two organizations which previously conducted separate campaigns here, have also become beneficiary agencies. It is important for people to keep these facts in mind when making their 1945 contributions to the General Jewish Committee Campaign.

We have appointed an allocations committee consisting of fifteen persons whose duty it is, according to our new by-laws, "...to investigate applications of organizations desiring to receive funds from the annual campaign, to review requests for funds of participating agencies, to determine the respective amounts to be allotted to the participating agencies, and to report its recommendations to the board of directors." Provision has been made to give prospective and participating agencies a full opportunity to be heard in any matters affecting them. Therefore, every contributor has the assurance that each of the causes included in the campaign is studied very carefully to determine the validity of the needs of these organizations.

In terms of manpower it is important that we avail ourselves of the best leadership in the community for the annual campaign. The General Jewish Committee provides a means of continually developing new leadership, because it gives more people an opportunity to participate actively in community affairs. It provides a medium whereby persons of outstanding ability from all groups, the Orthodox, the Reformed, and the Conservative, from all professions and walks of life can be drawn upon to serve total Jewish needs.

To assure the success of our campaign, more volunteer workers than ever will be needed. Everybody who has the interest and is willing to devote the time and energy can play a vital part in this total community enterprise which will benefit world Jewry. If we have a very large corps of workers, it spreads the responsibility so that the job does not rest on the shoulders of a few who are conscientious and do the work year in and year out. The more campaign workers we have, the better our coverage will be, and each person will have to see a smaller number of contributors. Recruiting of workers is now going on, and all persons interested in assisting in the campaign are urged to immediately contact the campaign office at 203 Strand Building, telephone number—Ga. 7986.

And so it is, because we vitally need all of our strength in the campaign, all of our leadership, the benefit of all the thinking that we can bring to bear upon our problems and the mobilization of every resource at our command, that the General Jewish Committee has come into being. And at the foundation of it all there must be a deep conviction of the richness of Jewish values, the validity and necessity of preserving them, and a desire to build up a strong framework of Jewish life which will enable every Jew to live with a sense of dignity and a sense of destiny. On cornerstones such as these the General Jewish Committee has been founded—its future rests in the hands of every Jewish person in our community.

Joseph Wanton, a descendant of founder and spiritual leaders of the Society of Friends in New England.

Of Grace it was said that she had beauty, poise and a gift of turning words into lyric verses.

"A Courtly Gentleman"

As for Joseph, a contemporary calls him "the most courtly gentleman in the colony". A remarkably handsome young man of pleasing manners and cultivated tastes was he.

These two young people moved in the same social and cultural circles of Newport.

But Joseph joined his family in worship at the Friends Meeting House, while Grace's father was the warden of the Jews Synagogue on Griffith Street.

And so there were pleasant hours at the Redwood library. Perhaps long walks in the spacious garden of the Seixas residence. There might have been drives along the Newport seashore.

That and nothing more.

She was a Seixas and he was a Wanton.

Not that the paths of the Wantons and the Seixases never crossed.

Brought Torah to Newport

It was Captain Stephen Wanton who brought the first Sefer Torah from New York to the Synagogue of Newport in his sloop.

Governor John Wanton was a frequent visitor to the synagogue on holidays and special occasions. And there were commercial relationships and civic interest in common.

Marriage, Another Matter

But marriage is something else. A descendant of the founder of the Society of Friends and the granddaughter of Rabbi Gershow. What a match!

Once upon a time another Wanton came upon a similar obstacle in his wish to marry the woman he loved. He overcame the obstacle, and the manner in which he did it is told to this day.

A Previous Solution

Ruth, the girl he loved, was the daughter of Deacon Bryant of the Congregational Church. The entire family was up in arms against her marrying into the hated sect of Quakers, nor were the Friends family of William Wanton happy about the matter. So William solved the problem by saying:

"Ruth, let us break away from this bondage. I will give up my religion and thou shall give up thine, and we will both go to the Church of England and to the Devil together."

They did, and they begat nine children. The descendants of this family were destined to shape the fortunes of the Colony of Rhode Island. There were pirate fighting Wantons, sea-going Wantons, clergyman, merchants and governors.

No less than five Wantons occupied the Governor's office in the colony.

Conditions Now Different

But that was long ago. The Wanton of our story was not as simple nor Grace as docile as Ruth. Nor was the Church of England a haven of refuge any longer in those days of tea parties and ship burning pre-revolution days. It was in fact the surest way of going to the devil.

So Joseph married, raised a family, achieved success in business and got himself elected governor true to the traditions of a Wanton.

Grace Did Not Marry

Grace on the other hand, remained single and found consolation in writing poetry.

She, no doubt, followed the fortunes of the man she loved, and attended many functions in his honor.

Oh, yes, there was another man, good, faithful, Cousin Phillips, who worshipped the ground she trod upon. But it was hopeless. Grace would not listen to him.

So she remained single, while Cousin Phillips waited patiently.

Time passed. Moses Seixas grew old and venerable. 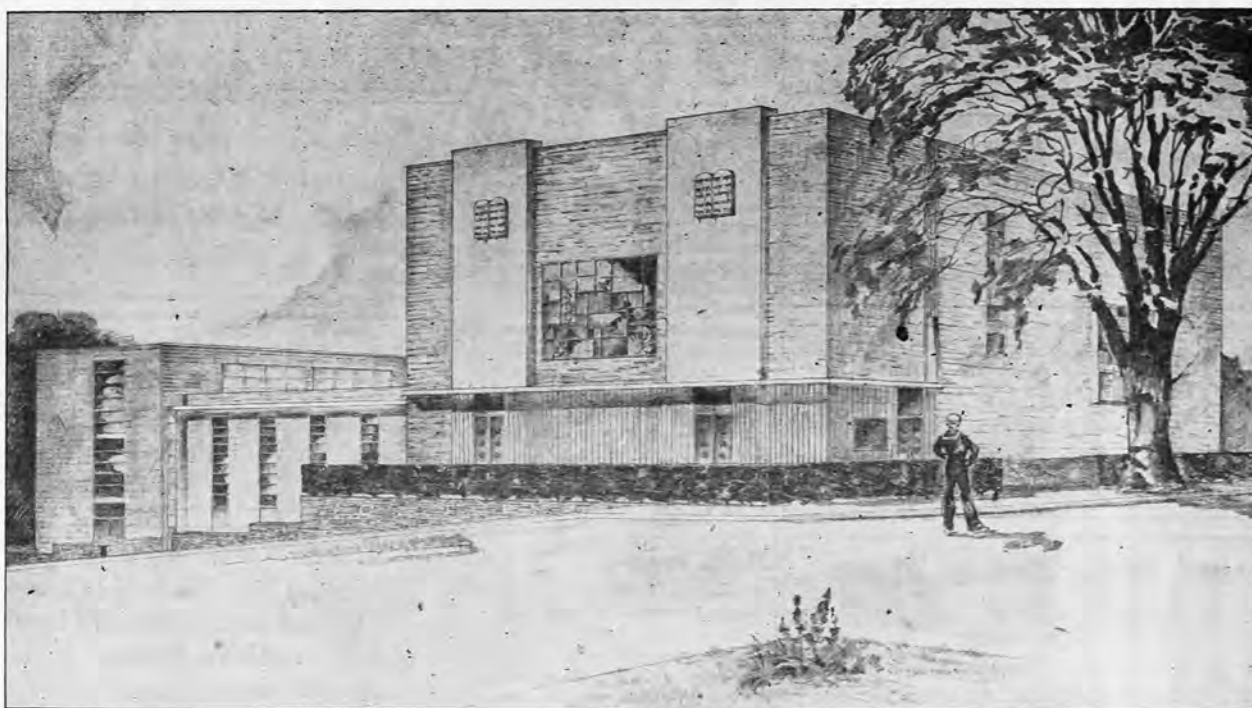

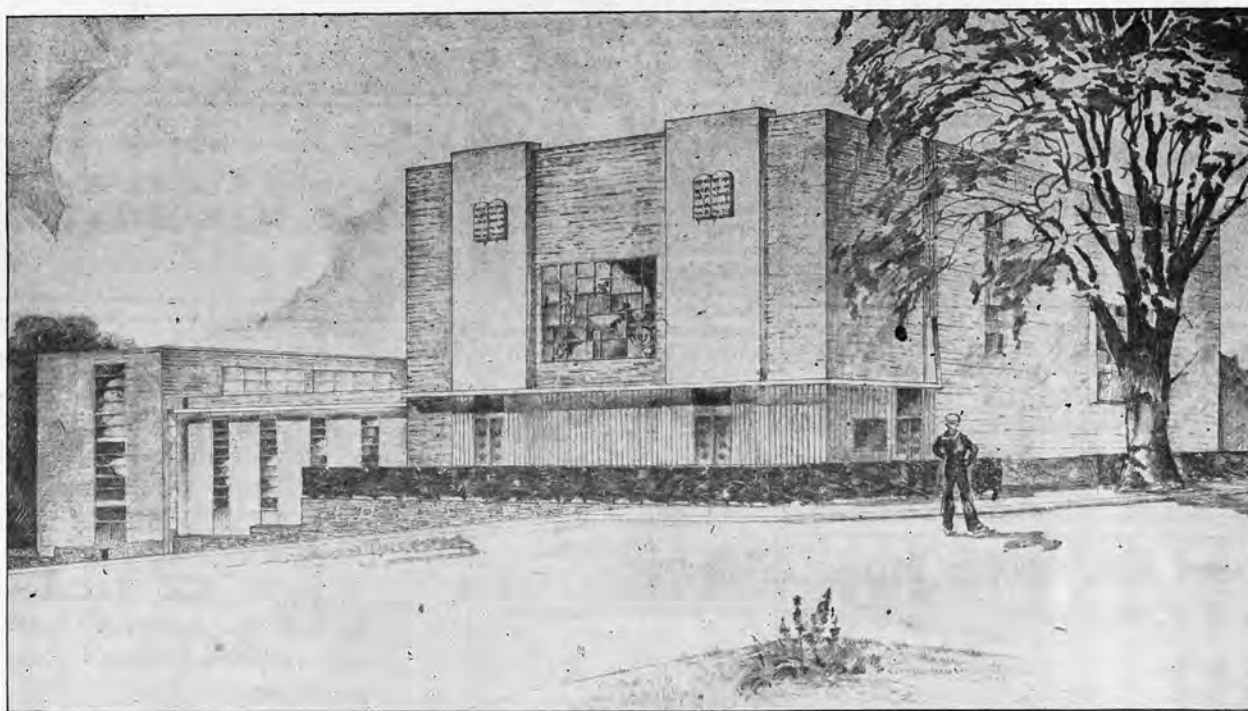

who wish to associate themselves with us. Floor plans of the Synagogue, Auditorium and Hebrew School will be published shortly. There will be a suitable program of memorials which may be dedicated to the memory of parents and children.

An Opportunity

Rabbi Morris G. Silk, spiritual leader of the Congregation, viewed the new project as a long-awaited opportunity to stimulate the Jewish education of children and to demonstrate that orthodox Judaism comes first in the hearts and minds of our people. "We will be the only orthodox Synagogue on the East Side," Rabbi Silk said. "We have a duty and a responsibility to the many families there who have found it impossible in the past to satisfy their religious needs not only from an orthodox point of view but from the fact that the various houses of worship in that section of the city can only accommodate a small percentage of those wishing to attend. Our religious school is going to be the best in the city. We will have competent instructors, a well-rounded program and the physical facilities necessary to a successful all-round education."
